RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

Year ended December 31, 1957

Railway freight traffic statistics presented in this publication are based on the new Freight Commodity Statistics Classification comprising 266 items adopted by all railways operating in Canada as of January 1, 1957. Comparable 1956 tonnage details based upon a classification of 90 items are presented in table 1 in total form only for each of the five commodity groups. The Grand Falls Central Railway was added to the list of reporting companies in 1957, bringing to 22 the number of class 1 and 2 roads comprising this report.

Freight Traffic

Revenue freight moved by railways operating in Canada totalled 172,343,005 tons during 1957, a decrease of 8.1 per cent from 187,623,304 in 1956. Both the national loadings and receipts from United States rail connections declined with loadings at Canadian Stations (including imports at lake or ocean ports), dropping 8.4 per cent to

141,902,974 tons from 154,835,815; U.S. receipts destined to Canada down 8.2 per cent to 14,131,244 from 15,392,017; and intransit traffic (United States to United States through Canada), down 6.2 per cent to 16,308,787 tons from 17,395,472. As in 1956, iron ore was the commodity carried in greatest volume with 19,880,320 tons moved in 1957, (19,935,556 in 1956). Bituminous coal and wheat were also carried in large quantities in both years with amounts of 13,862,366 and 13,141,528 tons respectively in 1957, (15,125,237 and 16,340,373 in 1956).

Freight terminating in Canada during the year amounted to 173,050,537 tons, a decline of 8.0 per cent from 188,072,422 in 1956. Of the 1957 total, 140,690,439 tons were unloaded at stations in Canada (including exports at lake or ocean ports) and 32,360,098 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections, (152,771,377 and 35,301,045 tons respectively for 1956).

Loadings

Of the 141,902,974 tons of freight loaded in Canada during 1957, mine products accounted for 63,477,403 tons or 44.7 per cent; manufactures and miscellaneous, 37,202,463 tons or 26.2 per cent; products of agriculture, 23,516,365 tons or 16.6 per cent; and products of forests, 14,825,685 tons or 10.4 per cent.

A provincial breakdown of tonnage loaded in Canada, (including that received from lake or ocean ports) shows that only Newfoundland registered a gain over the previous year with 1,596,093 tons in comparison with 1,407,867. British Columbia showed an 18.1 per cent drop to 10,884,178 tons from 13,295,008, largely attributable to a lighter volume of mine products which fell to 2,014,409 tons from 3,588,678. New Brunswick loadings decreased 15.2 per cent, Saskatchewan 13.4 per cent, and Manitoba 9.5 per cent. Loadings in the remaining provinces declined in varying degrees. Of the total revenue freight loaded in Canada during 1957, 81,086,859 tons or 57.1 per cent were handled at stations in Ontario and Quebec.

Receipts from United States Rail Connections

Of the 14,131,244 tons destined to Canadian points in 1957, Ontario received 9,644,251 tons and Quebec 2,426,970. Intransit traffic, (freight receipts from U.S. rail connections destined to the U.S.) aggregated 16,308,787 tons of which Ontario reported the greater portion at 13,951,945 tons with Quebec reporting 1,741,436. The remaining 615,406 tons were accounted for in the provinces of New Brunswick, Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia.

Net Movements

Net movement of revenue freight is the difference between freight originated, (including loadings

in Canada and receipts from U.S. rail connections) and freight terminated, (unloaded in Canada and delivered to U.S. rail) and is presented on pages 74-85. If freight originating in the Atlantic region exceeds the tonnage terminating in that area, the difference is the freight carried westward for delivery. Likewise, where terminating freight exceeds that originating the difference is the tonnage moved eastward. Since tonnages loaded and unloaded in each province includes imports and exports at lake or ocean ports as well as freight to and from local industry, it is no longer possible to show comprehensive provincial net export and import data.

The Atlantic Provinces — Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick

In 1957 there was a net movement of 773,033 revenue tons of freight into this area, a slight increase over the 707,051 tons in 1956. The major commodities moving into the region were wheat, flour, mill products not otherwise specified, flaxseed and manufactures and miscellaneous products. The principal items moved to other provinces were potatoes, bituminous coal, lumber, iron and steel, woodpulp and sugar.

