


Review of 1951 Traffic:

Revenue freight carried by the leading railways operating in Canada during 1951 attained a new all time record of 160,252,638 tons, a betterment of 11.26 p.c. or 16,222,015 tons over the total of 144,030,623 reported in the monthly returns for 1950 which were affected by a 9-day strike. The previous *PEACETIME* high had occurred in 1948 when 154,732,409 tons were shown. Increased national productivity was the main spark in the advance, with loadings at Canadian stations reaching a peak of 121,963,051 tons against 108,195,001 tons one year earlier, a gain of 12.7 p.c. Receipts from foreign connections improved 2,453,965 tons to 38,289,587 tons or by 6.9 p.c. Of this total, 21,032,209 tons were destined to Canadian points while 17,257,378 tons were in transit between American stations. The previous year's totals were 19,173,579 and 16,662,043 tons respectively. Current foreign receipts, however, are running below wartime peaks, particularly in intransit traffic. The tonnage of revenue freight carried by the principal railways in the United States during 1951 at some 2,802 million tons shows a gain over 1950 of 8.6 p.c. compared with that of 11.3 p.c. registered by roads in Canada. Canadian railways posted a gain of 13.9 p.c. in freight earnings over the preceding year and revenue ton miles advanced 16 p.c. with average haul up from 351 miles in 1950 to 363 miles. Average tons per loaded freight car mile improved from 28.8 to 30.5 tons, but despite an increase in rates average freight receipt per revenue ton mile eased from 1.379 to 1.355 cents due to the heavier volume of lower rated primary products carried during 1951. In the first quarter of 1952 a minor gain in volume is indicated over the similar period of 1951.

Canadian Loadings during 1951

The record loadings of 121,963,051 tons at stations in Canada during 1951 reflected considerable betterment in all provinces except Alberta where a large diversion of crude oil to pipelines and lower coal output accounted for a small decline. The current national total exceeds the wartime high of 106,156,732 tons experienced in 1944 and the peacetime peak of 112,835,994 tons in 1948. Although the new province of Newfoundland added 1,068,291 tons to the domestic total for 1951, the gain in the total for the other provinces over 1948 was still considerable. For 1941 domestic loadings were 86,115,049 tons so that the advance in the decade was an impressive 41.6 p.c. or 35,848,000 tons, more remarkable in the light of greatly increased competition from motor trucks, pipelines and water carriers. Motor trucks registered in Canada probably numbered over 675,000 of all types in 1951 compared with some 271,000 in 1941, a jump of 150 p.c. and licenced carriers provide nation-wide and international highway freight service.

From 1941 to 1951 the population of Canada increased 21.8 p.c. while the advance in railway revenue freight loaded at Canadian stations was 41.6 p.c. demonstrating in one respect the encouraging gain in per capita output of goods. On a per capita basis 7.48 tons of domestic revenue freight were shipped by rail during 1941, a war year, compared with 8.71 tons in 1951 despite the addition of pipelines and over-the-road carriers in the interim.

Newfoundland loadings during 1951 moved up to 1,068,291 tons from 925,311 tons in 1950, a betterment of 15.4 p.c. with a wide gain in construction materials for use in the trans-Island highway and in pulpwood. The Prince Edward Island total rose 107,172 tons to 417,778 due entirely to pulpwood deliveries which jumped from 2,486 to 166,840 tons, and made a worthwhile contribution to the Island's economy. The Nova Scotia aggregate showed a minor increase over 1950 of 80,711 tons to 10,289,032 tons, with forest products, iron and steel and miscellaneous manufactures offsetting declines in coal, apples and agricultural products. Stations in New Brunswick reported 5,012,561 tons loaded during 1951, an advance of 1,350,857 tons from the previous year as pulpwood shipments were nearly tripled at 2,025,745 tons and manufacturing output improved. In the province of Quebec, total loadings were 21,103,335 tons compared with 18,521,675 tons one year earlier, a gain of 13.9 p.c. with mine products, forestry items and manufactures much better to offset decreases in agriculture and animal products. Pulpwood was up 1,380,000 tons to 3,157,000 but lumber shipments eased as housing activity slackened. In Ontario a record total of 41,667,045 tons represents a betterment of 13 p.c. or 4,807,462 tons over 1950. Wheat and other grains, building products, pulpwood, iron and steel, automobiles and miscellaneous manufactures posted notable gains. Only the animals and products group showed recession from 1950. The Manitoba aggregate bolstered by greatly increased grain deliveries rose from 6,202,835 to 7,967,961 tons, up 28.5 p.c. Wheat was an impressive 1,630,087 tons against 925,551 tons one year earlier while oats, barley, flaxseed and flour showed remarkable betterment. Livestock deliveries were lighter by 24,806 tons at 58,583. Pulpwood advanced from 268,957 to 468,149 tons and manufactures registered an encouraging gain. Saskatchewan stations billed 12,045,777 tons versus 9,244,746 tons in 1950, for a rise of 30.3 p.c. or some 2,801,000 tons. Wheat increased from 4,546,790 to 6,719,150 tons and most other agricultural items were better by far than during the preceding year. Livestock shipments were reduced. Lignite coal shipments were well maintained and pulpwood loadings doubled 1950 to total 177,396 tons. Refinery oil products showed good gains and the manufactures total was up from 663,285 to 783,203 tons. Alberta, with the only decline among the ten provinces, had a total loading of 11,880,807 tons, down 484,355 tons due to a drop in crude petroleum of 1,103,765 tons from 1,692,804 tons in 1950 to 589,039 tons in 1951, as pipelines took over the gathering and long distance delivery of the remarkable output of Alberta fields. The Interprovincial Pipeline moved 4,140,159 tons of Alberta crude eastward during 1951 compared with only 692,001 tons in the short operative period of 1950. Why the railways did not enter the promising

