## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

JUNE 1965

Presented in this publication are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-five (twenty-three in 1964) class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Included herein, are the operations of the Wabush Lake Railway and Arnaud Railway (operating in Newfoundland and Quebec, respectively) both of which began revenue operations in January 1965. Excluded, are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this publication.

During June 1965, a total of 18,290,638 tons of revenue freight was loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections, down 2.8 per cent from the same month of 1964. Of the June 1965 total, 16,181,620 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water lines), a drop of 3.4 per cent; and overhead freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) amounted to 1,127,229 tons, a decrease of 5.4 per cent. Freight received from U.S. rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 981,789 tons, an increase of 10.9 per cent.

Revenue freight loaded, by commodity groups, showed decreased tonnages in two of the six major categories. Products of agriculture at 2,093,373 tons were 30.9 per cent lower than the 1964 period which reflected large export movements of wheat to the U.S.S.R. and other markets. Animal products declined 7.7 per cent to 60,495 tons. Forest products increased 5.8 per cent to 1,385,018 tons during the month under review; manufactures and miscellaneous rose 3.2 per cent to 4,071,093 tons; products of mines were up 2.0 per cent to 8,488,934 tons and (l.c.l.) less-than-car-load freight rose 11.0 per cent to 82,707 tons.

On a provincial basis, decreased loadings were reported in five of the ten provinces. Saskatchewan loadings fell 26.8 per cent; Alberta 16.3 per cent; Quebec 8.9 per cent; Prince Edward Island 5.4 and New Brunswick 4.8 per cent. Loadings in Newfoundland more than tripled those of the previous year, due mainly to the addition of Wabush Lake Railway statistics. Movements in British Columbia rose 8.4 per cent; in Nova Scotia 7.5 per cent; in Manitoba 5.6 per cent and in Ontario 4.9 per cent.

Revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada totalled 18,219,542 tons in June 1965, down 2.1 per cent from the earlier year. Of the June 1965 total, 15,717,088 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water lines) and 2,502,454 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 15,857,417 tons terminated in Canada and 2,751,427 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections in June 1964.

During the first half of 1965, a total of 93,342,868 tons of revenue freight was loaded in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections, up 0.5 per cent from the similar 1964 period.