Western Provinces — Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia

The net eastward movement of freight amounted to 11,221,853 tons as against 14,205,741 in 1956. Agricultural products accounted for 9,211,880 tons of the net export with wheat at 5,280,466 tons by far the largest single commodity. Other items moving outward were oats, barley, mill products, flaxseed, pulpwood and lumber. Inflowing freight consisted for the most part of manufactured products and miscellaneous commodities.

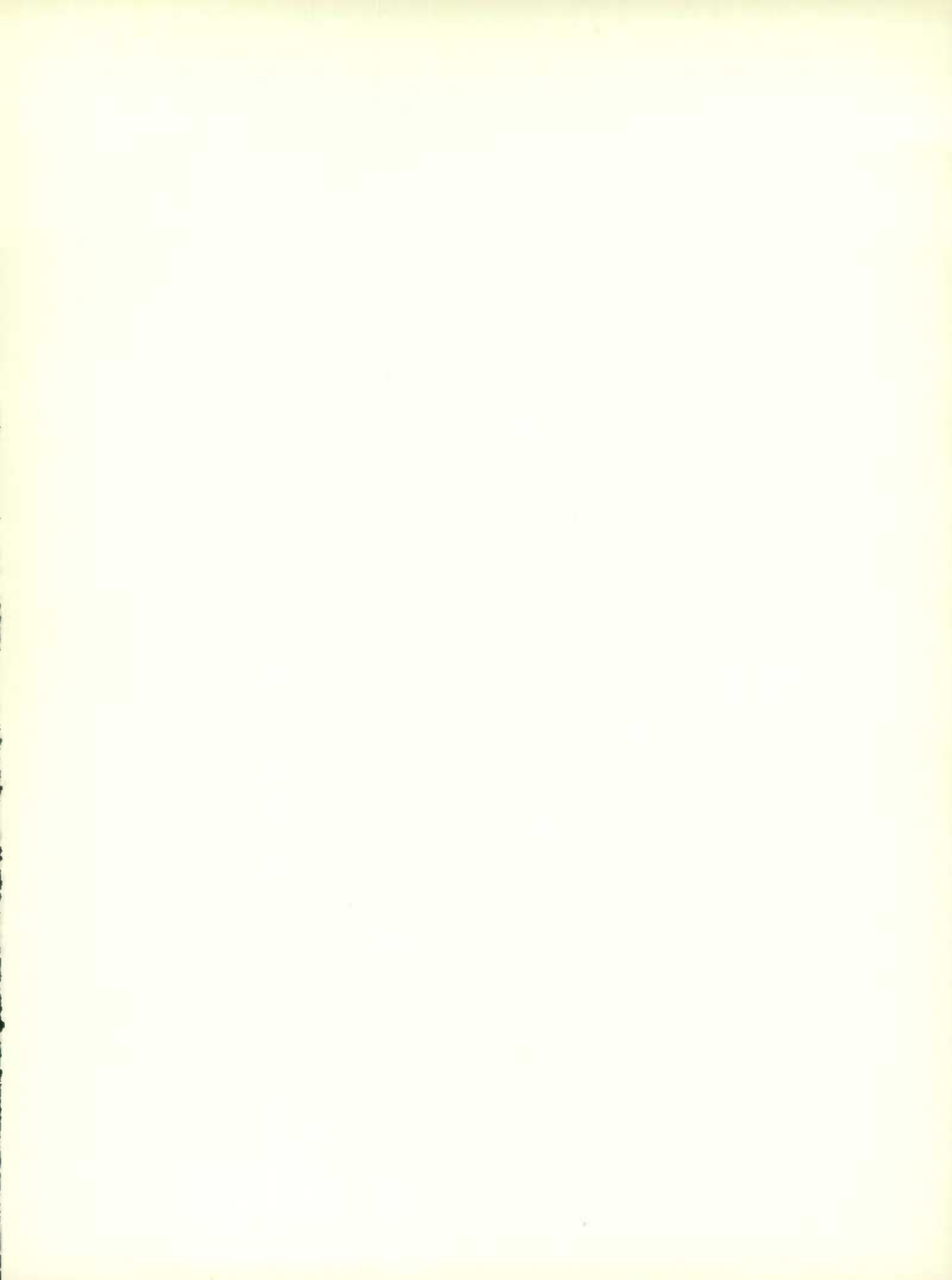
