





OPERATING REVENUES, EXPENSES & STATISTICS
STEAM RAILWAYS OF CANADA
WITH ANNUAL OPERATING REVENUES OF \$500,000.

FOR THE MONTH OF MARCH, 1925

Revenues showed a seasonal increase over those of January and February but were \$4,266,153 or 11.4 per cent below those of March, 1924 with freight traffic lighter by 9.8 per cent and passenger traffic lighter by 13 per cent.

Expenses were cut \$3,359,953, or 10.5 per cent making the decrease in the net revenues \$906,199. The total pay roll was less by \$933,233, or 4.9 per cent and 7,809 fewer employees were on the rolls.

The decline in the freight traffic was mainly in grain and coal. In Manitoba an increase of 37,410 tons of agricultural proanets were loaded but in Quebec there was a decrease of 55,040 tons, in Ontario a decrease of 126,660 tons, in Saskatchewan a decrease of 59,080 tons and in Alberta a decrease of 157,620 tons the bulk of which was grain. Mine products (practically all coal) in Nova Scotia fell off 376,960 tons and in Ontario 287,190 tons. In Manitoba and Alberta mine products showed gains over March 1924 of 20,220 tons and 20,449 tons respectively. Forest products also showed decreases of 14,400 tons in Mova Scotia, 47,380 tons in New Brunswick, 80,271 tons in Quebec, 76,930 tons in Ontario, 32,804 tons in Manitoba and 23,275 tons in British Columbia whilst manufactures and miscellaneous freight showed increases more or less in each province.

For the three months, gross revenues showed a decline of \$9,686,000, expenses a decrease of \$9,394,259 and net operating revenues were less by \$291,741.

CANADIAN NATIONAL RAILWAYS. - Freight traffic for March, 1925 was lighter by 6.8 per cent than for March 1924 and freight revenues fell off \$1,714,561, or 13.3 per cent. Passenger traffic was lighter by 14.3 per cent and passenger receipts were less by \$306,145, or 11.8 per cent. Total revenues showed a reduction of \$1,889,060 or 11 per cent.

Maintenance of way and structures showed a slight increase and traffic expenses also were heavier by \$80.217, or 19.2 per cent but other items of expenses were cut reducing the total by \$1.448,957 or 9.2 per cent which increased the operating ratio from 91.86 per cent in March, 1924 to 93.73 per cent and reduced the net operating revenues by \$440,103.

The total pay roll showed a reduction of \$515,469 or 5 per cent for a decrease in the average number of employees of 4,523.

Freight trains carried 25.6 more revenue tons per train mile but the average receipts per ton mile were .935 cent as against 1.004 cents last year which reduced the carnings per train mile by 11 cents.

The entire system including the lines in the United States showed a decrease in the net operating revenues of \$657,343; for March and for the three months, January, February and March a decrease of \$35,192.

CANADIAN PACIFIC RAILWAY, - With a reduction in freight traffic of 12.7 per cent and in passenger traffic of 13.6 per cent, gross revenues declined 12.5 per cent or \$1,780,246. Operating expenses were cut in every department, maintenance of way and structures being cut by \$400,825, or 22.4 per cent, maintenance of equipment by \$507,579 or 14.9 per cent, traffic by \$28,700 or 4.3 per cent, transportation by \$515,077 or 8.8 per cent and the total by \$1,482,163 or 12.2 per cent. The net operating revenues were reduced \$298,082 and the operating ratio was increased slightly, viz. 83.95 per cent to 84.04 per cent.

The reduction in the total pay roll was \$290,333 for a reduction in the average number of employees of 2,554.

For the first three months of the year gross revenues were below those of last year by \$4,405,465, expenses were less by \$4,079,652 and net revenues were less by \$325,813.


