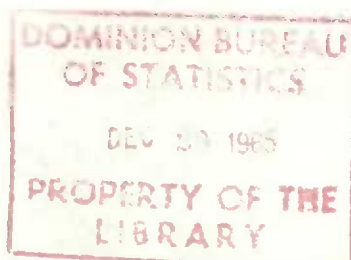

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

JULY 1965

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-five (twenty-three in 1964) class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). The Wabush Lake Railway and Arnaud Railway in Newfoundland and Quebec, respectively, began revenue operations in January 1965 and are included herein. Excluded throughout are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this publication.

During July, 19.1 million tons of revenue freight, including domestic loadings and receipts from United States rail connections, were moved by rail in Canada. This represented a 1.9 per cent increase over July 1964, most of which was accounted for by the Wabush Lake and Arnaud Railways who contributed all of the 1.5 per cent gain in Canadian loadings. Freight received from U.S. rail connections destined to Canada rose 15.5 per cent to 955,888 tons in July 1965, while overhead traffic (U.S.A. to U.S.A. through Canada) fell 2.2 per cent to 1,119,395 tons.

Rail loadings in Canada registered increases in four of the six major commodity groups. Products of mines and manufactured goods each rose 8.9 per cent to 9,128,193 and 4,084,227 tons, respectively, and forest products increased 3.5 per cent to 1,542,266 tons. Less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) at 124,536 tons was more than double that of the previous July. Products of agriculture, declined 30.7 per cent to 2,078,385 tons and reflected the exceptionally large movements of wheat in the earlier year. Animals and products dropped 11.7 per cent to 60,770 tons.

On a geographic basis, the railways reported increased loadings in seven of the ten provinces. In Newfoundland the volume of rail freight was almost tripled that of July 1964, due mainly to Wabush Lake Railway operations. Movements in Prince Edward Island rose 9.2 per cent; Quebec traffic was up 9.0 per cent; Ontario increase 5.7 per cent; Manitoba 5.3 per cent; British Columbia 4.4 per cent and Nova Scotia 1.9 per cent. Saskatchewan loadings fell 27.2 per cent; Alberta 18.6 per cent and New Brunswick 6.9 per cent.

Revenue freight terminating on railway lines in Canada during July 1965, totalled 19,151,722 tons, up 3.0 per cent from the previous year. Of the July 1965 total, 16,090,995 tons were unloaded in Canada (including deliveries to water lines) and 3,060,727 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 15,959,494 tons terminated in Canada and 2,634,836 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections in July 1964.

From January 1 to July 31, 1965, a total of 112,436,528 tons of freight was carried by rail, up 0.7 per cent from the like seven month period of 1964.
