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# OPERATING REVENUES, EXPENSES \& STATISTICS RAILWAYS IN CANADA WITH ANNUAL OPERATING REVENUES OF $\$ 500,000$ OR OVER 

Grose operating revenues of Canadian rallways for November amounted to $\$ 56,926,382$, which was the largest November reverue earned in any year and compares with $\% 4,218,678$ in 1941. Freight revenues increased by 11.4 p.c., and passenger revenues increased by $66.2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., amounting to $\$ 7,278,589$. Thin was the highest since 1920, although not as high as the sumer passenger revenues in 1920-1929 inclusive. Dus to reduced rates the avarage reverue per passenger mile was only 1.888 cents as against 5.366 cents in November 1920. Operating expenses increased from $855,496,085$ in 1941 to $\$ 41,884,504$, and the operating income increased from $99,926,575$ to $\$ 11,509,243$

Freight traffic measured in revenue ton miles was 7.8 p.c, heavier than in 1941 and was exceeded by only October and November 1928 traffic. Passenger traffic measured in passenger miles was 69.? p.c. heavier than in Hovember 1941 and 52 p.c. heavier than in November 1920, the previous high record for November, but was not as heavy as the August traffic of $1920,1923,1925$ and 1928 , the differences ranging from 4 to 8 p.c.

The pey roll amounted to $\$ 23,783,818$, which was the highest on record for the month, exceeding November 1941 by $\$ 2,804,759$ and November 1928 by $\$ 104,467$, but the number of employees was less than in 1928 by 26,725 . The average wage of all amployees was $18 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Kigher in November 1942 than in 192B. An average of such a wide range of wages will indicate trend only roughly.

Revenue freight per train mile increased from 716.3 to 773.3 tons and passengers per train mile increesed from 72.1 to 210.4.

For January - November grose revenues increased from $483,282,875$ in 1941 to $8592,411,159$, and the oparating incoee increased frow $491,930,273$ to $\$ 117,450,694$.

CAMADIAB MATIONAL RALLWAYS: Operating revenues of the Canadien lines increased from ${ }^{2} 25,687,899$ in Noweber 1941 to $\$ 28,175,200$ or by 18.8 p.c. Operating expenses increased by $\$ 3,626,108$ or 19.1 p.c., and the operating income increased from $\$ 4,055,811$ to $\$ 4,909,038$. Tax accruals were reduced from $\$ 432,787$ to $\$ 264,660$. The United States ines showed increases in oparating revenues and operating income, raising the oysterating revenue to $\$ 81,866,000$ as agalnst $\$ 27,292,966$ in 1941 , and the operating income from H,645,564 to $05,572,587$.

For Jamary - Noveaber system oparating revemues increased from $\$ 276,365,487$ in 1941 to $\$ 858,695,000$ and the operating income fram $\$ 50,244,578$ to $\$ 67,459,442$.

CAMADIAS PACIFIC RAILIIAY COMPANI: Operating revenues amounted to $\$ 22,604,999$ as compared with $\$ 80,382,858$ in November 1941. Operating axpenses increased from $\$ 13,706,959$ to $815,643,685$ and the operating incoee from ${ }^{(5,201,227}$ to $\$ 5,269,455$. Tares increased from $\$ 1,299,506$ to $\$ 1,501,767$. Froight traffic was bearier than in 1941 by 8.4 p.c. and pessenger traffic increased by 7.4 p.c.

For January = November opereting revenues increased from $\$ 201,249,854$ to $\$ 234,227,125$, and the opernting incom from $840,866,785$ to $\$ 42,898,578$.
