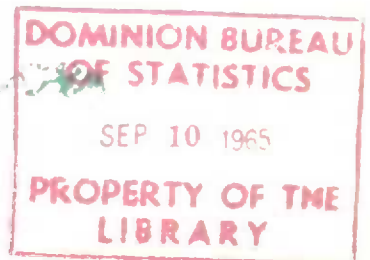

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

APRIL 1965

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-five (twenty-three in 1964) class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). These statistics now include operations of the Wabush Lake Railway and Arnaud Railway (operating in Newfoundland and Quebec, respectively) both of which began revenue operations in January 1965. Excluded herein, are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this publication.

During April 1965, a total of 15,753,229 tons of revenue freight was loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections, up 4.0 per cent over the previous year. Of the April 1965 total, tons loaded in Canada (including receipts from water lines), amounted to 13,361,178, an increase of 1.8 per cent; freight received from U.S. rail connections destined to points in Canada aggregated 1,018,269 tons up 45.7 per cent; and overhead freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) totalled 1,373,782 tons, an increase of 3.9 per cent.

Revenue freight loaded by commodity groups, showed increased tonnages in five of the six major categories. Products of forests were up 19.6 per cent to 1,452,878; animals and products increased 9.8 per cent to 68,858 tons; mine products rose 8.5 per cent to 5,880,411 tons; manufactures and miscellaneous increased 6.2 per cent to 4,242,801 tons and (l.c.l.) less-than-carload freight rose 2.9 per cent to 76,459 tons. Products of agriculture fell 30.7 per cent to 1,639,771 tons.

On an area basis, seven of the ten provinces reported increased rail freight loadings during the month under review. Newfoundland loadings were more than double that of the previous year due mainly to the addition of statistics relating to the Wabush Lake Railway Company in that province. British Columbia movements rose 17.9 per cent; Ontario 8.8 per cent; Nova Scotia 6.7 per cent; Alberta 4.4 per cent; New Brunswick 2.2 per cent and Quebec 1.6 per cent. Loadings in Saskatchewan dropped 39.0 per cent; Prince Edward Island 25.0 per cent and Manitoba 15.4 per cent.

Revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada totalled 15,741,991 tons, up 5.1 per cent from the previous year. Of the April 1965 total, 12,492,058 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water lines) and 3,249,933 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 11,923,067 tons terminated in Canada and 3,047,936 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections in the earlier year.

During the period January 1 to April 30, 1965, a total of 57,831,405 tons of revenue freight was loaded in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections up 1.7 per cent from the same period of 1964.
