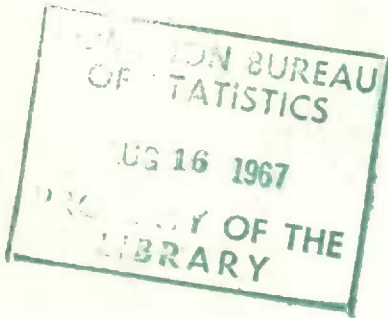

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

FIRST QUARTER 1967

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-five class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000 whose traffic represents about one per cent of all rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this publication.

Commencing with this report traffic originated on terminated on the Great Slave Lake Railway as reported by Canadian National, formerly included in Alberta, and all traffic of the White Pass and Yukon Railway, previously shown in British Columbia, are now presented under the separate geographic heading, "Yukon and Northwest Territories". Both 1967 and 1966 Canada totals appearing herein reflect this change.

During the first quarter of 1967, tons of revenue freight loaded by rail in Canada and received from United States rail connections rose 0.6 per cent to 47,404,650 tons over the same three months of 1966. Of the current total 41,210,774 tons were loaded in Canada (including waterborne imports) up 1.2 per cent; receipts from U.S. connections destined to Canada rose 3.3 per cent to 2,828,289 tons. Overhead freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) fell 7.6 per cent to 3,365,587 tons.

Revenue freight loaded during the first quarter registered increases in three of the six major commodity groups. Products of forests rose 10.9 per cent to 5,202,094 tons; products of mines were up 0.8 per cent to 16,136,435 tons and manufactures and miscellaneous increased 0.2 per cent. Animals and products declined 4.7 per cent to 201,029 tons and products of agriculture dropped 1.7 per cent to 6,160,449 tons. Less-than-carload freight fell 26.9 per cent to 180,555 tons.

Geographically, loaded tonnages increased 29.4 per cent in Newfoundland; 16.7 per cent in Yukon and Northwest Territories; 14.9 per cent in New Brunswick; 10.4 per cent in Alberta; 9.1 per cent in British Columbia; 6.8 per cent in Prince Edward Island and 5.8 per cent in Saskatchewan. Loadings in Nova Scotia declined 18.1 per cent; Manitoba 12.4 per cent; Ontario 6.0 per cent and Quebec 1.8 per cent.

Revenue freight terminated in Canada during the first quarter rose 0.3 per cent to 47,457,155 tons. Of this total 37,958,066 tons were unloaded in Canada (including deliveries to water lines) and 9,499,089 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 38,068,418 tons terminated in Canada and 9,230,095 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections in 1966.
