## OTTAWA - CANADA

Published by Authority of the Minister of Trade and Commerce


Presented in this report are June 1968 and 1967 financial and traffic results of twenty-four class 1 and 2 common carrier railways operating in Camada (the C.N.R., C.P. and other lines having average gross revenues of $\$ 500,000$ or more annually). Excluded from both years are statistics of class 3 and 4 roads (those with revenues of less than $\$ 500,000$ ) whose operations represent about one per cent of all railways.

Included in both years are results of the Ontario Government rail commuter services (GO), which began operating May 23, 1967 between Pickering and Hamilton, Ontario. The June 1967 figures for this operation are, however, a monthly estimate based on the seven month total reported for the Jume to December 1967 period. While the above-noted service is operated by Canadian National, statistics pertaining thereto are not included with those of that railway. Therefore the total number of reporting roads has been increased to 24 .

## Financial Statistics

Operating revenues of the twenty-four common carrier railways in June 1968 , declined 6.0 per cent to $\$ 130,973,237$ from the previous year while operating expenses were down 4.2 per cent to $\$ 119,240,701$. The resulting net aperating income was $\$ 11,732,536$ compared with $\$ 14,840,458$ a year earlier. June 1968 railway expenses amounted to 91.04 cents per dollar of revenue.

The Canadian National Railways recorded a 8.9 per cent decrease in operating revenues to $\$ 65,471,077$ and a 5.7 per cent decline in operating expenses to $\$ 61,134,979$. This resulted in a net operating profit of $\$ 4,336,098$ as compared to one of $\$ 7,077,432$ in the previous year. The Canadian Pacific reported a 4.3 per cent drop in operating revenues to $\$ 48,696,330$ and a 4.6 per cent decrease in operating expenses to $\$ 44,282,480$. The C.P. net operating income totalled $\$ 4,413,850$ down slightly from \$4,481,040 in 1967.

Rail operating revenues, which comprise railway, express, commercial communications and highway transport (rail) services, dropped 5.0 per cent to $\$ 144,786,474$. Operating expenses were down by 3.4 per cent dropping to $\$ 131,787,732$ and as a result, the net rail operating income declined to $\$ 12,998,742$ from $\$ 16,013,006$ in 1967 ,

## Traffic Statistics

During June 1968 , a total of 21.3 million tons of revenue freight were handied by railways int Canada, up 0.5 per cent from the same period a year earlier. The number of ton-miles generated in June declined to 8,386 million from 8,661 million and the average haul at 393 was down 15 miles from the earlier year. The average revenue earned per ton-mile of frelght increased slightly to 1.368 cents from 1.363 cents.

The number of revenue passengers carried by rall in June 1968 was down from the previous year and the average fourney was relatively shorter as might be expected considering the influence centennial celebrations and Canada's World's Fair exerted on 1967 travel. During June 1968 passengers numbered $1,851,128$, down 15.4 per cent from the previous year and passenger-miles at 293 milion dropped 26.0 per cent. The length of trip averaged 159 miles in June this year in contrast to 181 mdles in the earlier year. The average revenue earned by the ralways per passenger-mile travelled decreased to 2.668 cents from 2.772 cents.

Employment in the railwsy industry (including only over-the-rail operations) dropped to 121,272 persons during the period under review as opposed to 136,384 in the same month a year ago.
