





STATISTIQUE DES MESSAGERIES

1941

The following tables show the financial and operating statistics of the express companies in Canada for 1941. The Canadian Pacific Express Company is a subsidiary company of the Canadian Pacific Railway and handles the express business of the parent company. The express business of the Canadian National System and the Northern Alberta Railways is handled by a department of the railways, but the accounts are kept separate and the data are included in this report. The Railway Express Agency operates mainly over the Canadian sections of United States railways. Thus there were only two express companies and two express departments of railways carrying on express business in Canada.

Gross earnings of all companies dropped from \$26,067,019 in 1940 to \$22,953,227 in 1941, a decrease of \$3,153,792. The Canadian National advised a large factor in their decrease was a decline in gold shipments which were exceptionally heavy in 1940. Operating expenses increased from \$11,095,071 to \$12,202,191 and the net operating revenue dropped from \$2,521,674 in 1940 to \$617,818. Money orders, travellers' cheques, and other financial paper issued amounted to \$79,420,537, an increase over 1940 of \$1,546,652.

Mileage operated by motor truck and over steam railways decreased by 585 and 120 miles respectively, while the mileage operated over air lines increased by 227. Due to war conditions the ocean mileage decreased by 11,548, the total mileage operated being down by 16,989.

Full-time employees numbered 5,084 as against 4,843 in 1940, and the total salaries and wages including commissions and part-time wages amounted to \$8,451,872 as against \$7,672,761 in 1940.

Les statistiques financières et d'opération des compagnies de messageries au Canada en 1941 paraissent dans les tableaux suivants. La Canadian Pacific Express Company est une compagnie subsidiaire du Canadien Pacifique et s'occupe des messageries de la compagnie-mère. Les messageries du réseau du Canadien National et des Northern Alberta Railways sont sous les soins d'un département de ces chemins de fer, mais les comptes en sont séparés et les données en sont comprises dans ce rapport. La Railway Express Agency opère surtout sur les sections canadiennes des chemins de fer des Etats-Unis. Il y a donc seulement deux compagnies de messageries et deux départements de messageries de chemin de fer s'occupant des messageries au Canada.

Les recettes brutes de toutes les compagnies tombent de \$26,067,019 en 1940 à \$22,953,227 en 1941, diminution de \$3,153,792. Le Canadien National fait savoir que le déclin des expéditions d'or, exceptionnellement volumineuses en 1940, a fortement contribué à cette diminution. Les frais d'exploitation augmentent de \$11,095,071 à \$12,202,191 et les recettes nettes diminuent de \$2,521,674 en 1940 à \$617,818. Les mandats-poste, chèques de voyage et autres effets de finance émis s'élèvent à \$79,420,537, augmentation de \$1,546,652 dur 1940.

Les distances parcourues par les camions et les chemins de fer de surface diminuent de 585 et 120 milles respectivement tandis que celles parcourues par la voie des airs augmentent de 227. En raison de la guerre, le millage océanique diminue de 11,548, et le millage global parcouru baisse de 16,989 milles.

Les employés à temps continu sont au nombre de 5,084 comparativement à 4,843 en 1940, et le total des salaires et gages y compris les commissions et les gages à temps partiel s'élèvent à \$8,451,872 en regard de \$7,672,761 en 1940.
