

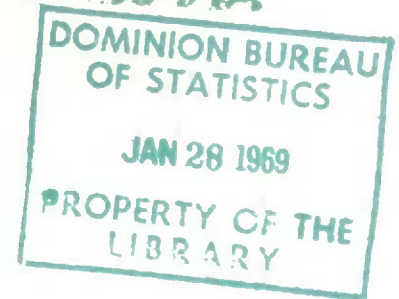

## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

SECOND QUARTER 1968

Presented in this report are revenue freight statistics for twenty-five class 1 and 2 common carrier railways operating in Canada (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other companies having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded from this report are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this publication.

During the second quarter of 1968, a total of 56,970,115 tons of revenue freight was loaded by railways in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 4.4 per cent from the same 1967 period. Of the current quarterly total, 50,728,085 tons were loaded in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports), an increase of 5.2 per cent and overhead freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) gained 6.0 per cent to 3,374,096 tons. Freight received from U.S. rail connections destined to points in Canada fell by 8.8 per cent to 2,867,934 tons.

Increases in revenue freight were recorded in two of the six major commodity groups. Products of mines rose 13.1 per cent to 24,883,597 tons and manufactured and miscellaneous goods were up 10.5 per cent to 15,504,951 tons. Decreases occurred in the remaining categories as follows: products of agriculture declined 23.2 per cent; animal products 20 per cent; forest products 1.5 per cent and less-than-carload (L.C.L.) freight 62.3 per cent.

On a geographic basis, increases were reported in seven of the eleven provinces during the period under review. Newfoundland showed a 26.2 per cent gain; Ontario 14.0 per cent; New Brunswick 8.6 per cent; Manitoba 7.1 per cent; Quebec 3.8 per cent; Nova Scotia 2.3 per cent and Yukon and Northwest Territories 1.6 per cent. Provincial decreases and their respective percentages were as follows: Prince Edward Island 14.2; Saskatchewan 11.1; Alberta 4.9 and British Columbia 3.9 per cent.

Revenue freight terminated in Canada during the second quarter of 1968 increased 3.7 per cent to 56,474,775 tons. Of this total, 46,306,242 tons were domestic unloadings (including deliveries to water lines) while 10,168,533 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 45,422,970 tons terminated in Canada and 9,027,965 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections during the second quarter a year ago.

During the first half of 1968 revenue freight loaded in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections rose 1.9 per cent to 103,939,058 tons.
