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# OPERATING REVENUES, EXPENSES A STATISTICS RAILWAYS IN CANADA WITH ANNUAL OPERATING REVENUES OF \$500,000 OR OVER

Operating revenues of canadian railways d'or Uctober amounted to $\$ 66,913,650$ as against $61,281,447$ in October, 1942. Freight revenues increased by $1,983,066$ or $4.2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. , and passenger revenues increased by ( $2,771,935$ or $36.8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Freight traffic increased by $12.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{cm}$, and revenue pascenger miles increased by 34.5 p.c., although the number of passengers carried increased by only $11.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The average load per car (veighted by miles) increased from 30.5 to 32.3 tons, and the average haul increased from 370 to 375 miles. The average pessenger journey increased from 108 to 130 miles , and excluding commuter traffic increased from 143 to 155 miles.

For January to October operating revenues amounted to $\$ 635,976,577$ in 1943 and $\$ 535,484,767$ in 1942.

CANADIAN NATIONAL RAULWAYS: Operating revenues of wanadian lines increased from $\$ 52,128,400$ in October, 1942 to $\$ 33,299,400$. Keductions in maintenance expenses were effected through smaller charges for deferred maintenance and an increase in general expenses was dwa almost exclusively to a charge of $\$ 1,000,000$ in 1943 as explained in footnote (1), the net increase in total expenses being $\$ 865,053$. Although freight revenues declined by $\$ 911,500$ or $3.6 \mathrm{p.c.}$, revenue ton miles increased by $4.5 \mathrm{p.c}$. . the numbar of revenue passengers carried increased by $3.0 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{cog}_{\mathrm{o}}$ but vecause of an increass in the average journey passemger miles increased by $40.9 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{C}$. , whereas passenger train car miles increased by oniy $12.2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. the United Stetes lines showed an increase in operating revenues and systam revenues increased from $\$ 36,002,000$ in 1942 to $857,585,000$.

For Jamuary to October gross revemues of Canadian Lines increased from $\uparrow 270,952,200$ in 1942 to $\$ 323,765,900$ and of the system from $\$ 306,829,000$ to $\$ 364,534,000$.

GANADIAN FACIFIC RAILMAI COMHAY: With an increase in freight revemues of 13.4 p.c. and in passenger revemues of $18.5 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c} .$, total revenuas increased from $\$ 22,977,495 \mathrm{in}$ October, 1942 to $\$ 26,462,408$. Oparating expenses increased from $\$ 15,931,105$ to $\$ 19,162,189$ and the operating income from $\$ 5,718,182$ to $\$ 5,841,417$. The increase in freight traffic measured in ton miles was $17.2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., and passengers carried increased by 21.7 p.c., for an increase in passenger miles of 20.9 p.c.

For Jannary to October operating revenues were $\$ 244,044,972$ in 1945 and $\$ 211,822,126$ in 1942, and the operating incomes was $\$ 38,603,278$ in 1945 and $\$ 37,723,925$ in 1942.
