

Year ended December 31, 1953

Freight Traffic:

Revenue freight moved by railways in Canada during 1953 totalled 156,107,052 tons, down 5,798,485 tons or 3.58 p.c. from the 1952 total. Reduced loadings in Canada was responsible for most of the

drop with a decline of 5,283,476 tons to 120,059,931 for the year. Freight received from foreign connections was down slightly in total with shipments destined to Canadian points off from 20,827,840 to 19,356,885 tons but intransit freight up from 15,734,290 to 16,690,236 tons.

Loadings:

Agricultural products loaded in Canada totalled 31,688,147 tons compared with 32,955,704 in 1952. Most commodities in the agricultural group were loaded in smaller amounts but hay and straw and potatoes moved in increased amounts. The animals and animal products group was down from 1,210,749 tons loaded to 1,169,253 with large declines in hogs and a good gain in cattle and calves. Increased

loadings occurred in the mine products group which was up 75,878 tons to 39,170,814 for the year. Coal, asphalt and miscellaneous mine products were loaded in reduced tonnages but ores and concentrates were up slightly while non-ferrous base bullion etc., sand, gravel and stone were moved in considerably greater amounts. Forest products were down sharply from 17,768,180 to 14,740,567 tons with pulpwood accounting for most of the decrease. A drop of 1,022,688 tons brought loadings of manufactures

and miscellaneous products down to 33,291,150 tons in 1953. The majority of commodities in this group were loaded in smaller amounts with especially heavy declines in pig and bloom iron, agricultural implements, fertilizers, newsprint paper, wood pulp, other manufactures and miscellaneous and less-than-carload freight shipments.

Newfoundland loadings fell from 1,254,435 tons in 1952 to 1,202,044 tons in 1953, the major source of decline being in stone which fell from 105,206 to 23,225 tons. Gasoline and cement showed improved loadings over 1952. Prince Edward Island had a gain in loadings from 291,917 to 294,676 tons. In Nova Scotia reduced shipments of coal, pulpwood, lumber and pig and bloom iron brought loadings down from 9,640,340 to 9,434,283 tons. Miscellaneous mine products showed a large increase over 1952 loadings. New Brunswick data indicated reduced activity in loadings of logs and pulpwood and gains in lumber, cement and paperboard etc. Total loadings for the province dropped 606,608 tons to 3,559,222 in 1953. In Quebec the total was down from 19,758,883 to 18,045,029 tons with reductions in the movement of "other" ores, pulpwood, gasoline, petroleum oils, pig iron, cement, lime and plaster, beverages, newsprint paper, wood pulp and L.C.L. freight and heavier loadings of base bullion, matte etc.

The current report shows a sharp drop in Ontario loadings from 42,504,480 to 39,718,173 tons. Leading the decline were most agricultural products, coal, coke, "other" mine products, logs etc., pulpwood, pig iron and miscellaneous commodities while gains were apparent in "other" ores, sand and gravel, stone and cement. The Manitoba total was down from 7,999,084 to 7,283,576 tons with agricultural products, mainly wheat and barley; forest products (pulpwood) and manufactures and miscellaneous products loaded in smaller quantities. Animals and animal products and mine products (especially stone) were loaded in greater amounts than in 1952. Saskatchewan showed a substantial increase in loadings to bring the total up from 15,056,856 to 16,278,641 tons. The principal commodities to show gains were wheat up 600,620 tons to 9,515,664, oats, barley, cattle and calves, crude petroleum, gasoline and petroleum oils, while the commodity which suffered the sharpest drop was pulpwood. Smaller loadings of wheat, oats, "other" agricultural products, coal, crude petroleum and pulpwood were only partially offset by a heavier volume of sand and gravel and cement and resulted in a drop in the Alberta total from 13,956,795 to 13,532,072 tons. The British Columbia total was almost unchanged at 10,712,215 compared with 10,714,787 tons. There were smaller quantities of agricultural, animals and animal products and mine products loaded but lumber loadings brought the forest products group above the 1952 total and the movement of manufactures and miscellaneous products was up in total.

Receipts from Foreign Connections:

Revenue freight received from foreign connections, rail and water, decreased from 36,562,130 to

36,047,121 tons. Tonnage destined for Canadian points was down from 20,827,840 to 19,356,885 tons with small gains in forest products and manufactures and miscellaneous products offsetting the trend. Freight moved between foreign points via Canadian rail connections was up from 15,734,290 to 16,690,236 tons.

Inter-Regional Movements:

On pages 30-33 two tables are published, one for the four Atlantic Provinces and one for the four Western Provinces. The net exports and imports from and to these areas are the differences between loadings and unloadings, but the net movement to and from other provinces is the differences between freight originated, including loadings and receipts from foreign connections and freight terminated, including freight unloaded and delivered to foreign connections. If the freight originated in the Atlantic Provinces exceeded the freight terminated, the difference must have been carried westward, either for unloading in the other provinces or for delivery to foreign connections at a junction point in Quebec or provinces west. Also, if the terminated freight exceeded the originated, the differences came in across the Quebec boundary. The figures are essential to any appraisal of the impact of changes in the freight rate structure affecting these economic areas. The Provinces of Newfoundland and Prince Edward Island have water connections which are regarded as extension of rail service in these tables.

The Atlantic Provinces — Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick:

Net movement in 1953 was an inward flow of 691,419 tons compared with 434,374 in 1952 and an outflow of 1,137,544 tons in 1951. The net export of commodities stood at 1,434,481 tons in 1953 vs. 2,022,834 in 1952 and 3,367,219 tons in 1951. Major exports in 1953 were; potatoes, bituminous coal, "other" ores and concentrates, pulpwood, lumber, sugar, newsprint paper, paperboard and wood pulp while the more important items imported were; miscellaneous mill products, flour, "other" manufactures and miscellaneous and L.C.L. freight.

Western Provinces — Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia:

Eastward net movement of freight from the Western Provinces was slightly higher at 15,947,228 compared with 15,822,400 tons. The net export from the area was 21,458,333 tons down by 180,947 tons from the 1952 figure of 21,639,280 tons. Agricultural products accounted for 18,940,535 tons of net exports with wheat by far the largest single item at 12,012,523 tons. Other major export commodities were lignite coal, non-ferrous matte, pig etc., pulpwood, lumber, fertilizers and wood pulp. Imported in considerable volume were miscellaneous fresh fruit, miscellaneous mine products, petroleum oils and products, bar, sheet etc., iron and steel, agricultural implements and "other" manufactures and miscellaneous commodities.
