RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

THIRD QUARTER 1967

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics for twenty-five class 1 and 2 common carrier railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other companies having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this publication.

In comparing these data with those of the previous year consideration should be given certain factors affecting third quarter 1966 figures. Included in that period was a strike by machinists and iron workers in Northeastern Quebec in July; walkouts in early August by express-freight handlers in Toronto and Montreal; a nation-wide rail strike between August 26 and September 2; and a strike against the Pacific Great Eastern Railway in British Columbia during part of September.

During the third quarter of 1967, tons of revenue freight loaded by rail in Canada and received from United States rail connections rose 1.1 per cent to 54,973,984 tons over the same three months of 1966. Of the 1967 total, 49,553,371 tons were loaded in Canada (including waterborne imports), up 2.3 per cent while receipts from U.S. connections destined to points in Canada fell 5.8 per cent to 2,523,286 tons. Overhead freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) declined 11.2 per cent to 2,897,327 tons.

Revenue freight loaded during the third quarter registered increases in four of the six major commodity groups. Animals and products rose 26.0 per cent to 208,522 tons; products of forests were up 13.3 per cent to 5,216,283 tons; products of mines increased 5.5 per cent to 24,306,877 tons and manufactures and miscellaneous rose 5.1 per cent to 13,010,481 tons. Products of agriculture mainly because of a sharp decline in wheat, dropped 17.7 per cent to 6,644,689 tons and merchandise l.c.l. declined 18.8 per cent to 166,519 tons.

Geographically, loadings increased 30.9 per cent in Newfoundland; 16.7 per cent in British Columbia; 16.5 per cent in Prince Edward Island; 9.8 per cent in the Yukon and Northwest Territories; 3.1 per cent in Ontario and 219 per cent in Quebec. A decline of 17.8 per cent was reported in Manitoba loadings; 10.5 per cent in Nova Scotia; 7.8 per cent in Saskatchewan; 6.9 per cent in New Brunswick and 1.5 per cent in Alberta.

Revenue freight terminated in Canada during the quarter under review declined 0.9 per cent to 54,856,663 tons. Of this total, 46,315,850 tons were unloaded in Canada (including deliveries to water lines) and 8,540,813 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 45,871,260 tons terminated in Canada and 8,507,104 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections during the same quarter of 1966.

During the first nine months of 1967, a total of 156,940,828 tons of revenue freight was loaded in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections, down 1.1 per cent over the similar 1966 period.
