#### Review of 1949 Traffic

Canadian railways reporting monthly carried a total of 141,866,983 tons of revenue freight during 1949 compared with the record of 154,732,409 tons in 1948, 152,705,372 tons in 1947 and 138,526,856 tons in 1946. The total for 1939 was only 84,179,821 tons, indicating a gain of nearly 70 p.c. for the year under review over the 1939 traffic. This is indeed a noteworthy growth within a decade in the tonnage of revenue freight transported by rail. However, the decrease in 1949 from 1948 was 12,865,426 tons or 8.3 p.c., a considerable portion of which was caused by the coal strikes and other labour trouble in the United States.

Receipts from foreign connections dropped over 7,974,000 tons to 33,922,131 tons or by 19 p.c.

Imports by rail for domestic use in Canada declined from a 1948 total of 22,932,262 tons to 18,341,221 tons in 1949, while intransit freight eased from 18,964,153 to 15,580,910 tons.

Of total freight terminated during the year nearly 74 p.c. was delivered to stations in Canada and 26 p.c. to foreign connections.

Comparison with the volume of revenue freight carried on Class 1 Railroads in the United States during 1949 shows a decline of 19 p.c. in their volume from that carried in 1948 against the above mentioned decrease of 8.3 p.c. in the Canadian experience.

#### Canadian Loadings

The tonnage of revenue freight loaded at Canadian stations during 1949 totalled 107,944,852 tons compared with the record of 112,835,994 tons established in 1948, and 109,069,107 tons in 1947. The decrease from 1948 was thus 4.3 p.c. or 4,891,142 tons, but in 1939 only 62,790,592 tons had been shipped from Canadian stations. The industrial progress of the nation within the decade has been truly remarkable as measured by the volume of products carried by rail from points in Canada. In addition, keener competition is experienced from motor trucks which now number over 550,000 of all kinds as against some 232,000 in 1939.

Comparisons with 1939 show 17,009,000 tons of Agricultural Products loaded in that year against 23,473,000 tons during 1949, Animal Products up from 1,171,000 to 1,603,000 tons, Mine Products at 37,500,000 against 23,407,000 tons ten years earlier, Forest Products with 13,997,000 tons in 1949 compared with 7,405,037 tons, and Manufactures and Miscellaneous climbing from 13,798,000 tons loaded in 1939 to 31,371,000 tons, with spectacular gains in

gasoline and oils, pig iron, rails, iron and steel, cement, building products, implements and autos, fertilizers, newsprint double 1939 to 3,474,000 tons, woodpulp at 1,612,000 tons compared with 767,800 tons for 1939, and other manufactures and miscellaneous up from 3,282,000 to nearly 7,587,000 tons. Even L.C.L. merchandise rose from 1,670,000 to 2,874,000 tons. The population of the nine provinces increased only 17.2 p.c. from 1939 to 1949 so that Canadian production has advanced most encouragingly. In 1939 only 5.6 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada per capita of population whereas by 1948 this average had risen to 8.76 tons and was 8.2 tons for 1949. Only two of the nine provinces, Saskatchewan and Alberta, registered heavier loadings than in 1948, while Prince Edward Island and Manitoba volume was nearly maintained. New Brunswick was down 946,598 tons or 20.8 p.c., Quebec 12.8 p.c., Ontario 5.3 p.c., while a minor recession of 92,664 tons or 1 p.c. was indicated for British Columbia.

Analyzed by commodity groups, loadings during the year improved over 1948 in agricultural products up from 22,371,591 to 23,473,160 tons due to heavier wheat shipments, while mine products rose slightly at 37,500,407 against 37,493,441 tons. Animal and animal products declined 314,359 tons to 1,603,074, while forest products dropped from 17,971,400 to 13,997,031 tons. The Manufactures and Miscellaneous group totalled 31,371,180 tons, off 5.2 p.c. or 1,710,949 tons from the 1948 volume.

Wheat loaded during the year totalled 12,478,821 tons against 10,686,125 tons in 1948, a gain of 16.8 p.c. Corn rose from 97,585 to 286,683 tons, while oats, rye and other grains also improved, as did cotton, fresh fruit and potatoes. Declines were shown in barley, flaxseed, flour, other mill products, hay and straw, fresh vegetables and other agricultural products. Flaxseed dropped from 535,665 to 260,698 tons.

