REVENUES, EMPENSES, ETC., CANADIAN NATIONAL RAILWAYS 1919 - 1934

The attached tables give a summary of the operating results of the lines constituting the Canadian National System, the data for each of the years 1913 - 1934 being comparable as far as the records of the rail ways prior to consolidation permit. It is not possible to calculate the net funded debt of the system from the individual reports and the attached tables include several revisions of the data appearing in the annual reports of the Bureau, due to items being held in suspense by the railways at the time of reporting, to the elimination of intercompany transactions, and to other readjustments necessary on account of the different accounting practices of the constituent companies prior to consolidation in 1923.

In Table 1 "Canadian Lines" include those of the Canadian Northern System, the Grand Trunk Railways of Canada, the Grand Trunk Pacific and the Canadian Government Railways, the last being composed of the Inter-colonial, Prince Edward Island, National Transcontinental, Hudson Bay and the several small railways in the eastern provinces acquired by the Canadian Government, and "United States Lines" include those lines known as the Grand Trunk New England Lines, the Grand Trunk Western, and the Duluth, Winnipeg and Pacific.

Gross revenues, operating expenses and net revenues shown in this table include those only from the steam railway operations but the deficits are for the entire system including the operating results of the Niagara, St. Catharines and Toronto railway (electric) and other railways operated separately, hotels, commercial telegraph, coastal steamship, and all other outside operations.

As the Central Vermont Railway is so closely associated with the Canadian National System, a summary of its revenues, expenses, interest charges, etc., including lines in both Canada and the United States, is given in Table 2. Of its total capital stock outstanding Dec. 31, 1924, of \$3,000,000 the Canadian National System held \$2,191,100. It also held bonds aggregating \$4,179,300, notes amounting to \$8,041,906 and other advances of \$8,274,470 or a total of \$20,495,676 out of a total

indebtedness of the Central Vermont's of \$29,153,676.

Table 3 gives analyses of the funded debt and accrued interest of the Canadian National System. The unpaid inverest on Government advances has been added each year to the principal, but no interest on the unpaid interest has been included. These advances include appropriations for the Canadian Government Railways for construction, additions and betterments, purchase of lines, etc. and for operating deficits for 1921 and subsequent years. Prior to 1921 operating deficits were provided for out of consolidated revenues of the Federal Government. Construction expenditures include the cost of the Quebec Bridge but exclude the cost of the Port Nelson terminals. Advances to the rest of the Canadian National System were to meet operating deficits, interest charges, and, with bonds issued, for additions and betterments, for the construction of new lines, and for retirement of bonds, etc. No interest has been accrued on the advances to the Canadian Government Railways but interest ranging from 32 to 6 per cent has been accrued on all other Government advances to the Canadian National System.

The principal for 1919-1924 includes \$60,833,333

Grand Thunk Guaranteed Stock which under the agreement for control became interest bearing (4 per cent) in 1920, the interest being \$1,483,813 for 1920 and \$2,433,333 for each subsequent year.

Principal for 1919 and 1920 includes the appropriations for the Canadian Government Railways for the fiscal years ended March 31, 1930 and 1931. All other amounts are as at December 31 of each year.


