STATISTIQUE DES MESSAGERIES

1936

The following tables show the financial and operating statistics of the express companies in Canada for 1936. The Canadian Pacific Express Company is a subsidiary company of the Canadian Pacific Railway and handles the express business of the parent company. The express business of the Canadian National System and the Northern Alberta Railways is handled by a department of the railways, but the accounts are kept separate and the data are included in this report. The Railway Express Agency operates mainly over the Canadian sections of United States railways. Thus there were only two express companies and two express departments of railways carrying on express business in Canada.

Combined gross earnings of all companies increased from \$16,592,746 in 1935 to \$17,169,315 and operating expenses from \$8,960,675 to \$9,414,746. Taxes were increased from \$174,212 to \$204,911. Money orders, travellers' cheques and other financial paper issued amounted to \$63,548,920 as against \$54,829,082 in 1935, the value of travellers' cheques, both domestic and foreign being more than doubled. The railway mileage over which express service was maintained was reduced but the motor carrier mileage increased from 744 to 862 miles. Employees increased from 4,126 to 4,293 and total salaries and wages, including commission and part-time wages, increased from \$6,607,736 to \$6,962,413.

Les tableaux qui suivent montrent les statistiques des opérations des compagnies de messagerie au Canada en 1936. La Compagnie Canadian Pacific Express est une filiale du chemin de fer Canadien Pacifique et elle s'occupe de toutes les opérations de messagerie de la compagnie mère. Les opérations de messagerie du Canadian National et du Northern Alberta sont conduites par des services spéciaux de ces chemins de fer, mais les comptes en sont tenus séparément et les données en sont incluses dans le présent rapport. La Railway Express Agency s'occupe des opérations de messagerie au Canada des chemins de fer des Etats-Unis. Il n'y a donc que deux compagnies de messagerie et deux départements de messagerie attachés à des chemins de fer poursuivant au Canada des entreprises de messagerie.

Les revenus bruts combinés de toutes les compagnies ont avancé de \$16,592,746 en 1935 à \$17,169,315, et les frais d'exploitation, de \$8,960,675 à \$9,414,746. Les taxes augmentent de \$174,212 à \$204,911. Les mandats payables et les chèques de voyageur et autres effets de commerce émis donnent un total de \$63,548,920 comparative-ment à \$54,829,082 en 1935, la valeur des chèques de voyage, domestiques et étrangers, a plus que doublé. Le parcours des chemins de fer donnant un service de messagerie a diminué mais le parcours par véhicules moteurs a augmenté de 744 à 862 milles. Le nombre d'employés a monté de 4,126 à 4,293 et les salaires et gages, y compris les commissions et les gages aux employés à temps partiel, ont augmenté de \$6,607,736 à \$6,962,413.
