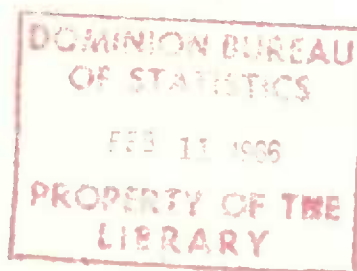

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

SEPTEMBER 1965

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). The Wabush Lake Railway and Arnaud Railway in Newfoundland and Quebec, respectively, began revenue operations in January 1965 and are included herein. Excluded throughout are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this publication.

During September, 18.2 million tons of revenue freight, including domestic loadings and receipts from United States rail connections, were moved by rail in Canada, a decline of 2.5 per cent from September 1964. Of the 1965 figure 16.3 million tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water lines), down 2.8 per cent over the previous year period. Rail freight received from U.S. rail connections for delivery in Canada, amounted to 0.9 million tons up 22.5 per cent, while overhead freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) declined 14.9 per cent to 1.0 million tons.

Rail loadings in Canada were down from the previous year month in four of the six major commodity groups. Products of mines fell 8.0 per cent to 8,007,388 tons largely because of a drop of 696,818 tons in iron ore loadings. Animals and products were down 6.3 per cent to 66,652 tons; products of forests declined 4.1 per cent to 1,413,081 tons and products of agriculture dropped 3.6 per cent to 2,520,983 tons with the largest single decline occurring in wheat loadings. Less-than-carload freight (L.C.L.) rose 53.4 per cent to 124,918 tons and manufactures and miscellaneous increased 9.1 per cent to 4,136,411 tons.

On a geographic basis, railways reported decreased loadings in five of the ten provinces. Quebec rail movements dropped 17.7 per cent; Saskatchewan was down 3.5 per cent; Alberta 3.2 per cent; New Brunswick 2.9 per cent and British Columbia 0.5 per cent. Loadings in Newfoundland more than tripled those of the previous year, due mainly to the addition of Wabush Lake Railway statistics. Prince Edward Island movements rose 22.6 per cent; Manitoba 21.5 per cent; Nova Scotia 9.3 per cent and Ontario 3.2 per cent.

During the month under review, revenue freight terminated by rail in Canada totalled 18.3 million tons, a drop of 1.5 per cent over the 1964 month. Of the September 1965 total, 15.6 million tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including freight for export by water) and 2.7 million tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 15.8 million tons terminated in Canada and 2.8 million tons delivered to U.S. rail connections one year earlier.

During the first nine months of 1965, a total of 149.6 million tons of revenue freight were loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections, up 1.1 per cent from the corresponding period of 1964.
