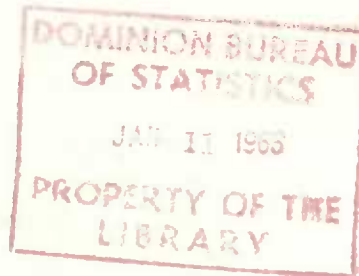

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

AUGUST 1965

This report presents revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-five (twenty-three in 1964) class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Included in 1965 data are the Wabush Lake Railway and Arnaud Railway (in Newfoundland and Quebec, respectively) both of which began revenue operations in January. Excluded are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements in Canada. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this publication.

During August, 18.9 million tons of revenue freight originated on railway lines in Canada, up 7.7 per cent over the similar 1964 month. Of the 1965 figure 16.9 million tons, or 89.0 per cent, was loaded in Canada (including receipts from water lines), a gain of 6.9 per cent over the previous year period. Rail freight received from U.S. rail connections for delivery in Canada, at 1.0 million tons was up almost 50.0 per cent. This increase was attributable in part to heavier border crossings of anthracite coal, coke, sand and phosphate rock. Overhead traffic (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) declined 5.0 per cent to 1.0 million tons.

Revenue freight loaded, by commodity groups, showed increased tonnages in four of the six major categories. Manufactures and miscellaneous movements rose 15.4 per cent to 4.1 million tons; forest products gained 11.1 per cent to 1.6 million tons; mines and products were up 10.3 per cent to 8.7 million tons and (l.c.l.) less-than-carload freight increased 60.8 per cent to 120,105 tons. Products of agriculture decreased 16.2 per cent to 2.3 million tons and animals and products declined 6.3 per cent to 60,995 tons.

On a geographic basis, increased loadings were registered in seven of the ten provinces. Loadings in Newfoundland more than tripled those of the previous August, due mainly to the addition of Wabush Lake Railway statistics. Nova Scotia rail freight movements rose 24.0 per cent; British Columbia traffic was up 22.6 per cent; Ontario 7.2 per cent; Alberta 5.8 per cent; Prince Edward Island 3.5 per cent and Quebec 1.6 per cent. Revenue freight loadings in New Brunswick dropped 11.9 per cent and in both Manitoba and Saskatchewan loadings were down 5.0 per cent.

During the month under review, revenue freight terminating on railway lines in Canada totalled 18.9 million tons, an increase of 8.6 per cent over the 1964 month. Of the August 1965 total, 16.1 million tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including water imports) and 2.8 million tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 14.8 million tons terminated in Canada and 2.6 million tons delivered to U.S. rail connections a year earlier.

During the first eight months of 1965, 131.3 million tons of revenue freight were loaded on railways in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections, up 1.6 per cent from the corresponding period of 1964.
