

OPERATING REVENUES, EXPENSES & STATISTICS

STEAM RAILWAYS OF CANADA

WITH ANNUAL OPERATING REVENUES OF \$500,000

For the Month of November, 1923

The railways carried more freight during November than in any other month in their history, making 9.3 per cent more revenue ten miles than during November, 1922 and although a shorter month, 2 per cent more than during October, 1923. The traffic, however, did not yield the revenue of the October traffic and earned only \$457,063, or 1.4 per cent more than in November, 1922. Passenger earnings however, ware increased by \$658,190, or 10.4 per cent and the total revenues showed an increase of \$1,666,478, or 3.6 per cent. Operating expenses were reduced \$1,620,109, or 4.3 per cent increasing the net operating revenues by \$3,286,587 and reducing the operating ratio 6.1 points to 74.17 per cent. There was very little change in the number of employees but the pay roll showed an increase of 2.9 per cent, or \$579,892. The average receipts per passenger per mile declined from 2.875 cents to 2.865 cents and the greater quantity of low class freight carried, reduced the average receipts per ton mile from .859 cent to .797 cent.

For the eleven months, January - November, the revenues were increased \$26,600,457, operating expenses were increased \$14,493,386 and net operating revenues were increased \$12,107,071 reducing the operating ratio from 88.85 per cent for 1922 to 86.72 per cent.

CANADIAN NATIONAL RAILWAYS showed an increase in the freight traffic over November 1922 of 10 per cent, and over October, 1923 of one per cent, creating a new high record of 1,998,970,308 revenue ton miles. This record movement did not earn by \$151,570 the revenue earned last year. With the rates practically on a parity, this means that a greater proportion of the traffic in 1923 was low class freight than in 1922.

Total revenues were increased \$516,051, or 2.5 per cent by increased of \$329,859 in passenger receipts and \$415,750 in express revenues. Operating expenses however, were reduced \$2,300,548 by cutting maintenance of way and structures expenses \$1,156,506, or 32 per cent and maintenance of equipment \$1,099,170, or 21 per cent. Transportation expenses were also reduced \$257,290 or 2.7 per cent despite the increase in both freight and passenger traffic. The total pay roll increased only \$6,710 and the number of employees was reduced 2,337, or 2.5 per cent. Freight train loading was increased 82.2 revenue tons and 1.9 cars with the car loading increased from 26.9 tons to 28.6 tons. The average receipts per ton fell to .784 cent as compared with .871 cent for November 1922 and .869 for October 1923.

For the entire system including the lines in the United States, revenues for the month showed an increase of \$659,586, and with a cut in operating expenses of \$1,942,629, the net operating revenues were increased \$2,632,209.

For the period January - November, the Canadian lines showed an increase in the net operating revenues of \$7,934,342 and the United States lines an increase of \$2,890,145, making a total betterment in operating revenues of \$10,830,485.

CANADIAN FACIFIC RAILWAYS during November exceeded the record movement of freight for October despite the one day shorter month and created a new record for the system of 2,304,906,275 revenue ton miles being an increase over November, 1922 of 9.5 per cent. Passenger traffic also showed an increase over the previous year of 10.8 per cent and passenger revenues increased (297,656, or 10.9 per cent. Freight revenues were increased by \$456,421, or 2.7 per cent and total revenues by \$924,385, or 4.3 per cent.

operating expenses showed an increase of \$350,056, or 2.6 per cent, the prominent features being an increase in maintenance of way and structures of \$711,587, or 27.5 per cent and a reduction in transportation expenses of \$304,327, or 3.7 per cent, the latter being effected despite the substantial increases in traffic.

The maintenance expenses for way and structures

January - November were \$2,395,400, or 9 per cent greater than for
the corresponding period in 1922 and for equipment were \$1,783,193
or 6 per cent greater.

By holding the expenses down with increased revenues, the operating ratio was reduced to 67.21 per cent, or 1.13 points below November, 1922 and net operating revenues were increased \$544,318.

The average car load was increased from 32.2 tons for October and 32.3 tons for November, 1922 to 33.9 tons, and net tons per train showed a corresponding increase. The heavy movement of grain was undoubtedly the cause of this and also the main factor in reducing the average receipts per ton per mile to .745 cent as against .794 cent for November, 1922 and .812 cent for October, 1923.

For the eleven months, revenues showed an increase of \$6,131,391, or 3.5 per cent, but operating expenses were increased \$6,607,317, or 4.8 per cent reducing the operating revenues by \$475,925.
