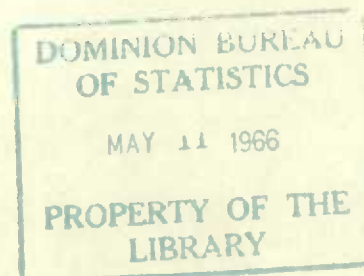

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

DECEMBER 1965

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-five (twenty-three in 1964) class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Included herein, are the statistics of the Wabush Lake Railway and Arnaud Railway (operating in Newfoundland and Quebec respectively) which began operations in January 1965. Excluded are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this publication.

During December 1965, a total of 17,342,337 tons of revenue freight was loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, an increase of 11.3 per cent over December 1964. Of the 1965 figure, 15,212,716 tons were loaded in Canada (including imports at lake and ocean ports), up 13.4 per cent over the previous year period. Freight received from U.S. rail connections for delivery in Canada, at 950,317 tons rose 16.2 per cent, while overhead freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) declined 12.3 per cent to 1,179,304 tons.

Revenue freight loaded in Canada registered increases in all of the six major commodity groups. Products of agriculture increased 19.2 per cent to 2,719,993 tons; manufactures and miscellaneous rose 18.3 per cent to 4,578,121 tons; products of forests rose 13.1 per cent to 1,450,612 tons; less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) increased 12.0 per cent to 78,628 tons; products of mines were up 8.1 per cent to 6,301,657 tons and animals and products increased 6.6 per cent to 85,705 tons.

On a provincial basis, railways reported increased loadings in eight of the ten provinces. Newfoundland rail movements more than tripled those of the previous year, due mainly to the addition of Wabush Lake Railway statistics in that province. Saskatchewan loadings increased 25.6 per cent; British Columbia traffic was up 23.7 per cent; Manitoba 21.0 per cent; Ontario 14.0 per cent; Alberta 9.0 per cent; Quebec 7.0 per cent and New Brunswick 1.2 per cent. Revenue freight loadings in Prince Edward Island declined 22.4 per cent and in Nova Scotia traffic fell 14.8 per cent.

During December 1965, revenue freight terminated by rail in Canada amounted to 17,301,636 tons, up 10.7 per cent from the 1964 month. Of the 1965 total, 14,175,468 tons were unloaded in Canada (including deliveries to water lines) and 3,126,168 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 12,681,495 tons terminated in Canada and 2,940,918 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections in December 1964.

During the year 1965, a total of 205,197,196 tons of revenue freight was loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections, up 3.5 per cent over the year 1964.