pipeline business is a natural question, but experience, financing, legal and other problems were considerations. Alberta agricultural products volume increased nearly 1 million tons over 1950 with wheat up from 2,353,861 to 3,087,049 tons. Coal shipments were much lower with all coals at 3,517,486 against 3,976,104 tons one year earlier. Pulpwood registered a splendid gain from 28,157 to 137,294 tons and manufactures were up over 100,000 tons to 1,821,307 tons. There has been a remarkable growth in loadings of manufactured products in the Prairies over the past decade, the total for the region rising from 2,110,000 in 1941 to 3,947,000 tons in 1951 - an advance of 87 p.c. reflecting the westward march of Canadian industry.

The Coast Province reported 10,510,464 tons of domestic revenue freight loaded for 1951, representing an increase of 6.2 p.c. or 615,406 tons over 1950. Apple shipments dropped 52,416 tons to 162,212 but animal products improved. Bituminous coal loadings were off from 865,120 to 774,155 tons while other mine output was well maintained. The forestry group, despite some drought, moved up from 3,272,306 to 3,909,380 tons with logs and lumber much heavier. The manufactures total at 2,016,471 tons increased by 59,661 tons with newsprint and woodpulp leading.

By commodity groups, the national loadings show agricultural products amounting to 26,788,517 tons compared with 19,604,440 tons in 1950, a betterment of 7,184,077 tons or 36.6 p.c. Wheat made a spectacular gain of some 5,057,000 tons to 14,878,366 tons while oats, barley, flaxseed, flour and other mill products were sharply higher. Apples and potatoes posted decreases. With slackening overseas and American demand the animals and animal products group dropped from 1,459,819 to 1,276,571 tons. Livestock was off 144,734 tons to 441,649 tons. Mine products registered a minor decrease due mainly to lower coal and crude petroleum shipments, the total for the group standing at 39,742,498 tons against 40,502,099 tons in 1950. Iron ore, sand, gravel and stone were heavier with iron ores at 3,295,600 tons, up 222,580 tons, as domestic developments were attracting increasing interest. Within a few years this item promises to bulk large in railway freight loadings. Forestry products rivalled the increase in agriculture advancing from 14,619,771 to 19,317,697 tons, a gain of nearly a third or 4,697,926 tons. Pulpwood was featured, up from 5,430,000 to 9,767,000 tons. Lumber shipments were nearly maintained while logs were much better. The manufactures group shows widespread improvement in the heavy industries. Iron and steel advanced 392,842 tons to 1,650,063 tons. Gasoline and petroleum oils, building products, agricultural implements, automobiles, and beverages, were considerably higher. Beverages rose from 447,909 to 543,488 tons as the railways regained some of this traffic from trucks. Newsprint paper rose 175,874 tons to 3,775,151 tons with world demand heavy. Other papers, paperboard and woodpulp loadings were up considerably over 1950. Canned goods improved, while miscellaneous manufactures rose from 7,760,803 to 8,702,629 tons or by 12.1 p.c. L.C.L. merchandise due mainly to the shorter loading week, slipped from 2,710,164 tons to 2,604,520 tons while sugar, cement, furniture and fish were lighter in 1951.

