





Review of 1952 Traffic:

A new record volume of revenue freight was transported by Canadian railways during 1952 when 161,905,537 tons were carried representing a gain of 1,652,899 tons or 1.03 p.c. over the previous peak reported for 1951. The wartime high was the 154,845,277 tons shown for 1944. The increase of 1952 over the war year 1942 was some 27,787,000 tons or 20.7 p.c. while the advance over 1932 was an impressive 101,437,000 tons or 133.8 p.c. This stupendous growth in revenue freight traffic is a measure of the great increase in national productivity and Canada's international trade over the past score years.

The main factor in the betterment over 1951 was the heavier loadings at Canadian stations which contrasted with declines in receipts from foreign connections both for domestic consumption and as intransit freight. Loadings in Canada attained a new high at 125,343,407 tons, up 3,380,356 or 2.8 p.c. over the previous year while total receipts from connections decreased 1,727,457 tons from 38,289,587 to 36,562,130 tons. Import freight eased from 21,032,209 to 20,827,840 tons and intransit volume between American stations slipped from 17,257,378 to 15,734,290 tons with all groups except Forest Products lower. Based on monthly data, the tonnage of revenue freight carried by Class 1 roads in the United States dropped 5.9 p.c. in 1952 from 1951 contrasting with the above gain of over 1 p.c. in Canada. Ton miles in the States were off 4.9 p.c. in the same comparison while Canada posted a betterment of 6.4 p.c. Average length of haul in Canada moved up from 363 to 384 miles and tons per loaded freight car mile were 31.6 versus 30.5 tons in 1951. Aided by better rates, average freight receipt per revenue ton mile on the principal Canadian lines was 1.369 against 1.355 cents a year earlier. The heavy volume of low rated primary products moved by rail tended to restrict the gain in average receipt.

Loadings in Canada during 1952

The record loadings of 125,343,407 tons at stations in Canada during 1952 reflected betterment in six of the ten provinces particularly in the West where a heavy harvest accounted for the advance. The current national total exceeds the wartime high of 106,156,732 tons experienced in 1944 by 18 p.c. Although the new province of Newfoundland added 1,254,435 tons to the domestic total for 1952, the gain in the total for the other provinces over previous years was still considerable. For 1942 domestic loadings were 91,864,795 tons so that the advance in the decade was an impressive 36.4 p.c. or 33,479,000 tons, more remarkable in the light of greatly increased competition from motor trucks, pipelines and air and water carriers. Motor trucks registered in Canada probably numbered over 735,000 of all types in 1952 compared with some 283,800 in 1942, a jump of 159 p.c. and licensed carriers provide nation-wide and international highway freight service. Pipeline expansion has been remarkable in the past three years both for crude and products deliveries to the main consuming areas.

From 1942 to 1952 the population of Canada increased 23.8 p.c. while the advance in railway revenue freight loaded at Canadian stations was 36.4 p.c. demonstrating in one respect the encouraging gain in per capita output of goods. On a per capita basis 7.88 tons of domestic revenue freight were shipped by rail during 1942, a war year, compared with 8.69 tons in 1952 despite the great increase in pipeline mileage and over-the-road carriers in the interim.

