


Traffic during 1950

The principal Canadian railroads reporting monthly to the Bureau carried a total of 144,030,623 tons of revenue freight during the year 1950, an increase of 1,406,139 tons or about 1 p.c. over the revised total for 1949 at 142,624,484 tons, including Newfoundland. The 1950 total compares with the peacetime peak of 154,732,409 tons for 1948, which year did not experience a 9-day general rail strike. Tonnage carried in 1940 amounted to 97,531,134 tons and the advance in the decade was thus almost 48 p.c. Due mainly to a lighter movement of grain and the strike, loadings at stations in Canada were down to 108,195,001 tons compared with a revised total of 108,700,665 tons in 1949. However, receipts from foreign connections for domestic consumption advanced from 18,342,909 to 19,173,579 tons and intransit freight recovered from 15,580,910 in 1949 to 16,662,043 tons in the year under review. The increase in total foreign receipts was thus 1,911,803 tons or 5.6 p.c. The volume of revenue freight transported by the principal lines in the United States during 1950 improved some 11.6 p.c. over that for 1949, while freight revenue rose 10.9 p.c. in the same comparison. Canadian railways reported a gain of 8.7 p.c. in freight revenues with an increase of only 1 p.c. in volume. Rate increases, granted in Canada, caused the variation.

The following table shows the trend since 1938 of the average revenue per ton mile for the major railways in Canada compared with similar data for Class 1 railways in the United States and for the British railways. No corrections have been made for currency differentials. The British average is given in pence. Tons are 2,000 pounds.

Note: United States rates are now up an additional 3.8 p.c. over 1938 (Ex Parte No. 175, April 4, 1951) while a British rate increase under consideration involves a further 18 p.c. increase over 1938, which would practically double pre-war rates. Canadian lines are asking a 14-15 p.c. increase, with decision now pending. A 5 p.c. application was filed in December last on which judgment has been reserved.

Quick, dependable, all-weather freight service is the backbone of Canadian transportation, the mainspring of our trade and commerce. The year 1951 promises to go down in history as a record breaker for Canadian railways. The trend is strongly upward in traffic, carloadings, revenues, expenses and utilization of equipment. Trade with the United States is very active and intransit traffic heavy on American short cut lines across Southern Ontario.

Loadings in Canada during 1950

The tonnage of revenue freight loaded at stations in Canada during 1950 declined slightly from the volume reported for 1949, the totals being 108,195,001 tons and 108,700,665 tons respectively. The former aggregate compares with the record of 112,835,994 tons established during 1948 when the movement of grain, livestock, coal, pulpwood, miscellaneous manufactures and other products was heavier. However, in 1940 loadings in Canada were some 72,946,500 tons and the increase registered in 1950 was thus 35,248,501 tons or over 48 p.c. Industrial progress, as measured by the volume of goods carried by rail, has been most encouraging within the decade. In addition, keener competition is in evidence today from motor trucks, pipelines and lake carriers. Motor trucks now number well over 600,000 of all types compared with 248,000 registered in 1940, an advance of 142 p.c. For hire motor transport is now a highly organised business, offering national and international service. Air freight is as yet of relatively minor competitive importance in Canada and brings service to remote or isolated areas. Some 20,800 revenue tons were carried by air during 1950 while highway transport carriers moved probably well over 21 million tons. In the decade, the population of Canada increased about 21.5 p.c., including the addition of Newfoundland, while a 48 p.c. increase was shown in revenue freight loaded in Canada, indicating a much

higher per capita output of goods. On a per capita basis, 6.41 tons were shipped by rail during 1949, a war year, which increased in 1950 to 7.82 tons.

Comparison with 1949 loadings shows gains in Nova Scotia, up from 9,770,290 to 10,208,321 tons, New Brunswick slightly heavier at 3,661,704 tons, Quebec advancing 936,222 tons over 1949 to 18,521,675 tons, and British Columbia volume up from 9,295,214 to 9,895,058 tons, or by 6.5 p.c. Loading at Ontario stations declined 411,818 tons to 36,859,583 tons, while the Prairie provinces were all reduced due to lighter grain movements. The Manitoba total receded 776,210 tons to 6,202,835, Saskatchewan dropped 835,754 tons from 1949 to 9,244,746 and Alberta tonnage totalled 12,365,162 or 662,053 tons under the previous year.

Analyzed by commodity groupings, Canadian loadings during 1950 improved in Mine Products at 40,502,099 tons against 37,674,545 tons one year earlier, with coal and iron ore up, Forest Products increased from 14,385,869 to 14,619,771 tons due to heavier lumber shipments, and in Manufactures and Miscellaneous which totalled 32,008,872 tons, a gain of 449,077 tons with oils, autos, newsprint and woodpulp featured. Agricultural Products loaded, due to reductions in grain, were nearly 3,872,000 tons lighter at 19,604,440 tons while the Animals and Animal Products group declined from 1,604,295 to 1,459,819 tons with livestock down considerably from 1949.