Industrial peace, good harvests, normal weather conditions and activated defence preparedness combined with rising domestic and American demand to produce an encouraging volume of revenue freight during 1951. The five-day work week inaugurated on the railways June 1st caused some dislocation in the accustomed loading practises but the main effect was on L.C.L. shipments which apparently have been diverted to some extent to highway carriers ready to load around - the - clock six days a week.

Receipts from Foreign Connections

Revenue freight received from foreign connections, rail and ship, increased 2,453,965 tons over 1950 to total 38,289,587 tons for a gain of 6.9 p.c. Commodities for Canadian delivery rose from 19,173,579 to 21,032,209 tons with all commodity groups posting advances. Fresh fruits, meats, coke, iron ore, other ores (mainly bauxite), and other mine products were much heavier. Foreign lumber entries also

increased. Large import gains were indicated in pig iron, iron and steel up from 732,038 to 1,037,118 tons, machinery, brick, fertilizers, paperboards, woodpulp, canned goods and miscellaneous manufactures. Coal receipts were lower, particularly anthracite while imports of foreign crude oil by rail were further pared to 11,284 tons from 38,416 tons in 1950 and 138,723 tons in 1949 as domestic output supplied a larger percentage of the national needs.

Intransit freight moving over the Canadian shortcuts between American points increased from 16,662,043 to 17,257,378 tons. The agricultural total was little changed but other commodity groups posted gains. Wheat, butter, cheese, coke, lumber, petroleum oils, iron and steel, machinery, paper, woodpulp and miscellaneous manufactures were moved across in greater volume. Corn, coal and automobiles were reduced.

Inter-Regional Movements

On pages 28 - 31 two tables are published, one for the four Atlantic Provinces and one for the four Western Provinces. The net exports and imports from and to these areas are the differences between loadings and unloadings, but the net movement to and from other provinces is the difference between freight originated, including loadings and receipts from foreign connections and freight terminated, including freight unloaded and delivered to foreign connections. If the freight originated in the Atlantic Provinces exceeded the freight terminated, the difference must have been carried westward, either for unloading in the other provinces or for delivery to foreign connections at a junction point in Quebec or provinces west. Also, if the terminated freight exceeded the originated, the difference came in across the Quebec boundary. The figures are essential to any appraisal of the impact of changes in the freight rate structure affecting these economic areas. The Provinces of Newfoundland and Prince Edward Island have water connections which are regarded as extension of rail service in these tables.

The Atlantic Provinces - Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick

During 1951 the net rail movement of all commodities to other provinces from the region totalled 1,137,544 tons while total net exports were 3,367,219 tons via rail, land or water connections. These totals compare favourably with 681,118 tons and 2,410,869 tons respectively in 1950 for percentage increases of 67 and 39.7. Potatoes, bituminous coal, coke, other ores and concentrates, salt, pulpwood, lumber, sugar, pig iron, newsprint, paperboards, woodpulp and fish were the leading exports from the area while grains, hay and straw, fruits, packing house products, anthracite, stone, petroleum, cement, autos, fertilizers, canned goods, miscellaneous manufactures and L.C.L. merchandise were heavily imported.

Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia

The net movement of revenue freight eastward out of this area during 1951 amounted to 12,763,- 366 tons compared with 8,132,079 tons in 1950 and 10,008,043 tons in 1949. The sizeable advance over 1950 was due mainly to the wide gains in wheat, oats and barley as well as in flour and in other mill products. Coal shipments were down sharply, bituminous off from 339,494 to 146,320 tons. Forestry items eastbound were much better, the group total moving up from 1,427,438 to 2,042,793 tons on the strength of pulpwood and lumber gains. Cement, lime and plaster, and woodpulp also improved but fish was off from 21,406 to 17,773 tons. Receipts of manufactures and miscellaneous items from the East produced a net intake by rail of 1,574,178 tons during the year compared with 1,869,262 tons in 1950 and 1,925,815 tons in 1949, and demonstrating continued reduced dependence on eastern supplies, particularly in the field of gasoline and petroleum products. Iron and steel intake was also cut from 1950 as well as agricultural implements and automobiles, a considerable number of the latter moving westward by transporter and by driver. Canned goods shipments, however, rose from 88,916 to 103,263 tons.

The 1,760 mile wide area, Manitoba to British Columbia, showed a net export of 17,343,019 tons of all commodities against 11,661,026 tons in 1950 and 13,510,682 tons in 1949. The encouraging increase over 1950 of some 5,682,000 tons does not include the crude oil moving through pipeline out of the area for eastern refineries, which movement exceeded 2,100,000 tons in 1951. This heavy outflow of commodities is a measure of western progress and prosperity during the year.
