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## OPERATING REVENUES, EXPENSES & STATISTICS RAILWAYS IN CANADA WITH ANNUAL OPERATING REVENUES OF \$500,000 OR OVER

MARCH, 1950

Canadian railways reported an encouraging gain in total operating revenues for March at a new record for the month of \$78,091,554, up 5.1 p.c. or \$3,766,514 over the corresponding period of 1949. Part of the improvement was likely ettributable to the backlog of freight which accumulated during the difficult months of January and Paruary in the far west, and particularly to higher tariffs granted March 23rd as well as October 11, 1949. Operating expenses were pared slightly below the previous March from \$70,612,242 to \$70,556,070 and with reductions in tax secruals, hire of equipment and joint rents, produced an operating income of \$5,299,114 compared with one of \$1,315,350 a year earlier, a betterment of some \$3,785,784. Newfoundland statistics are included in all accounts. For the first quarter of the current year, the debit in operating income was \$1,597,167 compared with \$4,015,985 in the same period of 1949 and a credit of \$566,965 in 1948. The recent increase of 5.4 p.c. awarded in freight rates should assist in bringing the roads above the break even point on operations, but greatly augmented traffic and reduced expenses are imperative to produce sufficient operating income to meet even fixed annual interest charges, which are an impressive \$67 millions.

Revenues from freight totalled \$64,714,590 during March, up 5 p.c. or \$5,104,548 over the corresponding period of 1949 to a new high for the month. Passenger fares were down \$305,878 or 5.5 p.c. to \$5,442,515. Mail receipts were advanced slightly but express gained 7.9 p.c. to \$2,805,992 and the sall others account improved \$805,041 to \$3,608,581.

Maintenance on way and structures eased 2.1 p.c. or \$260,507 to \$12,114,547 but equipment charges were \$52,538 heavier at \$17,134,212. Traffic expenses were up 5.4 p.c., but transportation expenses were a little less at \$55,158,045 against \$35,233,741 one year earlier. Miscellaneous operations showed a reduction of some \$80,000 or 7.2 p.c., while general charges were increased \$228,579 to nearly \$3,530,000.

Railway tax accrumis were \$1,469,201 for the month, down \$57,078 while hire of equipment took \$90,519 less than the preceding March and joint rents eased \$13,701.

Revenue freight transported during Merch weighed 15,023,029 tons, off 2.4 p.c. or 320,590 tons from 1949 with size-able reductions in grain, pulpwood and L.C.L. shipments discounting advances in coal, lumber, crude oil, eutos and newsprint. Car loadings during the last half of the month were above 1949. Ton miles were down 4 p.c., and average length of haul was 382 miles against 388 miles one year earlier. Revenue passengers numbered 2,537,808, a decline of 9.5 p.c., and average journey dropped from 85 to 77 miles, resulting in a decrease of 16 p.c. in revenue passenger mileaga. Loaded freight car miles were up 3.2 p.c. over March of 1943 and empty car mileage dropped 12.9 p.c. The increase in loaded freight car miles against a decline in revenue ton mileage was largely due to the augmented movement of non-revenue coal to replenish railway stocks and some lighter loading per car in deference to read bed conditions.

Pey roll grossed \$41,585,580, up 0.9 p.c. over March, 1949, while employees numbered 173,753, totalling 648 or 0.4 p.c. less than shown for the same month of the preceding year, despite the acquisition of some 4,200 Newfoundland employees to the Canadian National staff.

Average freight receipt per revenue ton mile was 1.501 cents for March against 1.190 cents one year earlier, whereas the average for Class 1 steam railways in the United States was over 1.40 cents. Passenger receipts per mile improved from 2.465 to 2.778 cents.

GANADIAN NATIONAL RAILWAYS: Service to the tem provinces produced operating revenues of \$38,285,790 as compared with \$56,210,700 in March, 1949, a betterment of 8.8 p.c. or \$2,475,000, of which some \$750,600 was due to the addition of the Newfoundland district. Operating expenses rose \$1,062,196 or 3 p.c. to \$57,054,716, with \$1,908,989 shown as expenditures in Newfoundland. Tax accruals increased \$15,421 to \$620,084, hire of equipment was up \$12,550, but rents showed a credit of \$9,446. Operating income for the month improved to \$951,802 from a debit of \$441,007 in March lest year. Freight receipts advanced 7.2 p.c. or \$2,115,000 to \$31,552,000, but passenger declined 9.7 p.c., and mail 4.4 p.c. Express and "all other" account improved. Each expense account was higher, with maintenance charges increasing nearly \$437,000 over the previous March. Transportation expenses rose 2.2 p.c. or \$413,360 to \$19,194,342 and general account was up 8.7 p.c. Revenue freight carried totalled 5,530,655 tons, off only 4,435 tons from the volume one year earlier, but ton miles eased 2.5 p.c. Passengers were some 153,261 or 10 p.c. fewer at 1,379,693 and passenger mileage slumped 23 p.c. as average journey decreased from 75 to 64 miles. Average tons per loaded freight car miles indicated lighter loading at 28.6 tons against 30.1 tons one year earlier. Employees numbered 98,927 receiving \$23,104,559 as compared to 98,061 with pay roll of \$22,505,851 in March of 1949, representing increases of 0.9 p.c. in numbers and 2.7 p.c. in wages.

American lines of the System improved their operating income from \$158,907 in March, 1949, to \$834,939 to give a total for All Lines of \$1,796,741 for the month against a debit of \$283,600 in the previous March. Operating income for the first quarter shows a System debit of \$4,725,027 against \$5,950,208 last year.

CANADIAN PACIFIC RAILWAY COMPANY: General betterment was indicated in March operations. Operating revanues rose 4.5 p.c. to \$32,229,916 compared with \$30,990,969 in the corresponding month of last year, while expensas were shared 5.2 p.c. or \$954,593 to \$26,513,704. Tax accruals were little changed but hire of equipment showed a credit and rents eased. The result was an operating income of \$5,264,156 for the month, a bettermont of \$2,450,212 in the March to March comparison. Despite a decline of 6.7 p.c. in tons of revenue freight and 6.2 p.c. in ton miles, freight receipts rose 4.1 p.c. to \$26,878,993. Passengers decreased 7.1 p.c. in number and revenues 1.6 p.c. as average receipt per mile improved from 2.573 to 2.905 cents. Express revenues climbed 18.4 p.c. over March, 1949 to \$13,8786. Maintenance charges were reduced some \$540,600 and transportation \$470,124 to \$13,434,862. Pay roll totalled \$16,213,461, down 1.2 p.c., while employees numbered 65,444 or 2.2 p.c. less than in the preceding March. The road's ratio of operating expenses to revenues was 88.5 compared with 95.4 p.c. one year earlier.
