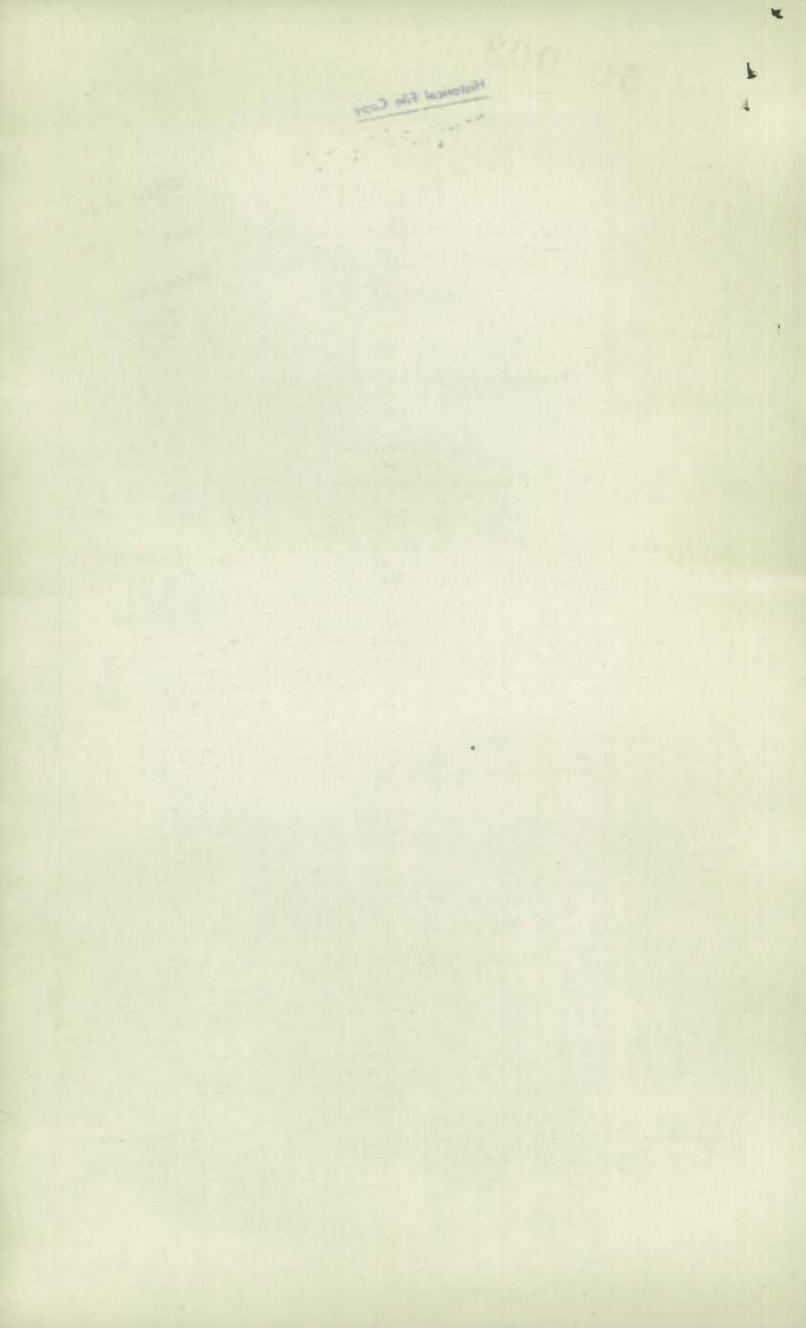

OPERATING REVENUES, EXPENSES & STATISTICS
STEAM RAILWAYS OF CANADA

WITH ANNUAL OPERATING REVENUES OF \$500,000.