Newfoundland loadings during 1952 moved up to 1,254,435 tons from 1,068,291 tons in 1951, a betterment of 17.4 p.c. with a wide gain in construction materials for use in the trans-Island highway and in pulpwood. The Prince Edward Island total shrank 125,861 tons to 291,917 due entirely to pulpwood deliveries which dropped from 166,840 to 35,003 tons. The Nova Scotia aggregate also showed a decrease from 1951 of 648,692 tons to 9,640,340 tons, with forest products, coal and manufactures lower. Stations in New Brunswick reported 4,165,830 tons loaded during 1952, a decline of 846,731 tons from the previous year as pulpwood shipments were sharply down offsetting gains in mine products, notably coal. In the province of Quebec, total loadings were 19,758,883 tons compared with 21,103,335 tons one year earlier, a drop of 6.3 p.c. with forestry items and manufactures much lower to offset gains in agriculture and mine products. Pulpwood was down 732,114 tons to 2,424,884 and lumber shipments eased considerably. In Ontario a record total of 42,504,480 tons represents a betterment of 2 p.c. or 837,435 tons over 1951. Wheat and other grains, pulpwood, iron and steel, automobiles and beverages posted notable gains. The Manitoba aggregate bolstered by increased mineral, forest and gasoline and oil deliveries was steady at 7,999,084 against 7,967,961 tons in 1951. Wheat was down from 1,630,087 tons to 1,372,267 tons while oats and other agricultural products registered declines. Livestock deliveries were lighter by 14,282 tons at 44,301. Pulpwood advanced from 468,149 to 521,684 tons and manufactures continued to register an encouraging gain. Saskatchewan stations billed a record 15,056,856 tons versus 12,045,777 tons in 1951, for a rise of 25 p.c. or some 3,011,000 tons. Wheat increased from 6,719,150 to 8,915,044 tons, barley doubled, and most other agricultural items were better by far than during the preceding year. Livestock shipments were reduced due to embargoes. Lignite coal shipments were lighter and pulpwood loadings dropped 27 p.c. to total 129,462 tons. Refinery oil products showed splendid gains and the manufactures total was up from 783,203 to 879,505 tons. Alberta with better crops, had a total loading of 13,956,795 tons, up 2,076,000 tons due to gains in agriculture and manufactures. (The Interprovincial Pipeline moved 5,573,392 tons of Alberta crude eastward during 1952 compared with 4,161,775 tons in the operative period of 1951.) Alberta agricultural products volume increased 1.9 million tons over 1951 with wheat up from 3,087,049 to 3,721,574 tons. Coal shipments were lower with all coals at 3,386,709 against 3,517,486 tons one year earlier. Manufactures were up 245,000 tons to 2,066,000 tons. There has been a remarkable growth in loadings of manufactured products in the Prairies over the past decade, the total for the

region rising from 2,695,264 in 1942 to 4,403,706 tons in 1952 - an advance of 63.4 p.c. reflecting the westward march of Canadian industry. The growth in gasoline and petroleum products was spectacular.

The Coast Province reported 10,714,787 tons of domestic revenue freight loaded for 1952, representing an increase of 1.9 p.c. or 204,323 tons over 1951. Apple shipments dropped 37,813 tons to 124,399 but grains improved. Bituminous coal loadings were off further from 774,155 to 549,685 tons while other mine output was well maintained. The forestry group, despite some labour trouble, moved up from 3,909,380 to 4,147,356 tons with logs, ties and plywood much heavier. The manufactures total at 2,129,146 tons increased by 112,675 tons with fertilizers, cement and woodpulp leading.

By main commodity groups, the national loadings show agricultural products amounting to 32,955,704 tons compared with 26,788,517 tons in 1951, a betterment of 6,167,187 tons or 23 p.c. Wheat made a splendid gain of some 3,877,000 tons to 18,755,312 tons while oats, barley and flaxseed were sharply higher. Apples and potatoes posted decreases. With livestock shipments confined by western embargoes the animals and animal products group dropped from 1,276,571 to 1,210,749 tons. Livestock was off 101,613 tons to 340,036 tons. Mine products registered a decrease due mainly to lower coal and crude petroleum shipments, the total for the group standing at 39,094,936 tons against 39,742,498 tons in 1951. Sand, gravel, stone and asphalt were heavier. Forestry products due to sharply lower pulpwood and lumber loadings declined from 19,317,697 to 17,768,180 tons, a drop of nearly 1,550,000 tons. Pulpwood was down from 9,767,000 to 8,468,000 tons. Lumber shipments were 736,510 tons lower at 6,167,886. The manufactures group shows widespread improvement in the petroleum industry. Iron and steel advanced nearly 55,000 tons to 1,705,012 tons. Building products, automobiles, and beverages, were considerably higher. Beverages rose from 543,488 to 636,001 tons as the railways continued to regain this traffic from trucks. Newsprint paper was nearly maintained at 3,761,519 tons with world demand heavy. Other papers, paperboard and woodpulp loadings were considerably lower in 1952. Miscellaneous manufactures eased from 8,702,629 to 8,562,769 tons and L.C.L. merchandise due in part to the shorter loading week, slipped from 2,604,520 tons to 2,270,184 tons while sugar, canned goods and fish were also lighter in 1952.