Premature frosts played havoc with a most promising grain harvest in western Canada and reduced the volume of export grades particularly. Wheat loadings declined from nearly 12,479,000 tons in 1949 to 9,821,000 tons during 1950. Corn, oats, barley, rye and flaxseed shipments were also down sharply. Other grain and flour declined slightly while other mill products increased nearly 80,000 tons to 1,750,542 tons. Apple loadings registered an advance from 217,438 to 242,233 tons but other fresh fruits were much lighter, off from 97,611 tons in 1949 to 42,635 tons. Potatoes and vegetables decreased while other agricultural products increased 199,308 tons to 1,159,957 tons. Horses loaded weighed 63,135 tons against 42,176 tons one year earlier but livestock dropped 79,261 tons to 586,383 tons, or by 12 p.c. Sheep, hogs, dressed meats and poultry, eggs, and cheese were lighter as were wool and hides.

Gains predominated in the mine products group. All coals and coke were heavier with domestic bituminous up from 9,238,627 to 9,684,333 tons. Iron ore increased 1,085,626 tons to 3,073,020 tons. Copper and other ores were down but base bullion improved. Sand and gravel advanced some 416,000 tons to 3,322,946 tons. Crude petroleum totalled 1,777,054 tons against 1,609,744 tons one year earlier. This is likely the peak as diversions to pipe lines have sharply reduced rail shipments since mid-October last. Salt and other mine products posted good gains over 1949.

Among forestry items, lumber loadings increased from 5,636,585 to 6,980,022 tons and offset lighter movements in logs, cordwood and pulpwood which dropped by 1,013,805 tons to 5,429,998 tons. Plywood gained while other forest products were down.

The Manufactures and Miscellaneous group shows 13 increases over 1949 and 12 declines with the total up 1.4 p.c., or 449,077 tons. Petroleum oils and products advanced from 2,113,998 to 2,489,075 tons. Pig iron was up 36,517 over 1949 to 779,710 tons. Castings, brick, lime and plaster, and sewer pipe gained. Automobiles, trucks and parts increased to 539,931 tons, an impressive advance of some 74,000 tons. Newsprint paper was up from 3,480,419 to 3,599,297 tons or 3.4 p.c. Woodpulp totalled 2,062,873 tons, an increase of 450,723 tons over the 1949 loadings. Canned goods, paperboard and other manufactures and miscellaneous showed good gains. Recessions were recorded in shipments of gasoline, sugar, rails, iron and steel off 143,774 tons to 1,257,221, cement down some 154,000 tons to 1,663,317 tons, agricultural implements, and in beverages dropping nearly 100,000 tons to 447,909 tons due in part to diversion to highway transport. Fertilizers and fish were lighter. L.C.L. merchandise totalled 2,710,164 tons or 238,795 tons under the volume loaded at Canadian stations during 1949.

Weather conditions affected 1950 loadings adversely in the early weeks where a dislocated winter brought heavy snows, storms and blockages early to the West and British Columbia, and provided little snow for woods operations in the East. Coal strikes in the United States to mid-March slowed foreign receipts. Manitoba floods towards the end of April were disastrous and disrupted movement. Rainy River floods followed later. The nine-day strike at the end of August occurred at one of the most active periods of the freight and passenger traffic year.

Foreign Connections Receipts

Revenue freight received from foreign connections increased 1,911,803 tons over 1949 volume to total 35,835,622 tons. Commodities destined for Canadian delivery rose from 18,342,909 to 19,173,579 tons with all groups except Manufactures and Miscellaneous advancing. Items registering gains included cotton, fresh fruits, vegetables, wool, non-edible animal products, anthracite and bituminous coal which rose from 4,666,440 to 5,301,809 tons. Crude petroleum was sharply lower at 38,416 tons against 138,723 tons one year earlier as domestic output increased encouragingly. Building materials were higher as well as some forest products. Petroleum oils and products were imported in larger volume while rails, lime and plaster, automobiles, fertilizers, other paper and paperboard advanced. Sizeable reduction was indicated in iron and steel down from 867,841 to 732,038 tons.

Intransit freight moving over Canadian lines between American points increased from 15,580,910 to 16,662,043 tons with gains in corn, wool, coals, base bullion, building products, salt, lumber, gasoline and oils, pig iron, iron and steel, automobiles, other paper and paperboard, woodpulp, and miscellaneous manufactures.

Inter-Regional Movements

On pages 26 - 29 two tables are published, one for the four Atlantic Provinces and one for the four Western Provinces. The net exports and imports from and to these areas are the differences between loadings and unloadings, but the net movement to and from other provinces is the difference between freight originated, including loadings and receipts from foreign connections

and freight terminated, including freight unloaded and delivered to foreign connections. If the freight originated in the Atlantic Provinces exceeded the freight terminated, the difference must have been carried westward, either for unloading in the other provinces or for delivery to foreign connections at a junction point in Quebec or provinces west. Also, if the terminated freight exceeded the originated, the difference came in across the Quebec boundary. The figures are essential to any appraisal of the impact of changes in the freight rate structure affecting these economic areas. Provinces of Newfoundland and Prince Edward Island have water connections which are regarded as extension of rail service in these tables.