FOR THE MONTH OF APRIL, 1925

The railways of Canada as a whole showed a decrease compared with April, 1924, in freight revenues of \$1,639,370, or 6.8 per cent for a reduction of 8.4 per cent in freight traffic, in passenger revenues of \$832,733, or 12.8 per cent for a decline of 13.4 per cent in passenger traffic. Total revenues were lighter by \$2,821,499, or 8.1 per cent and operating expenses were reduced by \$2,456,709, or 7.9 per cent reducing the net revenues by \$364,790 and increasing the operating ratio from 89.95 per cent for April, 1924 to 90.20 per cent. The total pay roll showed a cut of \$558,992, or 3 per cent for a reduction in the staff of 2,636, or 1.7 per cent.

The decline in freight traffic from that of April, 1924 was principally in raw products. Wheat decreased in loadings 105,800 tons, also changed in the movement. The deliveries in British Columbia fell off 185,000 tons and in Ontario increased by 80,000 tons. Loadings of wheat in Alberta decreased by 121,700 tons and in Saskatchewan by 47,000 tons but increased in Manitoba by 19,000 tons. Oats, barley and flax showed increased loadings in Manitoba but flour fell off 13,000 tons. In Saskatchewan flour and all grains but flax were lighter and the total loadings of agricultural products showed a decrease of 70,000 tons. In Alberta flour and all grains were light, the total loading of agricultural products being 140,000 tons under that of April, 1924.

The freight rates on grain from the prairies to Vancouver is on a higher scale than to the head of the lakes so that although the longer haul eastward held the ton miles up somewhat, the revenues showed the effects of the lighter crop, especially in the western portions and the decline in the westward movement, the Canadian Pacific being affected to a greater extent by these factors than the Canadian National.

Coal loading in British Columbia was heavier by 47,000 tons but was lighter in Alberta by 5,000 tons. Forest products in British Columbia fell off 40,000 tons. In Manitoba there was also a drop of 10,000 tons, in Ontario a drop of 32,000 tons, principally in pulpwood and in Quebec a net drop of 52,000 tons, pulpwood being lighter by 56,000 tons and logs by 6,000 tons but ties and lumber showing increases. In New Brunswick the decrease was 32,500 tons and in Nova Scotia, 27,000 tons. Manufactures and miscellaneous freight showed increased loadings in all the provinces but Nova Scotia, the largest increases being 82,000 tons in Ontario and 24,700 tons in Quebec.

For the first four months gross revenues were less in 1925 than in 1924 by \$12,507,499. Expenses were reduced by \$11,850,968 and net operating revenues were decreased by \$656,532.

CANADIAN NATIONAL MAILWAYS, - Freight traffic for April, 1925 was lighter than for April, 1924 by 14.5 per cent and with a reduction of 13.8 per cent in passenger traffic, revenues were decreased by \$1,418,592, or 8.8 per cent.

Maintenance of way and structures showed an increase of \$50,718, traffic expenses an increase of \$72,023 and general expenses an increase of \$6,929, but maintenance of equipment was cut by \$603,738 the saving in this account from the first of the year being \$2,626,400. Transportation expenses were cut by \$700,063 reducing the total expenses by \$1,225,930 or 8 per cent.

The net revenues were less by \$192,762 and the operating ratio was increased from 95.33 per cent to 96.20 per cent. Although the tons of revenue freight per train mile were less by 15.7 tons, the revenue per train mile was greater by 24 tents or 4.8 per cent, the decrease in grain tonnage causing an increase in the average receipts per ton mile. The average length of haul and the average load per car were also reduced, the smaller tonnage of grain and coal being the main factors.

For the entire system there was little change in the net revenues for the month, the decrease being only \$1,161 and for the first four months the decrease was \$36,353.

CANADIAN PACIFIC RAILWAY, - Although freight traffic showed a reduction from that of April, 1924 of only 1.9 per cent, freight revenues were less by \$601,883 or 6.6 per cent and the average receipts per ton mile fell from 1.002 cents to .953 cent, a decline of 5 per cent. Pessenger revenues were less by \$328,731, or 12.2 per cent for a accrease of 13.9 per cent in the passenger traffic. The decrease in total revenues was \$1,079,927 or 3 per cent.

