

EXPRESS STATISTICS

FOR

1920.

A summary of express statistics for the year ended December 31, 1920 is given in the attabhed tables and Comparisons are made throughout with data for the calendar year 1919.

Table 1 gives the total gross earnings, operating expenses, express privileges and net operating revenue of all companies operating in Canada for 1911 to 1920 inclusive. These data are also given for 1919 and 1920 for each company in tables 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 and for all companies, showing the source of gross earnings and operating expenses in tables 9 and 10. Salaries and wages, taxes and value of financial paper issued for all the companies are given in tables 11, 12 and 13.

Table 14 gives the operating mileage for all companies showing the different class of railways, boat line etc., over which the companies operate, the total mileage by provinces and the mileage operated by each company. The mileage shown opposite "Miscellaneous" in the first part of this table is made up almost entirely of ocean steam ship lines.

Tables 2, 3 and 15 give data for 1920 only, on the capital of the Canadian companies the investments in Canada of all companies operating in Canada and the number of offices of these companies.

The gross earnings showed an increase hgf \$5,579,285 or 22 per cent, the express privileges, which is, portion of the earnings payable to the railways for carrying the express, increased \$3,072,845 or over 23 per cent. The operating expenses increased \$2,893,228 or about 22 per cent so that the net operating revenue showed a larger deficit than for the previous year, namely a deficit of \$1,617,836 against \$1,231,048 for 1919. The greater portion of the increase in operating expenses was in salaries and wages, which increased \$2,427,911 or about 26 per cent. The money orders etc. show an increase of \$15,890,482 or 20 per cent while the offices selling these decreased from 7,821 to 7,542.
