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## RAILWAY OPERATING STATISTICS

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Presented in this report are the September 1963 financial statistics and the August 1963 operating results of class 1 and 2 carriers (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other railways having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded are details of class 3 and 4 roads (those with operating revenues of less than \$500,000) whose operations represent about one per cent of all common carrier railways.

While operating statistics of the Cartier Railway Company have been included in other rail transport series since August 1962, they are omitted from this report due to non-availability of the necessary data.

## Financial Statistics

Railway operating revenues in September 1963 increased 5.7 per cent to \$99,929,146 from September one year earlier. Operating expenses rose to a lesser degree, increasing 2.1 per cent to \$95,045,229. This resulted in a net operating income of \$4,883,917 as compared to one of \$1,438,829 in the same month a year earlier. September 1963 railway operating expenses amounted to 95.11 cents per dollar of revenue.

The Canadian National Railways reported a 14.2 per cent increase in operating revenues to \$48,444,723 while the Canadian Pacific showed a 4.6 per cent decline to \$36,274,064. In comparing the above revenues of the two roads it should be noted that C.N.R. freight receipts for September 1963 include approximately \$2.4 million in interim payments relating to recommendations of the Royal Commission on Transportation. The C.P.R. share of this subsidy is not included with their reported earnings. Freight Rates Reduction Act payments were reported in both C.N.R. and C.P.R. freight revenues and amounted to approximately \$0.8 million and \$0.5 million, respectively. Operating expenses of the Canadian National increased 3.3 per cent to \$48,390,173. The Canadian Pacific reported expenses of \$34,807,074, an increase amounting to less than one half of 1 per cent over the same period last year. The C.N.R.'s net operating income for the month of September amounted to \$54,550 in comparison with a deficit of \$4,408,819 a year earlier. The C.P.R., on the other hand, showed a net operating income of \$1,466,990, down from \$3,209,486 in September 1962.

Rail operating revenues, comprising railway, express, commercial communications and highway transport (rail) services rose 5.5 per cent to \$111,079,539. Operating expenses were higher by 2.2 per cent rising to \$105,548,513 and the net operating income was up to \$5,531,026 from \$2,088,446 in the preceding year.

## Operating Statistics

During August 1963, the railways carried over 16.6 million tons of revenue freight, up 0.6 per cent from the same period in 1962. The number of ton-miles rose 4.6 per cent to 6,241,554. The average length of haul rose to 376 miles from 361. The average revenue per ton-mile of freight declined to 1.360 cents from 1.423. The number of passengers carried during the month of August rose 1.2 per cent to 1,816 thousand while passenger-miles dropped 0.4 per cent to 263 million. The average passenger journey dropped to 145 miles from 147 and the average revenue earned per passenger-mile declined to 2,615 cents from 2,674