Industrial expansion, excellent harvests, normal weather conditions and activated defence preparedness combined with good domestic and American demand to produce an encouraging volume of revenue freight during 1952. The five-day work week inaugurated on the railways June 1st of 1951 received its first full year of operation. Considerable railway construction was underway in Quebec, Manitoba and British Columbia.

Receipts from Foreign Connections

Revenue freight received from foreign connections, rail and ship, decreased 1,727,457 tons from 1951 to total 36,562,130 tons for a decline of 4.5 p.c. Commodities for Canadian delivery shrank from 21,032,209 to 20,827,840 tons with only forest products and manufactures posting advances. Fresh fruits, pig iron, other ores (mainly bauxite), and other mine products were heavier. Foreign lumber entries also increased. Coal receipts were lower, both anthracite and bituminous.

Intransit freight moving over the Candian shortcuts between American points dropped from 17,257,378 to 15,734,290 tons. Only forest products showed improvement for this category.

Inter-Regional Movements

On pages 28 - 31 two tables are published, one for the four Atlantic Provinces and one for the four Western Provinces. The net exports and imports from and to these areas are the differences between loadings and unloadings, but the net movement to and from other provinces is the difference between freight originated, including loadings and receipts from foreign connections and freight terminated, including freight unloaded and delivered to foreign connections. If the freight originated in the Atlantic Provinces exceeded the freight terminated, the difference must have been carried westward, either for unloading in the other provinces or for delivery to foreign connections at a junction point in Quebec or provinces west. Also, if the terminated freight exceeded the originated, the difference came in across the Quebec boundary. The figures are essential to any appraisal of the impact of changes in the freight rate structure affecting these economic areas. The Provinces of Newfoundland and Prince Edward Island have water connections which are regarded as extension of rail service in these tables.

The Atlantic Provinces - Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick

During 1952 the net rail movement of all commodities from other provinces into the region totalled 434,374 tons while total net exports were 2,022,834 tons via rail, land or water connections. These totals compare unfavourably with net exports of 1,137,544 tons and 3,367,219 tons respectively in 1951. Potatoes, bituminous coal, coke, other ores and concentrates, salt, pulpwood, lumber, sugar, pig iron, iron and steel, newsprint, paperboards, woodpulp and fish were the leading exports from the area while grains, fruits, packing house products, anthracite, base bullion, stone, petroleum oils, cement, autos, beverages, fertilizers, canned goods, miscellaneous manufactures and L.C.L. merchandise were heavily imported.

Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia

The net movement of revenue freight eastward out of this area during 1952 amounted to 15,822,400 tons compared with 12,763,366 tons in 1951 and 8,132,079 tons in 1950. The sizeable advance over 1951 was due mainly to the wide gains in wheat, oats and barley as well as in flour, meats and in other mill products. Total coal shipments were down sharply. Forestry items eastbound were slightly less, the group total moving off from 2,042,793 to 2,008,823 tons on a decline in lumber. Cement, fertilizers, woodpulp and fish improved. Receipts of manufactures and miscellaneous items from the East produced a net intake by rail of 1,570,379 tons during the year compared with 1,574,178 tons in 1951 and 1,869,262 tons in 1950, and demonstrating continued reduced dependence on eastern supplies, particularly in the field of gasoline and petroleum products. Iron and steel intake was heavier due to railway building and hydro developments.

The 1,760 mile wide area, Manitoba to British Columbia, showed an encouraging net export of 21,639,280 tons of all commodities against 17,343,019 tons in 1951 and 11,661,026 tons in 1950. The splendid increase over 1951 of some 4,296,000 tons does not include the crude oil moving through pipeline out of the area for eastern refineries, which movement was nearly 3,090,000 tons in 1952, against 2,100,000 tons in 1951. This record heavy outflow of commodities is a measure of western progress and prosperity during the year. This is probably the fastest growing major area in the world and one with a great future.


