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OPERATING REVENUES, EXPENSES & STATISTICS
RAILWAYS IN CANADA
WITH ANNUAL OPERATING REVENUES OF
\$500,000 OR OVER

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NOVEMBER, 1952

The operating revenues of the major Canadian lines moved forward to a new peak for the month of November at \$96,536,525, an increase of \$1,821,466 or 1.9 p.c. over the corresponding period of 1951. However, expenses advanced more widely from \$83,544,626 to \$86,846,955, a rise of 4 p.c. or \$3,302,329. Taxes eased from \$2,400,502 to \$1,748,110, hire of equipment was \$316,339 lighter at \$968,061 and joint rents declined \$27,319 to \$154,071. The net result for November was an operating income of \$6,819,328 compared with \$7,304,141 a year earlier and \$13,541,249 in November of 1950.

All revenue accounts except passenger registered improvement over the preceding November. Freight earnings were up 1.9 p.c. or \$1,462,995 to \$78,303,458 but passenger fares dropped 11.9 p.c. from \$6,682,083 to \$5,885,395 with numbers carried down 11.4 p.c. and passenger miles off 12.1 p.c. Freight volume receded 4.3 p.c. but longer average hauls produced 4.7 p.c. more ton miles of service. Mail posted a minor gain while express earnings rose 17.9 p.c. or \$732,708 to \$4,828,284 with higher rates and good volume. Water line receipts were \$52,323 better at \$450,827 and miscellaneous items produced 6.6 p.c. more in the recent November at \$5,042,238. Increases predominated in expense accounts as maintenance of way and structures required \$561,616 more at \$16,921,237. Traffic charges increased nearly 18 p.c. to \$1,846,415 and transportation took \$1,822,174 or 4.5 p.c. more at \$42,679,576. General expenses continued to advance steadily from \$3,921,268 to \$4,701,892. Equipment maintenance eased fractionally from \$19,612,063 to \$19,534,370 and miscellaneous operations were pared \$64,624 to \$1,163,465.

In the first eleven months of 1952 operating revenues soured to a record \$1,061,867,000 as against some \$989,036,000 in 1951, while expenses rose from \$886,128,000 to \$947,918,000. Operating income improved \$4,645,000 to the end of November moving up from \$57,550,000 in 1951 to \$62,195,000 but was well under the \$73,764,664 germered in the similar period of 1950. The eleven months of 1942 had produced an operating income of \$117,450,694 and for considerably less ton miles of railway service.

Tonnage carried during November aggregated 15,255,760 against 15,941,006 tons a year earlier down 4.3 p.c. but ton miles rose 4.7 p.c. as average haul increased from 366 to 400 miles. Loaded freight car miles were up 4.5 p.c. or by 8,960,674 miles, while empty mileage advanced 6.9 p.c. or by 6,666,427 miles. Total railway payroll for November was \$50,-369,544 going to 200,851 employees and compared with \$2,143,685 earned by 202,030 a year earlier. Earnings were thus off 3.4 p.c. and employment 0.6 p.c. The ratio of operating payroll to operating revenues eased from 51 p.c. in the previous November to 48 p.c.

CANADIAN NATIONAL RAILWAYS: Revenues on Canadian operations improved \$4,57,200 or 1 p.c. over November of 1951 to toal \$4,8,521,100. Expenses were reduced \$779,185 or 1.3 p.c. to \$44,7791,967. Tax accruals rose nearly \$299,000 to \$761,-158 but debits on hire of equipment were \$223,827 less at \$45,321. Operating income for November was thus better at \$2,924,-236 versus \$1,962,170 a year earlier but considerably under the \$6,100,704 reported for November of 1950.

Freight receipts were fractionally lower while passenger earnings shrank 14.2 p.c. However, mail, express and miscellaneous revenues continued higher to produce increased total receipts. Maintenance of way and structures expenditures were reduced 5.5 p.c. and equipment 9.2 p.c. Traffic expenses rose 3.7 p.c., transportation 1.7 p.c. and general expenses 24.2 p.c. over the previous November.

Revenue freight tonnage carried eased 5.3 p.c. but ton miles gained 5.6 p.c. The drop in passengers was 10.6 p.c. in numbers and 14.5 p.c. in mileage as shorter journeys occurred.

Total payroll was \$28,478,940 to 115,151 workers against \$29,439,052 received by 115,961 in the preceding November. Payroll was thus down 3.3 p.c. and employment 0.7 p.c.

Operating income of United States lines improved from \$355,556 to \$375,728, and that for the System from \$2,-317,726 to \$3,299,964. During the eleven months to November end, the System operating income was \$23,199,806 against \$23,635,-333 in 1951 and \$37,081,059 in 1950. American lines lost \$208,806 to the 30th of November, 1952 compared with a credit of \$2,-270.623 in 1951.

CANADIAN FACIFIC RAILWAY COMPANY: With revenues gaining \$1,034,299 or 2.7 p.c. to \$38,948,644 and expenses climbing \$3,459,679 or 10.8 p.c. over November of 1951 to \$35,497,652, net operating revenues were clipped \$2,425,380 at \$3,-450,992. However, taxes shrank from \$1,415,000 to \$400,000 and the debits on equipment and rents were lower. Operating income was, consequently, \$2,895,112 for November or \$1,239,414 under the same month of 1951 when \$4,134,526 was reported. The current income was the lowest for any November in many a year.

Revenue accounts on freight, mail, express, other passenger train and water line showed gains over the preceding November, while passenger fares and miscellaneous receipts were lower. Freight earnings improved 4.8 p.c. or \$1,492,-457 to \$32,885,480, as ton miles and rates were higher to offset a decline of 5.6 p.c. in tonnage.

Revenue passengers were down 14.2 p.c. in number and 10.1 p.c. in mileage covered.

Nearly all expense items were increased. Maintenance of way and structures rose 9 p.c. to \$7,007,710 and equipment required 12.5 p.c. or \$952,137 more at \$8,551,147. Traffic expenses were up considerably while transportation took \$16,562,988 for an increase of 9.5 p.c. or \$1,436,416. The C.P.R. payroll for November for 75,266 employees was \$18,892,561 versus \$19,784,154 to 76,002 workers a year earlier, indicating declines of 4.5 p.c. in payments and nearly 1 p.c. in employment.

To the end of November, operating income was \$26,455,299 against \$23,739,774 in the corresponding period of 1951, \$33,161,567 in 1950 and \$17,516,296 in 1949.
