MONTHLY RAILWAY TRAFFIC REPORTS
FOR
YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 1936.

The data in the following tables include only revenue freight carried by the Canadian railways and not the "on company service" freight which includes coal for locomotives, ties, ballast and other railway material. These data will consequently not check with data on imports although this freight will not affect the exports. Freight interchanged between Canadian roads is not duplicated in these tables, but freight unloaded and subsequently reshipped is counted each time it is billed out. Foreign connections include railways in the United States and boats cleared for, or entered from, foreign ports, and in this report all freight moved to ports on export rates has been shown as delivered to foreign connections. Although the railways report all grain delivered to the elevators at the head of the lakes as unloaded at stations in Canada and all grain received from the lake elevators as loaded at billing stations, the reports have been corrected from the elevator returns to show the deliveries to and receipts from foreign connections. Grain delivered to elevators at Montreal, Vancouver, and other ocean ports for export has been shown as delivered to foreign connections and adjustments have been made for grain taken out of these elevators for local consumption. Freight carried to ports on local rates has been reported as unloaded at stations although it might subsequently be exported by water routes. Grain unloaded at the elevators at the head of the lakes and later forwarded to Montreal by boat is reported as unloaded at stations in Ontario and does not again enter into the railway records, and consequently affects the net imports into the province. Also western grain ground in Ontario will increase the imports of grain since it is reported out as flour. Other provinces are similarly affected but to a less degree.

These data cover only railway revenue freight and the differences between column 1, freight loaded, and column 6, freight unloaded, are the net imports and exports by rail into and out of the respective provinces. If the loadings exceed the unloadings the data show a net export and if the unloadings exceed the loadings the excess is an import, irrespective of how often the same freight is loaded or unloaded. Except for freight handled by water, these data give a very complete picture of the movement of freight in Canada, and, in the Prairie Provinces where practically all freight is handled by rail, the net imports and exports cover all imports and exports into and out of these provinces.

A commodity may be imported and exported in another form such as wheat and flour, pulpwood and paper, etc., so that the net imports might be exported as other commodities.

Railways crossing the United States border consider their lines in the United States as foreign connections and show freight coming into Canada as received from foreign connections and freight crossing into the United States as freight delivered to foreign connections. Freight delivered to foreign connections includes exports from Canada and also in-transit freight which has been received from foreign connections, rail and water, destined to foreign points and which is shown in column 3. This in-transit traffic is heaviest between Detroit and St. Claire river gateways and the Niagara river gateways. There is also a considerable traffic from the western states through to Quebec ports and a lesser amount from the Pacific coast.

Since September, 1935, revenue freight loaded and received from connections has shown increases over freight for the corresponding month of the previous year. These increases reached a peak at 1,266,915 tons in September, 1936, due largely to an early and heavy movement of western wheat and other grains. Wheat shipments, however, fell off rapidly and showed large decreases in October, November and December and at the close of the year there was only 36,561,000 bushels in elevators in the Prairie Provinces, as against 103,903,000 bushels at the close of 1935. The early gains in wheat more than offset the losses during the last three months and the total for the year was 129,898 tons heavier than in 1935. Corn, barley, flour and other mill products were considerably heavier than in 1935 and the total of agricultural products was 8.2 per cent heavier. Animal products were heavier by 219,877 tons, or 10 per cent, and mine products increased by 2,704,266 tons, or 11.2 per cent. Anthracite coal was heavier than in 1935 by 121,095 tons, or 4.6 per cent, and bituminous coal by 786,137 tons, or 8.5 per cent. Other ores and concentrates were heavier by 642,681 tons, or 30.4 per cent, base bullion by 134,524 tons, or 16.0 per cent, sand and gravel by 110,450 tons, or 9.6 per cent, and crushed stone by 492,225 tons, or 85.3 per cent. Forest products increased by 55,070 tons, or 0.7 per cent, the increase in lumber, timber, box, crate and cooperage material of 380,813 tons being almost offset by decreases in other commodities. Manufactures and miscellaneous freight increased from 18,757,815 tons in 1935 to 21,127,658 tons, or by 2,369,843 tons or 12.6 per cent. All commodities in this group except household goods and settlers' effects showed increases, the larger increases being- iron and steel, 263,260 tons, or 28.0 per cent; cement, 101,277 tons, or 23.5 per cent; newsprint paper, 312,372 tons, or 16.6 per cent; wood pulp, 107,176 tons, or 12.4 per cent; and fertilizers, 100,205 tons, or 19.4 per cent.

On pages 24-27 are two tables, one for the three Maritime Provinces and one for the four western provinces. The net exports and imports from and to these areas are the differences between loadings and unloadings, but the net movement to and from other provinces is the difference between freight originated, including loadings and receipt from foreign connections, and freight terminated, including freight unloaded and delivered to foreign connections. If the freight originated in the Maritime Provinces exceeded the freight terminated the difference must have been carried westward, either for unloading in the other provinces or for delivery to foreign connections at a junction point in Quebec or provinces west. Also, if the terminated freight exceeded the originated, the difference came in across the Quebec boundary.

The export movement of wheat through the Maritime Provinces increased from 273,747 tons, or 9,122,900 bushels, delivered to foreign connections in 1935 to 374,983 tons, or 12,499,000 bushels, in 1936. Foreign corn imported amounted to 22,764 tons, of which 8,753 tons moved westward out of the provinces. The westward movement of potatoes was 153,003 tons and of apples, 5,938 tons, whereas 55,990 tons were delivered to foreign connections and other fresh fruit shipped westward, mostly imports, amounted to 25,136 tons. Bituminous coal loaded amounted to 5,484,259 tons and 5,018,107 tons were unloaded, the greater part of which was undoubtedly forwarded by water. The greater part of lumber, timber, etc., loaded in these provinces was for export, 301,062 tons being delivered to foreign connections. 50,914 tons of wood pulp were shipped westward and 41,771 tons were delivered to foreign connections.

Total freight loaded in the four western provinces during the year amounted to 20,978,399 tons, of which 10,085,503 tons, or 48 per cent, was agricultural products and 7,217,628 tons, or over 34 per cent, was wheat. The next largest tonnage was lignite coal, 2,736,784 tons, followed by lumber, timber, box, crate and cooperage material, 1,005,538 tons. The net movement from these provinces is eastward, particularly for agricultural and animal products.

A greater tonnage of mine and forest products was delivered to foreign connections, principally at British Columbia ports, than moved eastward and there was a net import into these provinces of 528,004 tons of manufactures and miscellaneous freight. Compared with 1935, loadings of wheat decreased by 331,377 tons, or 11,045,900 bushels, but barley increased from 297,618 to 716,172 tons, or by 418,554 tons. Live stock and dressed meats showed substantial increases, bituminous and lignite coal loadings increased by 18,869 tons and 152,858 tons respectively, base bullion loadings were heavier by 24,589 tons, pulpwood, almost entirely in Manitoba, increased by 28,349 tons, lumber, timber, box, crate and cooperage material by 51,864 tons, fertilizers by 24,032 tons, newsprint paper by 29,499 tons and wood pulp by 10,191 tons.

All weights quoted are in tons of 2,000 pounds.
