

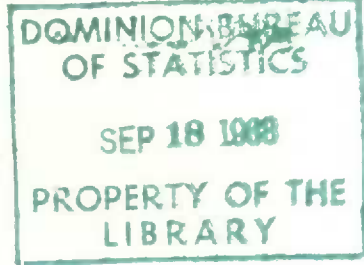

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

FIRST QUARTER 1968

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics for twenty-five class 1 and 2 common carrier railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other companies having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this publication.

During the first quarter of 1968, a total of 46,968,943 tons of revenue freight was loaded by railways in Canada and received from United States rail connections, down 0.9 per cent from the same three months of 1967. Of the current total 41,268,994 tons were loaded in Canada (including waterborne imports) an increase of 0.1 per cent, while receipts from U.S. rail connections destined to Canadian points fell 7.7 per cent to 2,610,692 tons. Overhead freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) decreased 8.2 per cent to 3,089,257 tons.

Revenue freight loaded during the first quarter declined in three of the six major commodity groups. Products of agriculture were down 24.8 per cent to 4,629,773 tons due mainly to a 1.4 million ton drop in wheat loadings and products of forests decreased 5.1 per cent to 4,935,875 tons. A further significant decline was notable in less-than-carload traffic during the period under review (58.9 per cent) similar to the 61.5 per cent drop recorded in the last quarter of 1967 following changes in the price structure for non-carload traffic which became effective September 5, 1967.

Geographically, loaded tonnages decreased 6.8 per cent in New Brunswick; 6.6 per cent in Saskatchewan; 6.4 per cent in Alberta; 4.3 per cent in Prince Edward Island; 4.0 per cent in the Yukon and Northwest Territories; 3.7 per cent in Nova Scotia; 3.0 per cent in British Columbia and 2.3 per cent in Manitoba. Loadings in Newfoundland rose 9.0 per cent; 4.8 per cent in Ontario and 0.5 per cent in Quebec.

Revenue freight terminated in Canada during the first quarter declined 0.7 per cent to 47,108,349 tons. Of this total 37,351,926 tons were unloaded in Canada (including deliveries to water lines) and 9,756,423 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 37,958,066 tons terminated in Canada and 9,499,089 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections during the first quarter of 1967.
