RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

NOVEMBER 1965

This report presents revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-five (twenty-three in 1964) class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Included in 1965 data are the Wabush Lake Railway and Arnaud Railway (in Newfoundland and Quebec, respectively) both of which were not in operation during 1964. Excluded are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this publication.

During the month of November 1965, 18.9 million tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, an increase of 15.2 per cent over the same month of 1964. Of the 1965 total, 16.8 million tons were loaded in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports), up 18.4 per cent over the previous year period. Rail freight received from U.S. rail for delivery in Canada rose 18.2 per cent to 1.0 million, while overhead freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) declined 20.9 per cent to 1.0 million tons.

Rail loadings in Canada registered increases in all of the six major commodity groups. Less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) rose 54.5 per cent to 110,587 tons and products of mines were up 20.5 per cent to 7,584,687 tons. The latter increase was due in part to a 613,511 ton rise in iron ore loadings. Products of agriculture increased 18.1 per cent to 3,233,315 tons, largely because of heavier wheat shipments. Manufactures and miscellaneous goods rose 17.7 per cent to 4,451,266 tons; products of forests were up 9.4 per cent to 1,348,366 tons and animals and products increased 1.3 per cent.

On a geographic basis, increased loadings were reported in eight of the ten provinces. Newfoundland rail movements more than tripled those of the previous year, due mainly to the addition of Wabush Lake Railway statistics in that province. Saskatchewan loadings rose 34.8 per cent; Manitoba traffic was up 29.6 per cent; Quebec 17.8 per cent; Nova Scotia 17.7 per cent; British Columbia 12.5 per cent; Ontario 10.9 per cent and Alberta 8.5 per cent. Revenue freight loadings declined 7.1 per cent in Prince Edward Island and 0.2 per cent in New Brunswick.

During the month under review, revenue freight terminated by rail in Canada totalled 18.9 million tons, an increase of 15.1 per cent over the 1964 month. Of the 1965 total, 16.0 million tons were unloaded in Canada (including deliveries to water lines) and 2.8 million tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 13.5 million tons terminated in Canada and 2.8 million tons delivered to U.S. rail connections one year earlier.

During the first eleven months of 1965, a total of 187.9 million tons of revenue freight was loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections, up 2.8 per cent from the corresponding period of 1964.