All commodities in the animal group except cheese and other edible packing house products, were lower for 1949. Live stock dropped nearly 100,000 tons to 665,604 while hogs eased from 250,825 to 220,024 tons. Meats were much lighter as were butter and eggs.

Gains and losses were nearly balanced in the mine products group. Increases in anthracite and lignite coal, iron ore up from 1,358,547 to 1,987,369 tons, copper ore, crude petroleum up spectacularly from 685,342 to 1,609,705 tons and slate and asphalt contrasted with lighter movements of bituminous and sub-bituminous coal, coke, bullion, stone, sand and gravel, salt and other mine products. Sand and gravel dropped from 3,331,608 to 2,879,892 tons while stone was down 401,222 tons to 2,505,259.

Forest products were reduced in all items with the total off 3,974,369 tons at 13,997,031. Pulpwood declined from 8,758,548 to 6,081,186 tons and lumber from 6,608,898 to 5,741,356 tons.

Among manufactures and miscellaneous decreases were general, although gasoline, rails, cement, lime and plaster and agricultural implements resisted the decline. Heaviest recession was indicated in iron and steel off from 1,538,992 to 1,400,091 tons, brick and artificial stone, beverages, newsprint, woodpulp off from 2,090,256 to 1,612,150 tons, canned goods, and other manufactures. L.C.L. merchandise dropped 11.5 p.c. from 1948 at 2,874,057 tons.

#### Foreign Receipts

An examination of foreign receipts for Canadian consumption indicates reduced imports of animal products and mine products. Live stock, wool and other animal products were down from 1948 but hides and leather were up from 11,397 to 24,810 tons. The decrease in coal receipts was sharp with anthracite off from 4,939,243 to 3,611,256 tons and bituminous down from 6,933,387 to 4,664,752 tons. Crude petroleum rail imports sagged from 773,855 in 1948 to 138,723 tons as Alberta output boomed during 1949. The peak was reached in 1947 when 1,100,008 tons of crude were received by rail. Receipts of foreign lumber, timber, etc., rose from 111,036 tons in 1948 to 161,194 tons during 1949. Among manufactures, gasoline imports were down at 57,860 tons against 122,291 tons one year earlier, but sugar, pig iron, iron and steel, cement, implements, autos and parts, paperboard, canned goods were among those items entered in greater volume. Other manufactures and miscellaneous and L.C.L. receipts were lighter.

#### Inter-Regional Movement

On pages 26 - 29 two tables are published, one for the three Maritime Provinces and one for the four Western Provinces. The net exports and imports from and to these areas are the differences between loadings and unloadings, but the net movement to and from other provinces is the difference between freight originated, including loadings and receipts from foreign connections and freight terminated, including freight unloaded and delivered to foreign connections. If the freight originated in the Maritime Provinces exceeded the freight terminated, the difference must have been carried westward, either for unloading in the other provinces or for delivery to foreign connections at a junction point in Quebec or provinces west. Also, if the terminated freight exceeded the originated, the difference came in across the Quebec boundary. The figures are essential to any appraisal of the impact of changes in the freight rate structure affecting these economic areas.

#### The Maritimes - Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick

The net movement eastward of wheat into the Maritimes increased over 1948 with a net of 693,770 tons compared with 637,471 tons one year earlier, but flour declined from 477,953 to 557,804 tons. Outward shipments of potatoes were 407,186 tons compared with a revised 449,913 tons in 1948, while apples sent to westward by rail totalled a net of 1,795 tons as against 9,237 in 1948. The area showed a sizeable inflow of dressed meats, eggs and cheese for consumption. The net movement of bituminous coal westward totalled some 553,400 tons, while 41,243 tons of salt moved to Upper Canada. Base bullion moved into the Maritimes to a net of 116,082 tons as against 142,089 tons in 1948, while 38,097 tons of crushed stone were brought in. Sugar moved westward was up from 175,310 tons in the preceding year to 188,734 tons, while newsprint and paperboard increased. Total loadings for the area were 13,706,024 tons compared with 15,326,028 tons in 1948, down 10.1 p.c. Bituminous coal loadings were off slightly, but forest products were down from 3,275,557 to 2,121,177 tons for the region. Agricultural loadings rose over 1948 by some 57,000 tons to 661,728 for the year.

#### Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia

The net movement of freight from this area eastward during 1949 was 10,008,043 tons against 9,151,682 tons in 1948, an increase of 856,361 tons or over 9 p.c., while total loadings for the year aggregated 39,381,974 tons compared with 37,975,329 tons one year earlier.

The wheat movement eastward rose 1,016,125 tons to 6,184,380, while oats and rye improved. Flaxseed, flour, other mill products, apples and other agricultural products were down considerably. Flour dropped from 440,065 to 335,652 tons and mill products receded from 500,776 to 358,329 tons. Animals and animal products were down 83,215 tons to 291,811 tons and the net eastward flow of mine products advanced from 137,884 tons in 1948 to 531,101 tons with a much heavier coal movement. Forest products declined to 1,151,347 tons from 1,412,875 tons as less pulpwood, lumber and timber moved eastward. The manufactures group showed the traditional inflow to the area at 1,925,815 tons compared with 1,874,277 tons in 1948. The principal gains were in receipts of gasoline, iron and steel, agricultural implements, automobiles, newsprint, canned goods and miscellaneous. The eastward movement of cement, lime and plaster, wood pulp and fish was increased while fertilizers were lower.

Net exports from the area were 13,510,682 tons compared with 12,298,793 tons in 1948, a betterment of 9.85 p.c.

#### Description of Coverage

The data in the following tables include only revenue freight carried by the Canadian railways and not the "on company service" freight which includes coal for locomotives, ties, ballast and other railway material. These data will consequently not check with data on imports although this freight will not affect the exports. Freight interchanged between Canadian roads is not duplicated in these tables, but freight unloaded and subsequently reshipped is counted each time it is billed out. Foreign connections include railways in the United States and boats cleared for, or entered from, foreign ports, and in this report all freight moved to ports on export rates has been shown as delivered to foreign connections. Although the railways report all grain delivered to the elevators at the head of the lakes as unloaded at stations in Canada and all grain received from the lake elevators as loaded at billing stations, the reports have been corrected from the elevator returns to show the deliveries to and receipts from foreign connections. Grain delivered to elevators at Montreal, Vancouver, and other ocean ports for export has been shown as delivered to foreign connections and adjustments have been made for grain taken out of these elevators for local consumption. Freight carried to ports on local rates has been reported as unloaded at stations although it might subsequently be exported by water routes. Grain unloaded at the elevators at the head of the lakes and later forwarded to Montreal by boat is reported as unloaded at stations in Ontario and does not again enter into the railway records. and consequently affects the net imports into the province. Also, western grain ground in Ontario will increase the imports of grain since it is reported out as flour. Data for other provinces are similarly affected but to a lesser degree.

These data cover only railway revenue freight and the differences between column 1, "freight loaded", and column 6, "freight unloaded", are the net imports and exports by rail into and out of the respective provinces. If the loadings exceed the unloadings the data show a net export and if the unloadings exceed the loadings the excess is an import, irrespective of how often the same freight is loaded or unloaded. Except for freight handled by water or highway, these data give a very complete picture of the movement of freight in Canada, and in the Prairie Provinces, where a relatively larger portion of freight is handled by rail, the net imports and exports cover almost all imports and exports into and out of these provinces.

A commodity may be imported into a province in one form and exported in another form such as wheat and flour, pulpwood and paper, leather and shoes, etc., so that the net imports might be exported as other commodities.

Railways crossing the United States border consider their lines in the United States as foreign connections and show freight coming into Canada as received from foreign connections and freight crossing into the United States as freight delivered to foreign connections. Freight delivered to foreign connections includes exports from Canada and also intransit freight which has been received from foreign connections, rail and water, destined to foreign points, and this is shown in column 5. This in-transit traffic is heaviest between Detroit and St. Clair River gateways and the Niagara River gateways. There is also a considerable traffic from the western states through to Quebec ports and a lesser amount from the Pacific coast.
