

**Summary of**  
**MONTHLY RAILWAY TRAFFIC REPORTS**

**Year ended December 31, 1955**

**Freight Traffic:**

Revenue freight traffic moved by railways in Canada during 1955 totalled 167,656,542 tons an increase of 15.3 p.c. from 145,418,055 in 1954. Iron ore shipments accounted for most of the increase with a rise of 9,072,623 tons to 13,977,906 in 1955. Other significant increases occurred in common sand and gravel up 1,854,150 tons to 6,908,422; crude gypsum up 1,182,154 tons to 3,261,262; mine products, n.o.s. up 1,155,429 tons to 6,998,973;

lumber, timber and plywood up 1,370,102 tons to 8,442,178; and manufactures and miscellaneous n.o.s. up 1,159,476 tons to 7,896,692.

Of the 167,656,542 tons of freight carried in 1955, 131,456,869 tons were loaded at stations in Canada up 17.1 p.c. from 112,298,467 in 1954; receipts from foreign connections destined to Canadian points increased 5.1 p.c. to 18,730,521 tons from 17,819,456; and intransit freight rose 14.2 p.c. to 17,469,152 tons from 15,300,132.

**Loadings:**

Of the 131,456,869 tons of freight loaded in Canada during 1955, 56,824,335 tons of mine products accounted for 43.2 p.c. of the total; 33,664,030 tons of manufactures and miscellaneous products for 25.6 p.c.; 22,015,310 tons of agricultural products for 16.7 p.c.; 15,950,953 tons of forest products accounted for 12.1 p.c.; 1,230,001 tons of animals and animal products for 0.9 p.c.; and 1,772,240 tons of L.C.L. freight for 1.3 p.c.

Newfoundland loadings increased 16.2 p.c. to 1,334,374 tons from 1,148,093. Loadings in Prince Edward Island rose slightly to 305,773 tons from 296,338. Nova Scotia increased 14.5 p.c. to 10,761,398 tons from 9,401,113 while New Brunswick rose 8.3 p.c. to 4,445,986 tons from 4,105,558. In Quebec loadings rose 47.2 p.c. to 30,469,062 tons from 20,705,415, a rise featured by an increase in iron ore loadings to 9,568,529 tons from 2,474,596; and Ontario up 17.3 p.c. to 40,619,626 tons from 34,637,419. Loadings in Manitoba rose 2.6 p.c. to 7,227,710 tons from 7,043,262 but those in Saskatchewan dropped 4.8 p.c. to 12,142,281 tons from 12,759,920. Data for Alberta shows 11,347,667 tons loaded up 3.0 p.c. from 11,014,527, while British Columbia loadings increased 14.4 p.c. to 12,802,992 tons from 11,186,822.

**Receipts from Foreign Connections:**

Freight received from foreign connections destined to Canadian points totalled 18,730,521 up 911,065 tons from 17,819,456 in 1954. Receipts in Quebec amounted to 6,293,379 tons versus 6,055,603 in 1954. Those in Ontario increased to 10,228,630 from 9,635,261 and in British Columbia to 1,051,143 from 946,474.

Freight received from foreign connections destined to foreign points (intransit freight) totalled 17,469,152 tons up from 15,300,132 in 1954. Quebec and Ontario were responsible for the increase in the movement of foreign freight with the Quebec total increasing to 1,762,729 tons from 1,714,447 and Ontario up to 14,896,582 tons from 12,860,607.

**Inter-Regional Movements:**

On pages 30-33 two tables are published, one for the four Atlantic Provinces and one for the four Western Provinces. The net exports and imports from and to these areas represents the differences

between loadings and unloadings. The net movement to and from other provinces is the difference between freight originated, including loadings and receipts from foreign connections and freight terminated, including freight unloaded and delivered to foreign connections. If freight originating in the Atlantic Provinces exceeds freight terminating, the difference is the tonnage carried to other provinces, either for delivery within Central or Western Canada or for delivery to foreign connections at a junction point in Quebec or provinces west. If terminating freight exceeds originating freight the difference is tonnage moved eastward across the Quebec boundary. These figures are essential to any appraisal of the impact of changes in the freight rate structure affecting these economic areas. The railways of Newfoundland and Prince Edward Island are serviced by water connections which are regarded in these tables as an extension of rail service.

**The Atlantic Provinces—Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick:**

Net movement in 1955 showed an inbound movement of 756,189 tons from other provinces compared to an outflow of 168,534 tons in 1954, and inflow of 691,419 in 1953. The net export of commodities stood at 1,739,420 tons in 1955 versus 1,747,363 in 1954 and 1,434,481 tons in 1953. Major exports from the region in 1955 were: potatoes, bituminous coal, pulpwood, lumber, timber lath and shingles, woodpulp and newsprint paper while the more important imports included: mill products n.o.s., automobiles and parts, chemicals and acids, n.o.s. food products, n.o.s., manufactures and miscellaneous, n.o.s. and freight L.C.L.

**Western Provinces—Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia:**

Net eastward movement of freight from the Western Provinces amounted to 11,041,586 tons in 1955 as against 11,214,633 tons in 1954 and 15,947,228 tons in 1953. The net export from the area was 16,106,515 tons for 1955 versus 16,415,241 tons for 1954 and 21,458,333 tons for 1953. Agricultural products accounted for a net export of 11,566,243 tons with wheat the largest single item at 7,393,894 tons. Other major export commodities were: bituminous coal, lumber, timber, lath and shingles, metals and alloys, n.o.s., fertilizers n.o.s. and woodpulp. Significant imports were: mine products, n.o.s., iron and steel, (bar, pipe etc.) and manufactures and miscellaneous n.o.s.