The Atlantic Provinces - Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick

Area comparisons with 1949 are affected by the April 1st entry of Newfoundland into Confederation in that year as data for the last nine months only was made available. In 1950 the net movement of commodities to other provinces from the region totalled 681,118 tons while total net exports were 2,410,869 tons passing through rail connections, land or water. Potatoes, bituminous coal, coke, ores and concentrates, salt, pulpwood, lumber, sugar, pig iron, iron and steel, lime and plaster, newsprint, woodpulp, paperboard and fish were the leading exports from the area while grains, flour, mill products, fruit, meats, anthracite coal, stone, petroleum oils, cement, implements, automobiles, beverages, fertilizers, canned goods and miscellaneous manufactures and L.C.L. merchandise provided the bulk of the import movement.

Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia

The net movement of revenue freight eastward out of this area during 1950 totalled 8,132,079 tons compared with 10,008,043 tons in 1949 and a revised 9,719,403 tons in 1948. The larger decreases from 1949 volume were in wheat down from 6,184,380 to 4,660,810 tons, and in oats, barley, rye and flaxseed. Flour and other mill products likewise declined as did livestock and meats. The movement of mine products improved with all coals up considerably. Forestry items were all heavier with eastbound lumber advancing from a net of 840,991 to 1,038,229 tons. Receipts of manufactures and miscellaneous from the East were a net of 1,869,262 tons, down from 1,925,815 tons. Less dependence was evident on eastern sources of gasoline and petroleum oils as western refineries expanded operations. Gasoline imports dropped from 442,035 to 251,674 tons and petroleum oils and products by nearly 27,000 tons to 115,071 tons. Iron and steel inbound advanced from 212,925 to 260,740 tons, and automobiles, trucks and parts from 152,373 to 196,340 tons. Canned goods, other manufactures and miscellaneous also improved while the L.C.L. movement was lighter.

Description of Coverage

The data in the following tables include only revenue freight carried by the Canadian railways and not the "on company service" freight which includes coal for locomotives, ties, ballast and other railway materials. Tabular data will consequently not check with trade statistics of imports although this freight will not affect the exports. Freight interchanged between Canadian roads is not duplicated in these tables, but freight unloaded and subsequently reshipped is counted each time it is billed out. Foreign connections include railways in the United States and boats cleared for, or entered from, foreign ports, and in this report all freight moved to ports on export rates has been shown as delivered to foreign connections. Although the railways report all grain delivered to the elevators at the head of the lakes as unloaded at stations in Canada and all grain received from the lake elevators as loaded at billing stations, the reports have been corrected from the elevator returns to show the deliveries to and receipts from foreign connections. Grain delivered to elevators at Montreal, Vancouver, and other ocean ports for export has been shown as delivered to foreign connections and adjustments have been made for grain taken out of these elevators for local consumption. Freight carried to ports on local rates has been reported as unloaded at stations although it might subsequently be exported by water routes. Grain unloaded into the elevators at the Head of the Lakes and later forwarded to Montreal by boat is reported as unloaded at stations in Ontario and does not again enter into the railway records, and consequently affects the net imports into the province. Also western grain ground in Ontario will increase the imports of grain since it is reported out as flour. Data for other provinces are similarly affected but to a lesser degree.

Statistics presented cover only railway revenue freight and the differences between column 1, "freight loaded", and column 6, "freight unloaded", are the net imports and exports by rail into and out of the respective provinces. If the loadings exceed the unloadings, the data show a net export and if the unloadings exceed the loadings the excess is an import, irrespective of how often the same freight is loaded or unloaded. Except for freight handled by water, highway or air, these statistics give a very complete picture of the movement of freight in Canada, and in the Prairie Provinces, where a relatively larger portion of interprovincial freight is handled by rail, the net imports and exports cover the bulk of all imports and exports into and out of these provinces.

A commodity may be imported into a province in one form and exported in another form such as wheat and flour, pulpwood and paper, leather and shoes, etc., so that the net imports might be exported as other commodities in some volume.

Railways crossing the United States border consider their lines in the United States as foreign connections and show freight coming into Canada as received from foreign connections and freight crossing into the United States as freight delivered to foreign connections. Freight delivered to foreign connections includes exports from Canada and also intransit freight which has been received from foreign connections, rail and water, destined to foreign points, and this is shown in column 3. This in-transit traffic is heaviest between Detroit and St. Clair River gateways and the Niagara River ports. There is also some traffic from the western states through to Quebec ports and a lesser amount from the Pacific coast.
