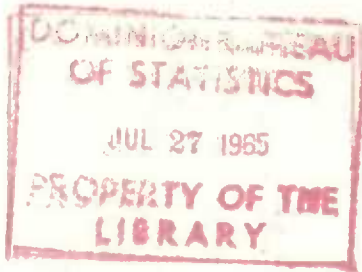

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

FEBRUARY 1965

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Freight traffic reports of the Wabush Lake Railway and the Arnaud Railway (operating in Newfoundland and Quebec respectively) are included in this publication for the first time, bringing to twenty-five the number of railways represented herein. The Wabush Lake and Arnaud Railways commenced revenue operations January 1, 1965 but were not included in January statistics. Tonnages for the month are in the year-to-date figures shown in this publication. Excluded herein are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this report.

During February, 13,354,646 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections, up 0.2 per cent from February 1964. Of this total, 11,374,757 tons were loaded in Canada (a gain of 0.2 per cent); 799,955 tons were received from U.S. rail connections destined to points in Canada, (up 20.0 per cent); and 1,179,934 tons were overhead movements from the U.S. to the U.S. through Canada (a decline of 9.7 per cent).

Freight loadings in February 1965 increased in three of the six major commodity groups. Products of mines rose 6.9 per cent to 4,514,554 tons; animals and products were up 5.4 per cent to 65,199 tons and manufactures and miscellaneous increased 3.9 per cent to 3,685,688 tons. Agriculture movements declined 16.3 per cent to 1,687,246 tons; forest products were off 5.1 per cent to 1,361,322 tons and (l.c.l.) less-than-carload shipments were down 1.9 per cent to 60,748 tons.

On a provincial basis, rail loadings increased in six of the ten provinces. The addition of Wabush Lake Railway traffic in Newfoundland was mainly responsible for an increase of 85.0 per cent in that province; Prince Edward Island loadings rose 44.8 per cent; Nova Scotia 4.4 per cent; Manitoba 3.2 per cent; and Quebec 1.1 per cent. Ontario rail traffic was up by less than one per cent. Loadings in Alberta dropped 6.2 per cent; in Saskatchewan by 6.1 per cent; in British Columbia by 4.2 per cent; and in New Brunswick by less than one per cent.

Revenue freight terminated in February 1965 on rail lines in Canada, totalled 13,364,914 tons, up 2.7 per cent over February 1964. Of the 1965 month total, 10,479,676 tons were unloaded at Canadian points and 2,885,238 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compared with 10,143,805 tons terminated in Canada and 2,871,430 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections in February 1964.

For the first two months of 1965, 26,712,534 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections, down 1.6 per cent from the same period of 1964.
