RAILWAYS IN CANADA

WITH ANNUAL OPERATING REVENUES OF \$500,000 OR OVER

STATISTIQUE

Although railway operating revenues climbed to a new record for the month of \$99,795,978 in December, expenses source to a peak of \$101.400,661 mainly as a result of wage increases accorded. The gain in revenues from the previous December was \$9,915,024 or 11 p.c. while expenses jumped \$18,014,844 or by 21.6 p.c. in the same comparison. A tax accrual credit, from a year-end adjustment, of \$794,584 mainly on income taxes) was shown. The debit on equipment hire was down \$113,181 to \$977,586 but joint rents were \$21,774 higher at \$50,617. The resulting operating income for the month reflected a loss of \$1,838,302 against a profit of \$3,931,347 in the previous December - or a worsening of nearly \$5,770,000 despite an incremse in work performed by the railways. This appears to be the poorest financial result for any December's operations in the history of Canadian railways and occurs oddly enough at a time of high

DECEMBER, 1952

Most revenue accounts posted advances over the previous December with freight earnings up 14.8 p.c. or \$10,175,000 to \$79,021,513. Tonnage carried improved 2.5 p.c. to 14,167,050 while revenue ton miles rose 6.6 p.c. as average haul was 413 miles against 397. Passenger receipts slipped 8.4 p.c. or \$738,805 to \$8,097,050 as number of fares declined 6.6 p.c. and passenger miles were down 9.3 p.c., average journey being off from 106 to 103 miles. Receipts from mail at \$1,539,065 were 2.3 p.c. above December of 1951. Express was elightly lower but other accounts showed gains. Among expense items only maintenance of way and structures was lower, pared 4.6 p.c. or \$708,431 to \$14,758,489. Maintenance of equipment rose 22.6 p.c. or \$4,258,299 to \$23,060,263. Traffic expenses were 11.9 p.c. heavier at \$1,963,897 while transportation required a total of \$52,198,982, some 23.6 p.c. or nearly \$10,000,000 more than in the previous December due principally to higher wage payments. General expenses likewise were sharply higher jumping from \$3,702,747 to \$7,862,725 or by 112.3 p.c. December payroll for 198,994 employees amounted to \$56,526,696 compared with \$51,687,435 going to 197,902 workers in the same period of 1951. Payroll was thus up 9.4 p.c. and employment by 0.55 p.c. Payroll chargeable to railway operating expenses showed a wider gain due to year-end adjustments.

Average freight receipt per revenue ton mile for December was 1.350 cents versus 1.254 cents a year earlier while passenger receipt per mile was little changed at 2.947 cents against 2.916.

CANADIAN MATICHAL RAILWAYS: Worthwhile gains in operating revenues were swamped by wide increases in expenses. Total receipts advanced 10.7 p.c. on Canadian lines moving up from \$46,726,521 to a record \$51,719,665 but expenses rose 23 p.c. or \$10,461,877 to \$56,013,379. Tax accruals were \$12,329 higher at \$555,714 while hire of equipment and rentals were much more favourable, equipment showing a credit of \$88,723 against a \$236,446 debit in the preceding December. Operating income registered a loss of \$4,755,847 compared with a credit of \$396,891 a year earlier. Earnings from freight carriage improved 14 p.c. to \$39,290,941 with tonnage up 4.5 p.c. and ton miles 9.1 p.c. Passenger fares were off 10.1 p.c. due to shorter average journays and a 5 p.c. drop in patronage. Total payroll increased 9.5 p.c. and employment 2.7 p.c. U.S. lines of the System had an operating income of \$1,050,365 compared with \$1,665,225 in December of 1951. With the domestic loss the System shows a debit of \$3,705,482 for the month against a credit of \$1,962,116 in operating income a year earlier.

CANADIAN PACIFIC RAILWAY COMPANY: Revermes improved \$3,961,110 or 11.1 p.c. over the previous December to a record \$39,554,937 but expenses rose 21.6 p.c. or \$6,982,236 to \$39,236,068 and include some retroactive wage awards. A credit of \$2,277,065 is shown in tax accruals to adjust overstatements in previous months. The debit on hire of equipment was reduced from \$326,888 to \$136,655 but the credit for joint rents was smaller this December. Operating income for the month was \$2,475,481 compared with \$3,073,058 in the similar period of 1951 and is the lowest for the month since 1948. Freight receipts posted a gain of 15.5 p.c. or \$4,375,358 over the previous December to total \$32,571,017. Revenue tonscarried were up 5.6 p.c. at 5,141,018 tons whils ton miles \$4.375,358 over the previous December to total \$32,571,017. Revenue tomscarried were up 5.6 p.c. at 5,141,018 tons while to mailes improved 6.2 p.c. The number of passengers transported dropped 8.9 p.c. to 913,416 and revenues consequently declined from \$3,653,181 to \$3,425,460. Express revenues dropped 21.9 p.c. or \$218,688 to \$778,500 but mail, other passenger train and water line accounts were productive as compared with December of 1951. All expense items were greater except the general account. Maintenance of way and structure took 6.2 p.c. or \$361,150 more at \$6,189,834 and equipment jumped 20.7 p.c. to \$9,297,521. Transportation charges were 31.8 p.c. or \$4,917,244 heavier at \$20,364,110 due to higher wages. Total payroll for the month without retroactive increases amounted to \$20,649,186 to 72,910 employees compared with \$19,461,359 going to 75,203 a year earlier. Payments thus rose 6.1 p.c. against a decline of 3 p.c. in the working force.

Loaded freight car miles increased 5.6 p.c. while empty mileage advanced 28.2 p.c., the increases being some 4.069,000 and 10,532,000 miles respectively. Average freight receipt per ton mile on the C.P.E. improved from 1.224 to 1.331 cents.

Summary data for the twelve months of 1952 will be released shortly.