Cuts were effected in each of the general divisions of operation expenses making the reduction in the total \$909,290, or 7.6 per cent. The not revenues were reduced by \$170,637 and the operating ratio was increased from 88.89 per cent to 89.30 per cent. The total pay roll was reduced by \$98,332 although there was a small increase in the average number of employees. The average train loading showed an increase of 12.2 tons of revenue freight but a slight reduction in the total net tonnage and an increase in the number of cars hauled.

Por the four months, January - April, the gross revenues show a decrease of \$5,485,392 and the net revenues, a decrease of \$496,449.

The decrease in the miles of road operated for the Canadian Pacific Railway and for the total of all railways is due to the elimination of a duplication of the mileage of the Kettle Valley Railway included with that of the Canadian Pacific Railway. This duplication has existed since 1918 when the Canadian Pacific Railway acquired the entire bond issue of the Kettle Valley in addition to the stock previously acquired. The Kettle Valley Railway, however, has continued to render separate reports.

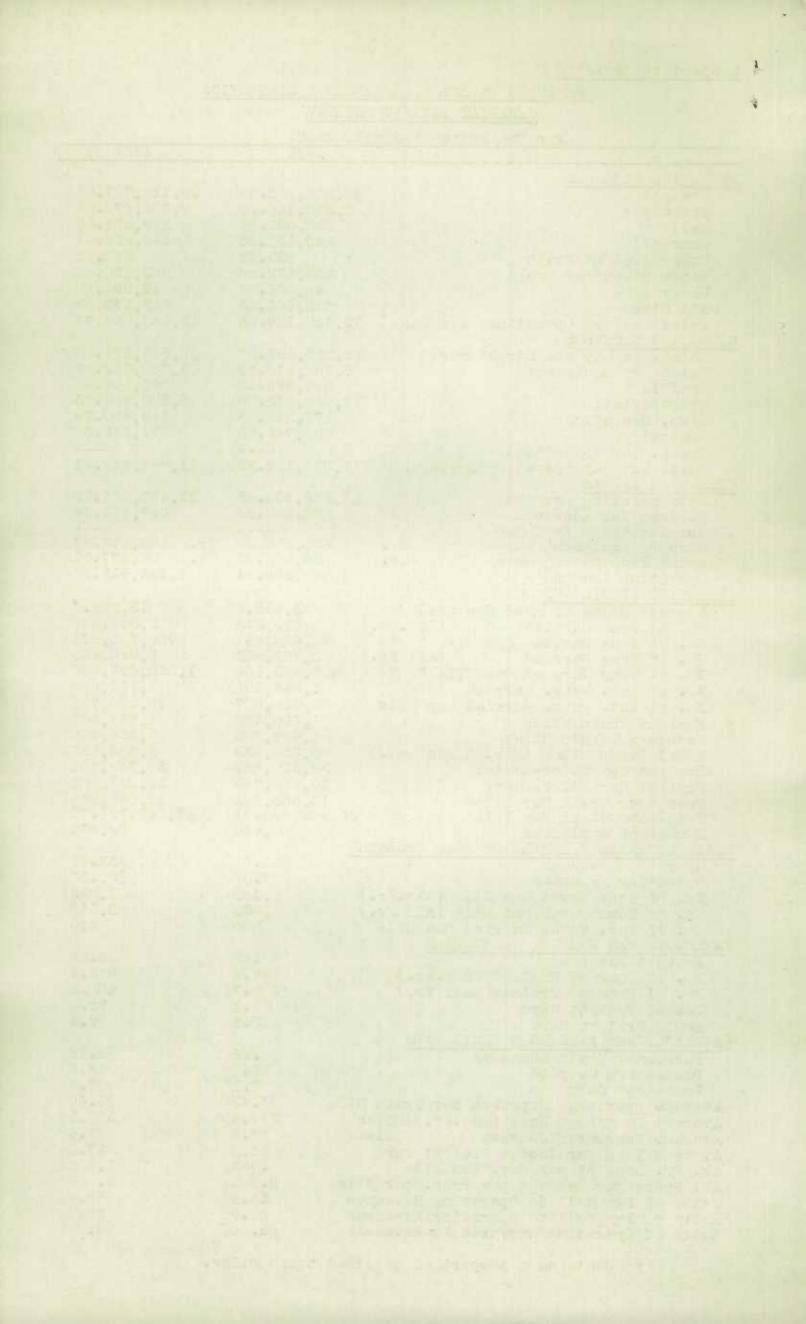

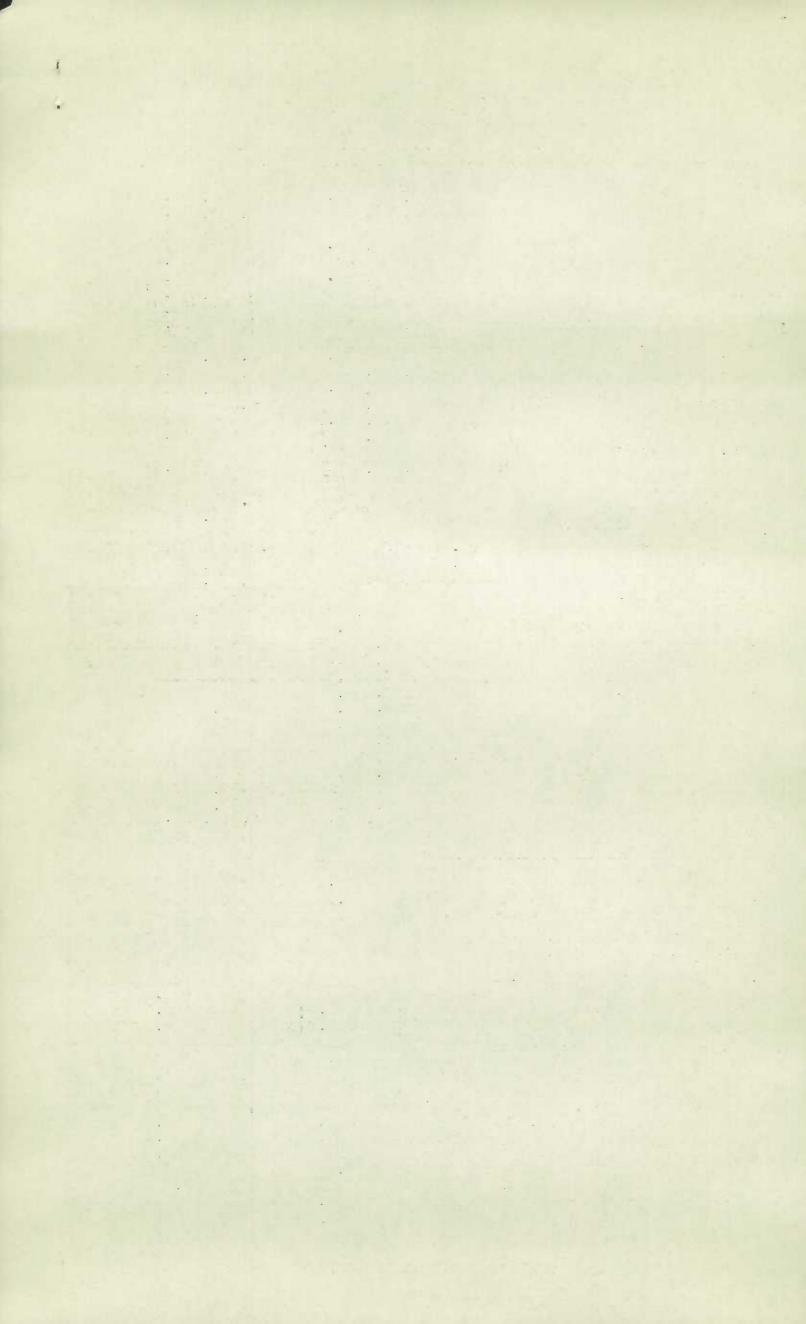

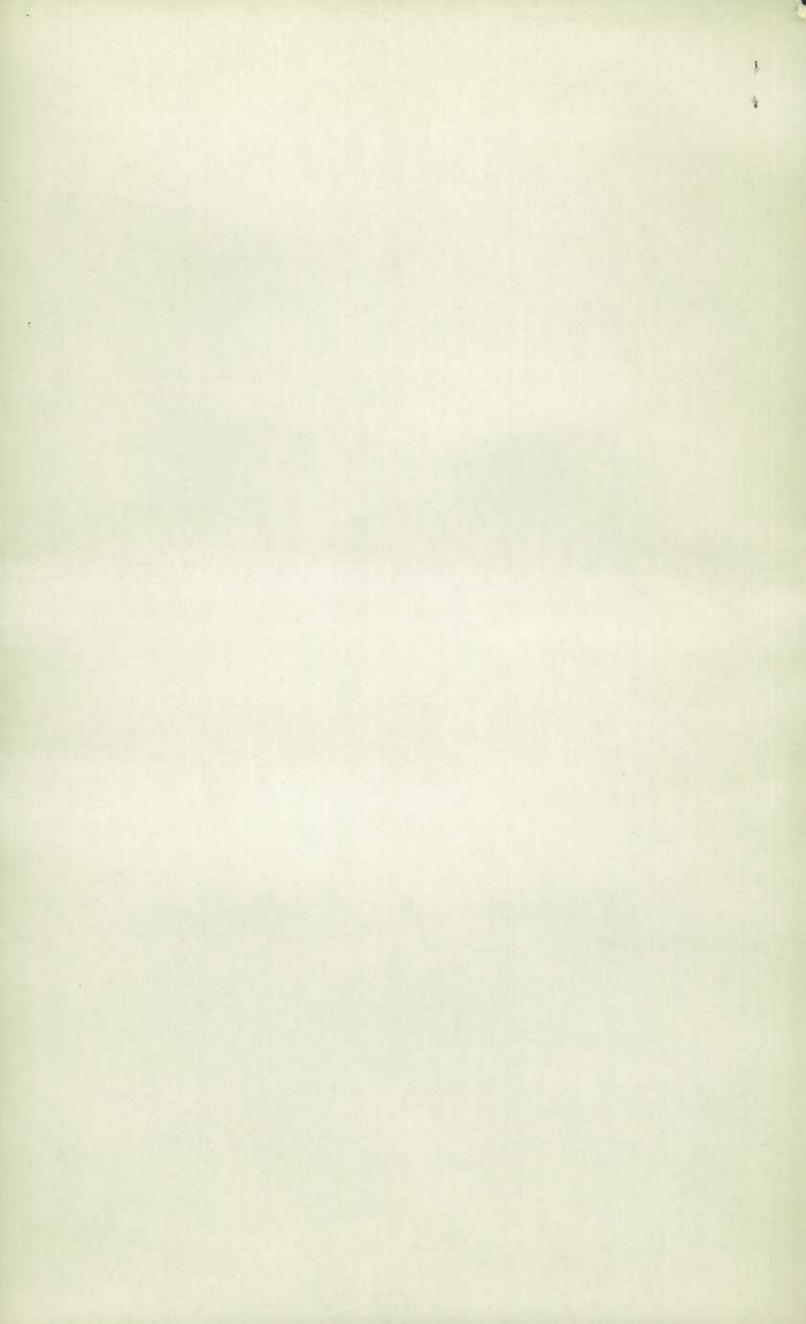
