## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

### SECOND QUARTER 1967

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics for twenty-five class 1 and 2 common carrier railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other companies having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this publication.

During the second quarter of 1967, a total of 54,562,194 tons of revenue freight was loaded by railways in Canada and received from United States rail connections. This was down 4.6 per cent from the same period of 1966. Of the current year total, 48,235,747 tons were loaded in Canada (including imports at lake and ocean ports), a decline of 4.2 per cent, while receipts from U.S. rail connections destined to Canadian points rose 2.3 per cent to 3,144,467 tons. Overhead freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) decreased 15.7 per cent to 3,181,980 tons.

Revenue freight loaded during the three month period under review declined in five of the six major commodity groups. Products of agriculture dropped 12.4 per cent to 7,140,443 tons; products of mines decreased 4.8 per cent to 22,004,628 tons; animals and products, were down 1.3 per cent to 186,929 tons; manufactures and miscellaneous declined 0.4 per cent to 14,037,742 tons and l.c.l. freight fell 20.0 per cent to 201,444 tons. Products of forests were up 2.2 per cent to 4,664,561 tons.

On a geographic bases, loaded tonnages decreased 21.0 per cent in Manitoba; 11.7 per cent in Nova Scotia; 9.6 per cent in Saskatchewan; 5.0 per cent in Quebec; 4.1 per cent in Ontario; 2.0 per cent in New Brunswick and 1.6 per cent in Newfoundland. In the Yukon and Northwest Territories loadings increased 38.9 per cent; in Prince Edward Island they rose 30.5 per cent; in Alberta they were up 6.8 per cent and in British Columbia tonnages loaded were 2.3 per cent higher.

Revenue freight terminated in Canada during the quarter under review declined 5.0 per cent to 54,450,935 tons. Of this total 45,422,970 tons were unloaded domestically (including deliveries to water lines) and 9,027,965 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 47,220,573 tons terminated in Canada and 10,086,253 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections during the same quarter of 1966.

In the first half of 1967, 101,966,844 tons of revenue freight were loaded by rail in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections, down 2.3 per cent from the comparable 1966 period.
