# RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

Year ended December 31, 1956

(Formerly Summary of Monthly Railway Traffic Reports)

Railway freight traffic statistics for 1956 as presented in this report are not comparable with those of the previous year because of two principal changes. Firstly, water-borne imports at lake or ocean ports have been separated from rail imports and are now included with commodities "loaded at stations in Canada". This change makes possible an analysis of traffic entering the country by rail from the United States, divided between goods destined to points in Canada and goods which merely pass through Canada.

The second change concerns the adoption of a new "Uniform Classification of Accounts for Common Carriers by Railway" which, for accounting purposes, groups all railways into the following four classes on the basis of average gross annual revenues:

Class I. Canadian National Railways and Canadian Pacific Railway Company and their related operations which are defined therein as Canadian rail operations.

Class II. Other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually from Canadian rail transportation operations.

Class III. Other carriers having average gross revenues of less than \$500,000 annually from Canadian rail transportation operations.

Class IV. Other companies which report under the Railway Act, such as terminal, bridge, tunnel and pullman companies.

Commencing January 1, 1956 this report concerns only class I and II railways. Class III and IV roads account for approximately one per cent of the total rail freight originating in Canada. One railway, the White Pass and Yukon Route (lines in Canada) was added in 1956 while eight others which were included previously did not qualify because their annual revenues were less than \$500,000. ### Freight Traffic

Revenue freight traffic carried by the twenty-one reporting class I and II railways operating in Canada during 1956 totalled 187,623,304 tons. This compares with 167,656,542 tons moved by twenty-eight railways in 1955. Iron ore and concentrates was the largest single item transported by rail during 1956 with a total movement of 19,935,556 tons. Wheat shipments at 16,340,373 tons were second in volume and bituminous coal ranked third with 15,125,237 tons.

Of the 187,623,304 tons of revenue freight handled by lines operating in Canada during the year under review, 154,835,815 tons were loaded at stations in Canada while 32,787,489 tons were received from United States rail connections. Of these receipts, 15,392,017 tons were destined to Canadian points and 17,395,472 to U.S. points.

### Loadings

Loadings by commodity groups show that mine products with 67,356,589 tons accounted for 43.5 per cent of the 154,835,815 tons of all freight loaded at stations in Canada during 1956. Manufactures and miscellaneous products with 38,371,347 tons accounted for 24.8 per cent of the total; agricultural products with 28,966,251 tons for 18.7 per cent; forest products with 16,945,331 tons for 10.9 per cent; animals and animal products with 1,314,486 tons for 0.8 per cent; and l.c.l. freight with 1,881,811 tons for 1.2 per cent.

Of the total loadings of revenue freight in Canada, more than half occurred at stations in the provinces of Ontario and Quebec. Ontario reported 46,677,845 tons loaded or 30.1 per cent of the 154,835,815 tons loaded in Canada, and Quebec with 40,177,297 accounted for 25.9 per cent. Mine products were the main commodities originating in both provinces. Saskatchewan, with grain products as the principal commodities loaded, reported 15,702,381 tons or 10.1 per cent of the total. British Columbia loadings totalled 13,295,008 or 8.6 per cent with the accent on forest products; and loadings in Alberta of 13,252,869 tons which amounted to 8.6 per cent of the total had agricultural products predominating. Stations in Nova Scotia reported 11,209,107 tons loaded or 7.2 per cent of the total for Canada with bituminous coal and crude gypsum being the main commodities moved. Manitoba loaded 7,930,723 tons or 5.1 per cent of the Canadian total with agricultural and mine products sharing the greater volume of commodity movement. New Brunswick loadings totalled 4,831,174 tons or 3.1 per cent with manufactures and miscellaneous, forest products and mine products being the principal commodities originating in that province. Newfoundland loadings, consisting mainly of manufactures and miscellaneous products amounted to 1,407,867 tons or 0.9 per cent of the total and Prince Edward Island, with potatoes being the outstanding commodity loaded, reported 351,544 tons of freight or 0.2 per cent of the Canada total.

### Receipts from United States Rail Connections

Freight received from United States rail connections destined to Canadian points totalled 15,392,017 tons. Of this total 10,467,444 tons entered Canada at Ontario points; 2,745,815 tons at Quebec points; 929,498 tons at British Columbia points; 690,306 tons at Manitoba points; 337,809 tons at Saskatchewan points; 167,108 tons at Alberta points; and 54,037 tons at New Brunswick points.

Freight received from United States rail connections destined to foreign points totalled 17,395,472 tons. The province of Ontario reported the greatest movement of U.S. freight over Canadian lines with 14,791,373 tons. Quebec moved 1,886,702 tons while New Brunswick, Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia accounted for the remaining 717,397 tons. This traffic appears in the tables as "Received from U.S. rail connections destined to U.S. points" and is included in Delivered to U.S. rail connections.

