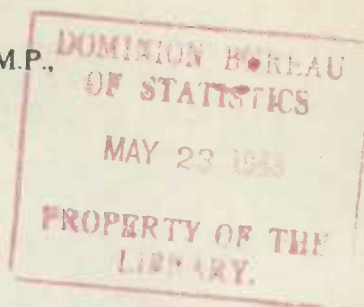

STATISTIQUE DES MESSAGERIES

1942

The following tables show the financial and operating statistics of the express companies in Canada for 1942. The Canadian Pacific Express Company is a subsidiary company of the Canadian Pacific Railway and handles the express business of the parent company. The express business of the Canadian National System and the Northern Alberta Railways is handled by a department of the railways, but the accounts are kept separate and the data are included in this report. The Railway Express Agency operates mainly over the Canadian sections of United States railways. Thus there were only two express companies and two express departments of railways carrying on express business in Canada.

Gross earnings of all companies amounted to \$25,725,512 as compared with \$22,953,227 in 1941, an increase of \$2,792,285. Operating expenses increased from \$12,202,191 to \$15,391,508 and the net operating revenue increased from \$617,818 in 1941 to \$945,527. Money orders, travellers' cheques, and other financial paper issued amounted to \$95,158,055 in 1942, an increase of \$13,717,518 over 1941. Provincial taxes were reduced due to the agreement with the Federal Government whereby the provinces ceased taxing income. The Dominion taxes did not show corresponding increases because the Federal tax was assessed on the incomes of the railways. The increase in the Dominion tax against the express operations was mainly unemployment insurance taxes, which became effective on July 1, 1941, and consequently covered only half a year in 1941 as against a full year in 1942.

Mileage operated showed a decrease of 554.9, amounting to only 52,824.43 as compared with 53,359.33 in 1941. Mileage operated over steam railways showed an increase of 91.9 miles, but mileage operated over steamboat lines, by motor truck and by aircraft decreased by 590.0, 29.8 and 7 miles respectively.

Full-time employees numbered 5,296 as against 5,084 in 1941, while total salaries and wages, including commissions and part-time wages, amounted to \$9,417,112 against \$8,451,872 in 1941.

Les tableaux suivants montrent les statistiques des finances et des opérations des compagnies de messageries au Canada en 1942. La Canadian Pacific Express Company, filiale du Canadien Pacifique, fait le service des messageries de la compagnie mère. Le service des messageries du Canadien National et des Northern Alberta Railways est fait par un département du chemin de fer, mais les comptes sont tenus séparément et ce rapport en donne le contenu. La Railway Express Agency opère principalement dans les sections canadiennes des chemins de fer américains. Il n'y a donc s'occupant des messageries au Canada que deux compagnies distinctes et deux départements de chemins de fer.

Les recettes brutes de toutes les compagnies sont de \$25,725,512 contre \$22,953,227 en 1941, augmentation de \$2,792,285. Les dépenses d'exploitation augmentent de \$12,202,191 à \$15,391,508 et le revenu net d'exploitation, de \$617,818 en 1941 à \$945,527. Les mandats circulaires, les chèques de voyage et autres formes de virements de fonds s'élevèrent à \$95,158,055 en 1942, hausse de \$13,717,518 sur 1941. Les taxes provinciales sont réduites à cause d'une entente avec le Gouvernement fédéral par laquelle les provinces cessent de taxer le revenu. Les taxes fédérales n'augmentent pas en proportion parce que la taxe fédérale est prélevée sur le revenu des chemins de fer. L'augmentation de la taxe sur les opérations des messageries comprend principalement les taxes d'assurance-chômage, en vigueur depuis le 1er juillet 1941, et ne couvrant par conséquent que la moitié de l'année en 1941 et toute l'année en 1942.

Le millage exploité diminua de 554.9, n'étant que de 52,824.43 contre 53,359.33 en 1941. Le millage par chemins de fer augmenta de 91.9 milles, mais le millage par bateaux, camions, et avions diminua de 590.0, 29.8 et 7 milles respectivement.

Les employés à temps entier se chiffrent à 5,296 contre 5,084, tandis que les salaires et gages, y compris commissions et gages à temps partiel, s'élevèrent à \$9,417,112 contre \$8,451,872 en 1941.

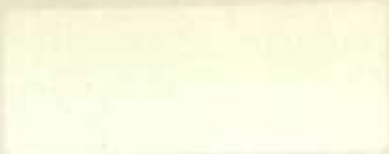
