



**STATISTIQUE DES MESSAGERIES**

1939

The following tables show the financial and operating statistics of the express companies in Canada for 1938. The Canadian Pacific Express Company is a subsidiary company of the Canadian Pacific Railway and handles the express business of the parent company. The express business of the Canadian National System and the Northern Alberta Railways is handled by a department of the railways, but the accounts are kept separate and the data are included in this report. The Railway Express Agency operates mainly over the Canadian sections of United States railways. Thus there were only two express companies and two express departments of railways carrying on express business in Canada.

Gross earnings of all companies increased from \$17,674,477 in 1938 to \$19,410,091 in 1939, operating expenses increased by only \$297,607, and net operating revenues increased by \$541,916, or from a debit of \$67,979 in 1938 to a credit of \$475,937. Money orders, travellers' cheques, and other financial paper issued amounted to \$67,057,633 in 1939 as against \$68,176,592 in 1938, a decrease of \$1,118,959.

Total mileage operated increased by 566, most of the increase (355 miles) being in steam boat lines on which express service was maintained. Mileage by motor carrier increased by 71 miles while other agencies showed little change.

The number of employees increased from 4,678 in 1938 to 4,737 and total salaries and wages, including commissions and part-time wages, increased from \$7,222,887 to \$7,412,500.

Les statistiques financières et d'opération des compagnies de messageries au Canada en 1939 paraissent dans les tableaux suivants. La Canadian Pacific Express Company est une compagnie subsidiaire du Canadien Pacifique et s'occupe des messageries de la compagnie-mère. Les messageries du réseau du Canadien National et des Northern Alberta Railways sont sous les soins d'un département de ces chemins de fer, mais les comptes en sont séparés et les données en sont comprises dans ce rapport. La Railway Express Agency opère surtout sur les sections canadiennes des chemins de fer des Etats-Unis. Il y a donc seulement deux compagnies de messageries et deux départements de messageries de chemin de fer s'occupant des messageries au Canada.

Les recettes brutes de toutes les compagnies augmentent de \$17,674,477 en 1938 à \$19,410,091 en 1939, les dépenses d'opération ne montent que de \$297,607, et le revenu net d'opération avance de \$541,937, soit d'un débit de \$67,979 en 1938 à un crédit de \$475,937. Les mandats circulaires, chèques de voyageurs et autres formes de transferts de fonds s'élèvent à \$67,057,633 en 1939 contre \$68,176,592 en 1938, diminution de \$1,118,959.

Le parcours global augmente de 566 milles; la plus grande partie de l'augmentation (355 milles) se produit dans les lignes de bateaux à vapeur qui font le service des messageries. Le millage par voitures automobiles augmente de 71 milles quand que les autres agences présentent peu de changement.

Le personnel augmente de 4,678 en 1938 à 4,737 et les salaires et gages, y compris les commissions et gages pour travail à temps partiel, passent de \$7,222,887 à \$7,412,500.