### Net Movements

Since the tonnage loaded and unloaded in each province includes freight from and to water connections as well as that from and to local industry, it is no longer possible to show the net exports and imports by province. However it does reveal the net movements to and from other provinces. This is the difference between freight originated (receipts from industry, water connections, and U.S. rail connections) and freight terminated (deliveries to industry, water connections, and U.S. rail connections). It should be noted that freight passing through a province by rail is not reported by that province i.e. a carload moving all rail from Saskatoon to Montreal is not reported in Manitoba or Ontario.

The railways in Newfoundland and Prince Edward Island and Vancouver Island are served by water connections which are regarded in these tables as an extension of rail service.

#### The Atlantic Provinces — Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick

The net movement of commodities to this region during 1956 aggregated 707,051 tons. Traffic moving into the area from other provinces for consumption or export consisted for the most part of agricultural products, manufactured products and miscellaneous freight while mine and forest products were the principal items moved to other provinces.

#### Western Provinces — Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia

The net movement of goods from the western provinces eastward totalled 14,205,741 tons. Agricultural products, particularly wheat, oats and barley, moved in greatest volume. Freight moving into the region from the eastern provinces consisted mainly of manufactures and miscellaneous commodities.

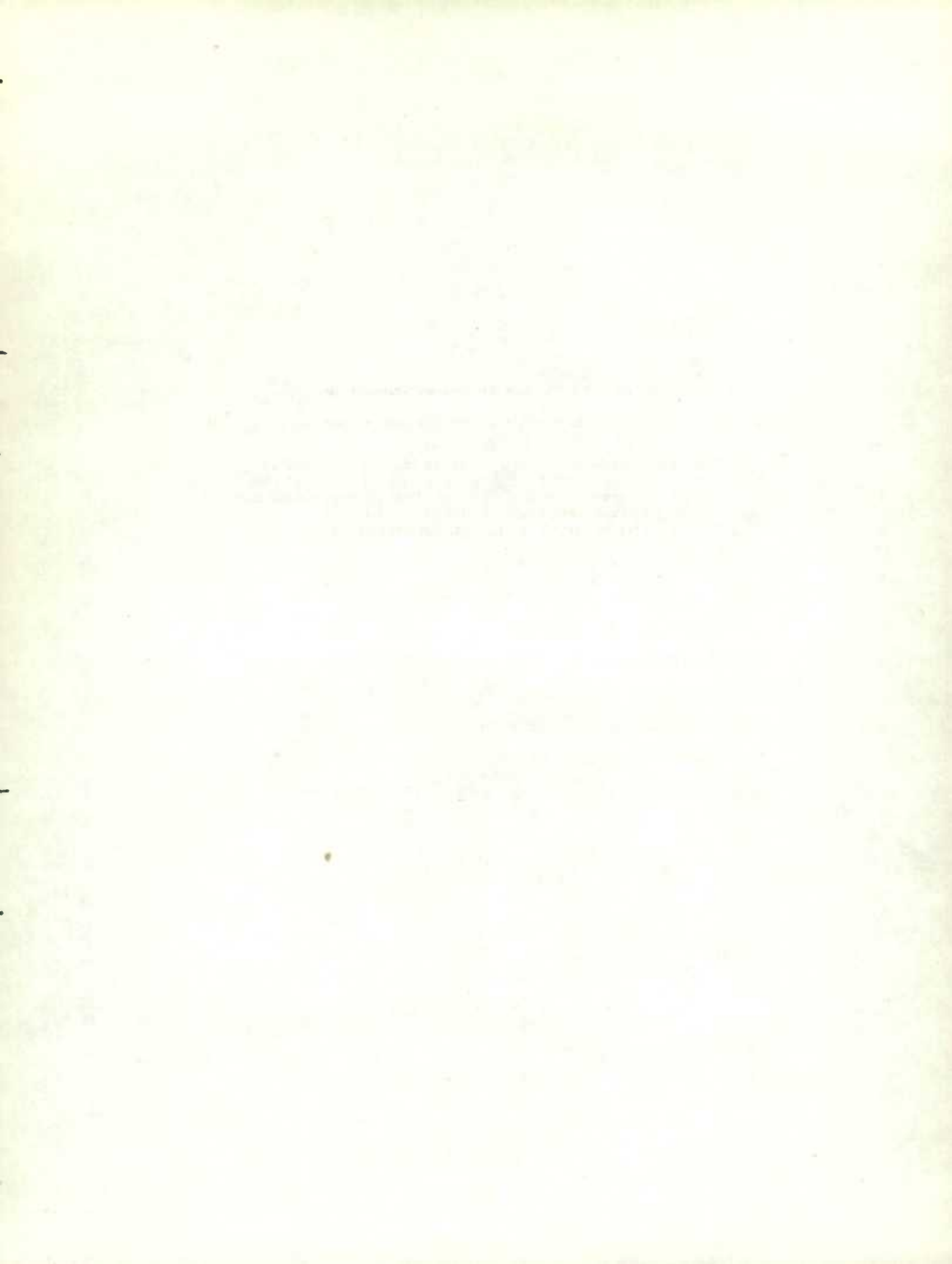

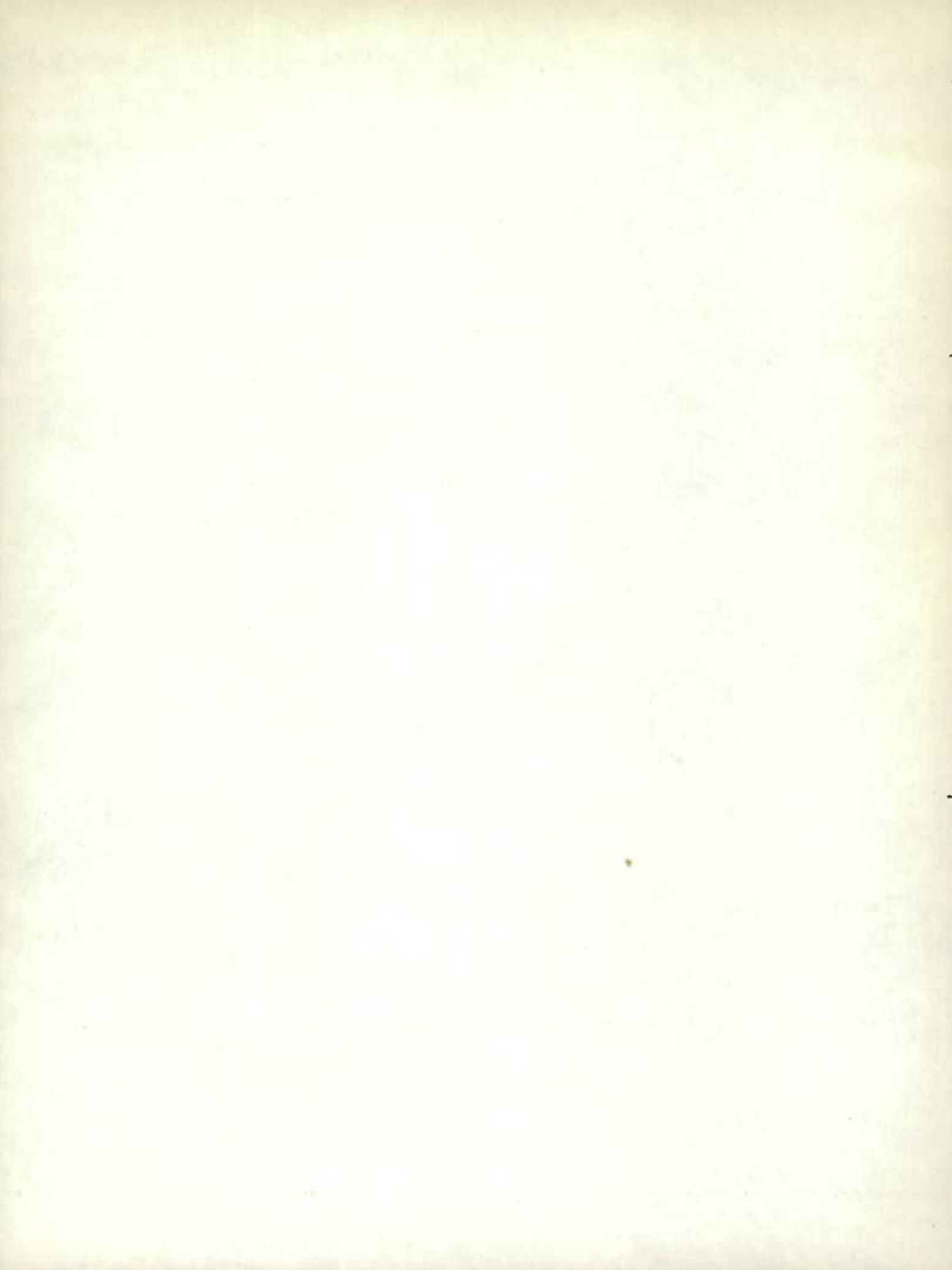

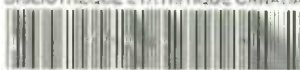
