# OPERATING REVENUES, EXPENSES \& STATISTICS <br> RAILWAYS IN CANADA <br> $20-4140$ 

# WITH ANNUAL OPERATING REVENUES OF \$500,000 OR OVER 

For twelve uonths ended December 31, 1947

Operating revemes of Canadian rallyays at $\$ 776,520,384$ in 1947 were the second highest on record (exceeded only by the peak war year 1944) and registered an increase of over $\$ 65,134,000$ or 9.2 p.c. above 1946. Frejght revenues totalied $\$ 602,022,385$ - a nem all-time high, and were up 14.2 f.c. from $\$ 527,048,096$ in 1946, while passenger reverues declined some $\$ 12,346,000$ to $\$ 87,128,485$ or by $12.4 \mathrm{~F} . \mathrm{c}$. Exprese revenue rose $\$ 2,452,727$ mhile mail was up $\$ 189,223$.

Raflecting increases in costa of materials and wages, maintenance of way and structures expensen Fere 9.4 F.C. heavier at $\$ 132,304,531$ compared with $\$ 120,899,410$ while maintenance of equipment outlay increased from $\$ 13 \in, 193,318$ to $\$ 144,345,093$ or by 6 p.c. Transportation expenses rose to $\$ 343,928,456$ up §42,252,536 or by 14.0 f.c. Total opernting expenses reachod $\$ 683,045,372$ - the greatest in railway history.

In the income account, hire of equipment, principaliy for ireight cars from American lines, showed a ciebit of $\bar{\psi} 15,165,431$ compared with $\$ 8,733,824$ in 1946 and total operating income declined froill $\$ 58,107,279$
 and indicates that operating expenses have increased at a much more repid pace than revenues. Railway texes during 1947 rare $\$ 25,691,766$ againct $\$ 23,974,185$ in 1946 , up $\$ 1,707,581$.

Tons of freight carried totalled 169,174,660 tons - the lergeat paecetime volume recorded - and compares with $15 \varepsilon, 879,308$ tons in 1946 , an increase of 9.2 p.c., while freight train mileage rose only 5.9 f.c. The average length of haul for revenue freight declined allehtiy from 356 to 354 miles in 1947 but average tons per loaded frejght car mile rose from 29.9 tons to 30.1 . Total revenue passengers carried mas $38,122,771$ against $40,487,660$ in 1946. The average number of passengers per train mile dropped from 102 to 83 excluding comuters, and the average passenger journey from 115 to 97 miles.

Ratio of operting expenses to revenues increased from 87.0 in 1946 to 87.966 in 1947. Totril pay roll reeched an all time high at $\$ 409,244,518$ for 173,078 employees on Canadian lines coupared with $\$ 377,770,198$ for 168,914 emilojees in 1946.

Freicht revenue of S289,201, 479 was the highest on record and compares rifth $6253,799,233$ in 1946 und $8283,308,693 \mathrm{in} 1943$, the previous high. Operating expenses increesed

 ment rac up $25,12 n, 187$ over 194E at $669,675,104$. Hire of equipment advanced $32,445,393$ and texes $\$ 1,385,967$ and despite the recori frelcht traffic, operting income declined from $\$ 35,373,056$ in 1946 to $220,647,543$. The United Etates Imer refistared conaicerable improvement over 1946 and a debit in opereting incame of $\$ 3,814,109$ in 104E was chnged to $\&$ crecit of $\because 3,063,080$ in 1947 due principally to advenced freicht rates in the united strites. Total cperating income for the syetem was $\$ 23,710,623$ ageinst $\$ 31,558,947$ in 1946 and does not include interest chryes (ihtch rerc some $\$ 45,000,000$ in 2946) and other income items.

CAUADIAN PACIFIC PAILYAY COLPANY: Operating revenues were $\$ 321,223,099$ compared with $5294,545,601$ in
 to $2279,520,795$. Freltht revenues recisterod a gain of $\$ 32,328,383$ at $\$ 249,866,918$ and were up $24.9 \mathrm{p} \cdot \mathrm{C}$. ©ver 1946, but possenger revemue fell $\$ 5,093,150$ or 11.3 p.c. from the preceding year. Transportation charges for the year at $5133,952,979$ were $\$ 16,055,016$ or $13.6 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. heavier while maintenance of way and structures increced $54,285,999$ at $854,776,657$ and maintenance of oqupment rose $\$ 3,086,325$ to $562,285,265$. Taxes were dom some $\$ 700,000$ and operating income showed a gain of $\$ 2,049,239$, rising from $\$ 20,843,050$ in 1946 to $\$ 22,892,289$ In the year under review. Revemue ircicht truffic measured in ton miles advenced by 10.0 p.c. while revenue pascemger mileage declined $21.7 \mathrm{p} \cdot \mathrm{c}$. Pay roll at $\$ 159,412,263$ for 65,400 employees compared with $\$ 147,764,775$ for 64,192. In 1946, the everage per amplojee increasing from $\$ 2,302$ to $\$ 2,438$ or by 6 p.c.
