RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

FOURTH QUARTER 1969

Presented herein, are details of revenue freight traffic carried by twenty-five class 1 and 2 common carrier railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R. and C.P.R. and other companies having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded from this report, are the freight statistics of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents less than one per cent of all rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this publication.

Revenue freight loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections gained 0.7 per cent to 55,451,314 tons. Freight loaded in Canada (including imports at lake and ocean ports) totalled 49,678,395 tons, up 0.3 per cent from the like period of 1968. Freight received from U.S. rail connections destined to points in Canada rose 8.0 per cent to 2,859,377 tons and overhead freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) increased 2.2 per cent to 2,913,542 tons.

On a commodity basis, increases in traffic loaded occurred in three of the six major commodity groups. Products of forests gained 2.5 per cent to 5,464,628 tons; manufactures and miscellaneous rose 2.3 per cent to 14,705,096 tons and products of mines were up 1.7 per cent to 23,566,377 tons. Decreases occurred in the following commodity groups: products of agriculture fell 10.5 per cent to 5,683,262 tons; animals and products declined 6.5 per cent to 227,820 tons and L.C.L. (less than car-load) freight dropped 59.1 per cent to 31,212 tons.

On a provincial basis, increased tonnages were reported in seven of the eleven provincial categories with Quebec showing a gain of 28.7 per cent; Yukon and Northwest Territories 19.0 per cent; New Brunswick 10.3 per cent; British Columbia 2.4 per cent; Prince Edward Island 1.7 per cent; Newfoundland 0.8 per cent and Alberta 0.1 per cent. Decreased loadings were recorded by the following provinces; Manitoba 18.4 per cent; Ontario 15.5 per cent; Nova Scotia 10.8 per cent and Saskatchewan 6.0 per cent.

Revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada and delivered to U.S. rail connections increased 0.6 per cent to 54,987,692 tons. Of this total, 44,848,295 tons were unloaded in Canada (including deliveries to water lines) and 10,139,397 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 54,662,300 tons unloaded in Canada and 9,162,113 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections in the 1968 period.

Total revenue freight loaded in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections for the year 1969 was 206,863,829 tons, down 4.0 per cent from 1968.

CHANGES UPCOMING IN 1970

Effective with the first quarter of 1970, this publication will show data for 320 commodity group based on the D.B.S. Standard Commodity Classification, in place of the present 267 commodity series. This Standard Commodity Classification (or S.C.C. is structured so as to be compatible with the United Nations Standard International Grade Classification and is presently the basis for commodity groupings used for statistical series on water transport, imports and exports. It is also planned to use the S.C.C. as the basis for trucking traffic statistics which it is hoped to produce from a new sample survey presently being tested. Thus the adoption of an S.C.C. based commodity series for railway traffic statistics should permit a much better comparison with these other statistical series.

The new 320-code series will include separate codes for several commodities which have attained economic importance in recent years and which were not previously shown separately. These include Potash, Nickel Ore and Container Traffic among others.

As an additional feature the new series will show cars as well as tons for traffic loaded on railways in Canada.

The new report will be published in bilingual form.
