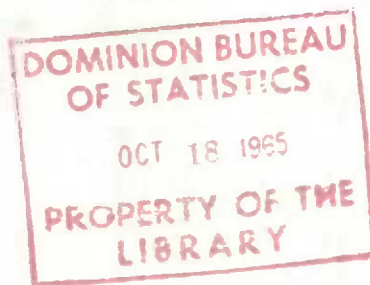

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

MAY 1965

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-five class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). These statistics now include the operations of Wabush Lake Railway and Arnaud Railway (operating in Newfoundland and Quebec, respectively), whose revenue operations began in January 1965. Excluded herein, are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this report.

During May 1965, the number of tons of revenue freight carried on lines in Canada rose slightly to 17,220,825 tons from 17,219,532 tons a year earlier. Revenue freight loaded in Canada declined 0.9 per cent to 15,005,344 tons while freight received from U.S. rail connections destined to points in Canada increased 16.5 per cent to 1,013,373 tons. Overhead freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) decreased 1.1 per cent to 1,202,108 tons.

Freight loadings in May 1965 increased in five of the six major commodity groups. Manufactures and miscellaneous rose 7.2 per cent to 4,211,332 tons; animals and products were up 6.7 per cent to 63,119 tons; products of mines increased 4.9 per cent to 7,556,822 tons; forest products were up 3.7 per cent to 1,134,563 tons and less-than-carload shipments (l.c.l.) rose 36.8 per cent to 92,999 tons. Agricultural products fell 29.9 per cent to 1,946,509 tons, due mainly to a 40.0 per cent drop in wheat shipments.

On a regional basis, rail loadings increased in five of the ten provinces. Newfoundland loadings more than tripled those of the previous year due to the addition of Wabush Lake Railway traffic in the 1965 data. Movements rose in New Brunswick by 7.1 per cent; in Ontario by 6.5 per cent; in British Columbia by 3.3 per cent and in Quebec by 0.4 per cent. Loadings fell in Saskatchewan by 29.3 per cent; in Alberta by 7.1 per cent; in Manitoba by 5.3 per cent; in Nova Scotia by 3.5 per cent and in Prince Edward Island by 2.0 per cent.

Revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada during the month under review totalled 17,233,064 tons, up 1.0 per cent over May 1964. Of the May 1965 total, 14,315,232 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water lines) and 2,917,832 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 14,264,006 tons terminated in Canada and 2,801,908 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections in May 1964.

For the first five months of 1965, 75,052,230 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections, up 1.3 per cent from the corresponding period of 1964.
