## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

THIRD QUARTER 1969

This report contains details of revenue freight traffic carried by twenty-five class 1 and 2 common carrier railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other companies having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded are the freight statistics of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents less than one per cent of all rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not included in order to avoid duplications.

Revenue freight loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections, fell 11.1 per cent to 50,174,675 tons during the quarter under review. This decline may be substantially attributed to mining strikes in Northeastern Quebec and in Northern Ontario as tonnage of mine products dropped more than did total tonnage handled. Freight loaded in Canada (including imports at lake and ocean ports) totalled 44,450,229 tons, down 12.7 per cent from the same quarter of 1968 and overhead freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) dropped 6.0 per cent to 2,881,726 tons. Freight received from U.S. rail connections destined to points in Canada increased 15.8 per cent to 2,842,720 tons.

Revenue freight rail loadings decreased in four of the six major commodity groups. Products of mines fell 26.9 per cent to 20,003,450 tons; animals and products declined 13.0 per cent to 161,700 tons; L.C.L. (less-than-carload) freight dropped 59.3 per cent to 33,443 tons and manufactures and miscellaneous decreased slightly by 0.4 per cent to 13,616,195 tons. Increased loadings were reported for agricultural products and forest products with gains of 19.9 and 2.7 per cent to (5,330,293 and 5,305,148 tons), respectively.

On a geographic basis, decreased loadings were reported in six of the eleven areas with Newfoundland again showing the adverse affects of striking iron ore workers (as in the second quarter of 1969) with a traffic loss of 60.9 per cent. The Yukon and Northwest Territories registered a decline of 19.8 per cent; Quebec, 16.1 per cent; Ontario, 15.7 per cent; Nova Scotia, 6.2 per cent and Prince Edward Island 1.2 per cent. Increased loadings were reported for Manitoba (23.1 per cent); Saskatchewan (13.1 per cent); New Brunswick (8.4 per cent); Alberta (8.3 per cent); and British Columbia where rail loadings were up 0.3 per cent.

Revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada and delivered to U.S. rail connections during the three months under review, totalled 50,013,029 tons, down 11.3 per cent. Of this third quarter total, 41,057,807 tons were unloaded in Canada (including deliveries to water lines) while 8,955,222 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 47,293,823 tons unloaded in Canada, and 9,083,317 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections during the same period of 1968.

From January 1 to September 30, 1969, there were 151,412,515 tons of revenue freight loaded by railways in Canada and received by U.S. rail connections, a decrease of 5.6 per cent from the similar cumulative period of 1968. This decline may be traced to the drop in mine products handled, reflecting the two strikes mentioned above.
