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November operating revenues of Canadian railways showed a decline of 2.6 p.c. from the same month of 1948, the total at \$78,687,803 off \$2,062,582 from the \$80,750,585 earned in the preceding November. The drop in freight earnings of \$2,858,104 to \$64,694,941 more than offset gains in passenger, mail, express, other passenger train and the 'all other' accounts. Passenger revenues were up 2.5 p.c., mail 4.1 p.c., and express 4 p.c., while other passenger train revenues and all other rose 15.7 and 14.5 p.c. respectively. Operating expenses for the month again acceeded the corresponding period of 1948, advancing \$2,168,747 to \$67,469,653, up 5.5 p.c. Maintenance of way and structures required nearly \$15,006,000, an increase of 22.9 p.c. or \$2,425,501, while maintenance of equipment charges rose 7.7 p.c. or \$1,080,612 to \$16,519,420 for the month under review. Traffic expenses were up slightly but transportation dropped 4.7 p.c. from \$5,201,609 in the previous November. Railway tax accruals were down sharply at \$251,155 compared with \$2,526,205 from \$5,201,609 in the previous November. Railway tax accruals were down sharply at \$251,155 compared with \$2,584,757 a year previously, as the Canadian Pacific and Canada Southern slaimed credits for the current month. Hire of equipment rose \$5,267 while joint rents eased \$30,430. The resulting operating income for November was \$9,621,803 against \$11,750,547 in the corresponding period of 1948, a drop of \$1,928,544. For the first 11 months, the credit in operating income was \$24,812,232 compared with \$28,075,245 to the end of November, 1948 - both sums well below half the total annual interest requirement for railway funded det. Operating revenues from Newfoundland lines are placed at \$764,000 for November and expenses at some \$60,400. These entries were not present in statistics given for the previous November and comparisons are time affected to a minor degree.

Each item shown under operating statistics registered recession from the previous November. Operating data, which do not yet include Newfoundland, indicate a decrease in revenue freight tons carried of 12.1 p.c. from the preceding November, the total at 13,850,106 against 15,760,228 tons, but revenue freight ton miles eased only 6.9 p.c. as average length of haul increased from 357 to 378 miles. Revenue passengers carried numbered 174,442 less than November 1948, the current months total at 2,288,921 decreasing 7.1 p.c., and average journey eased from 88 to 86 miles. Increased fare tariffs provided the small advances in passenger revenues mentioned above. Freight train miles and passenger train miles were down 4.3 p.c. and 2.8 p.c. respectively. Loaded freight car miles declined 5.5 p.c., while empty mileage eased 2.1 p.c. from that shown for November of 1948.

The number of employees at ]74,495 showed a minor cutback of 2,579 or 1.5 p.c., while total pay roll declined from \$41,461,509 to \$40,575,822 or 2.1 p.c., which from operating expenses shown above would appear to be largely emong transportation department employees. Some \$46,027 backtime had been included in November, 1948 pay. Average freight receipt per revenue ton mile was 1.257 cents for November against 1.202 cents one year earlier while average passenger receipt rose from 2.484 to 2.856 cents per passenger per mile in the similar comparison.

CANADIAN NATIONAL RAILWARS: Revenues from all Canada operations during November were \$59,510,200 compared with \$59,035,400 in the previous November. The increase of \$474,800 was due entirely to the addition this year of Newfoundland lines. Revenues from the other mine provinces, however, were well maintained, the estimated recession being some \$289,200 or less than 1 p.c. All rovenue accounts with the exception of freight down 0.7 p.c., registered gains over the previous November. Passenger receipts were up 5.9 p.c., while mail and express showed good gains and "all other" account increased \$297,213 to \$2,000,102. Maintenance charges were considerably higher in November, way and structures jumping 25.8 p.c. from \$4,869,869 to \$6,028,588 as a result of heavier expenditures on Atlantic, Central and Western regions. Equipment maintenance rose 9.5 p.c., or \$685,458 to \$7,865,191 in the same comparison. Transportation expenses were reduced from \$18,479,552 to \$17,7841,4485 or by 5.5 p.c., but general account was up over 25 p.c. to \$1,798,588. The resulting total of operating expenses at \$34,555,056 was \$1,554,686 or 4.7 p.c. higher than that reported for the preceding November and includes \$630,400 on Newfoundland lines. Tax accruals rose \$46,08! to \$621,540 for the month while hire of equipment increased by \$259,467 to \$315,055, and rents showed a credit of \$14,807 compared with a debit of \$5,676 one year earlier. Operating income at \$4,065,568 was down \$1,546,585 from the same month of 1948, and for the first alevan months recorded a credit of only \$65,785 million to be paid out of operating incomes, the \$87,785 shown is indeed a mere toothful. Revenue freight ton miles (ex Newfoundland) were down 5.8 p.c., while tonnage dropped 10.9 p.c. compared with November, 1948. The increase in rates prevented a more serious decline in freight revenues. Revenue passengers decreased 6.5 p.c. in numbers to 1,220,791 but fare advances, despite shorter average journeys, helped earnings. Both loade and ampty freight car mileage d

CANADIAN PACIFIC FAILMAY COMPANY: Operating revenues totalled \$32,168,257 for November, down 5.8 p.c. from the same month of 1948. Revenue accounts except other passenger train and 'all other' registered recession. Freight receipts were \$2,085,590 lighter at \$26,846,745, while passenger train and 'all other' registered recession. Express dropped 5.4 p.c. Operating expenses ross 5.2 p.c. from \$28,764,146 to \$27,616,755, with maintenance charges up \$1,829,598 and transportation charges down \$917,662 or 6.7 p.c. Maintenance of way and structures took nearly \$6 million, a 31.7 p.c. increase over the previous November. Some \$250,000 was deferred maintenance. Railway tax accruals, which had been \$1,952,140 in the November report for 1948, dove to a credit adjustment of \$142,105. Decreases were also shown in hire of equipment and rents. Operating income at \$4,515,045 was \$556,545 below the preceding November. Tone of revenue freight at 5,166,407 were down 12.7 p.c., but ton miles receded only 7.4 p.c. Loaded freight car mileage decreased 5.5 p.c., or nearly 4,606,000 miles, but empty mileage advanced 4.5 p.c. Total pey roll was up \$47,014 to \$16,222,815 me employees numbered 1,782 more this November at 69,565. Average freight receipts per revenue ton mile ware little changed in the November comparison, but average passenger receipt per mile improved from 2,544 to 2.802 cents. Subject to Revision
