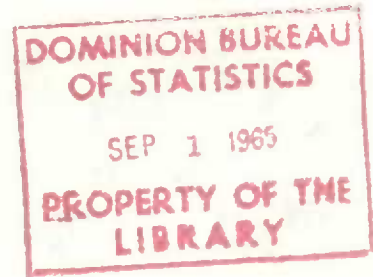

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

MARCH 1965

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-five class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). The March 1965 statistics include operations of the Wabush Lake Railway and Arnaud Railway (operating in Newfoundland and Quebec, respectively) both of which began revenue operations in January 1965. Excluded herein are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in these tables.

During March, a total of 15,365,642 tons of revenue freight was loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections, up 5.4 per cent over the corresponding month of 1964. Of the 1965 total, 12,981,510 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water lines), an increase of 3.4 per cent from March 1964. Freight received from U.S. rail connections destined to points in Canada increased 35.1 per cent to 959,020 tons and overhead freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) at 1,425,112 tons was 8.8 per cent above that of the preceding year.

Freight loaded in March 1965 was greater in four of the six major commodity groups. Animals and products rose 10.8 per cent to 72,237 tons; products of mines were up 10.6 per cent to 5,306,391 tons; manufactures and miscellaneous increased 7.9 per cent to 4,310,014 tons and (l.c.l.) less-than-carload freight rose 15.4 per cent to 76,205 tons. Products of agriculture fell 19.9 per cent to 1,681,339 tons and products of forests showed a slight decrease of 0.1 per cent to 1,535,324 tons.

A geographic analysis shows that freight loadings increased in six of the ten provinces. The addition of Wabush Lake Railway traffic in Newfoundland, was mainly responsible for an increase of 81.6 per cent in that province. Prince Edward Island movements were up 40.5 per cent; New Brunswick 17.3 per cent; Quebec 9.3 per cent; Manitoba 6.3 per cent and Nova Scotia 5.4 per cent. Loadings in Saskatchewan declined 3.1 per cent; Ontario 2.8 per cent and in both Alberta and British Columbia loadings dropped less than one per cent in each case.

During the month under review, revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada totalled 15,494,996 tons, up 7.7 per cent over March 1964. Of the current March total, 12,155,963 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water lines) and 3,339,033 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 11,388,696 tons terminated in Canada and 3,001,103 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections.

During the first quarter of 1965, a total of 42,078,176 tons of revenue freight was loaded in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections, up 0.9 per cent from the similar 1964 period.
