RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

Year ended December 31, 1958

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of the following class I and II railways operating in Canada (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually).

Data in the succeeding tables exclude freight interchanged between Canadian roads since this traffic has already been reported as loaded and unloaded at points in Canada and would, if repeated, result in a duplication of the total tonnage carried. Freight unloaded and subsequently re-shipped is counted each time it is billed out.

Railways in Canada carried a total of 152,051,381 tons of revenue freight during 1958, a decline of 11.8 per cent from 172,343,005 in 1957. Both national loadings and receipts from United States rail connections were lower than the previous year with tonnages originated or loaded at stations in Canada (including waterborne imports) down 9.7 per cent to 128,095,375 tons from 141,902,974; receipts from U.S. rail destined to Canadian points were down 25.9 per cent to 10,477,658 tons from 14,131,244; and intransit traffic (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) was down 17.4 per cent to 13,478,384 tons from 16,308,787. The principal decreases occurred in such commodities as iron ore, pulpwood, bituminous coal and crude gypsum.

The volume of freight terminated by rail in Canada during the year, totalled 152,906,041 tons as against 173,050,537 a year earlier. Of the 1958 amount, 124,523,514 tons (140,690,439 in 1957) were unloaded at points in Canada (including exports at lake or ocean ports); and 28,382,527 tons (32,360,098) were delivered to U.S. rail connections.

During 1958 one railway, the British Columbia Electric, was added to the list of reporting companies, while the Hudson Bay Railway was absorbed into the Canadian National System.

Loadings

As an indication of the relative importance, in tonnage terms, of each of the five categories of railway freight traffic loaded in Canada in 1958, mine products accounted for 52,476,718 tons or 41.0 per cent of the total; manufactures and miscellaneous 35,259,081 tons or 27.5 per cent; products of agriculture 24,948,794 tons or 19.5 per cent; products of forests 13,002,380 tons or 10.2 per cent; and animals and products 1,163,345 tons or 0.9 per cent.

On a provincial basis, tonnages loaded, including water imports, declined in all but two provinces. The most significant of these occurred in Nova Scotia where loadings were down 19 per cent to 8,656,152 tons from 10,733,635. This drop was due mainly to a sharp cut back in loadings of crude gypsum. In Quebec the volume of freight loaded fell 17 per cent as a result of a 38 per cent decrease in iron ore loadings, offset in part by a 17 per cent increase in agricultural movements. New Brunswick loadings declined 13 per cent as a result of decreased pulpwood tonnages and freight loaded in Prince Edward Island dropped 12 per cent with fewer loadings of sand and gravel being mainly responsible.

Receipts from United States Rail Connections

Freight traffic received from U.S. rail connections destined to Canadian points totalled 10,477,658 tons, down 25.9 per cent from 14,131,244 in 1957. Receipts in Ontario fell to 7,060,119 tons from 9,644,251 and in Quebec the tonnage dropped to 1,665,503 tons from 2,426,970. British Columbia registered the only gain in receipts from the U.S. with 909,167 tons in contrast to 874,618 in 1957.

Commodities received from U.S. rail destined to U.S. points (intransit traffic) totalled 13,478,348 tons in 1958 as compared with 16,308,787 a year

earlier. Freight carried through New Brunswick, Quebec and Ontario declined during the year under review, whereas increases were recorded in each of the four Western provinces.

Net Movements

The net movement of revenue freight as presented in tables 12 and 13 is the difference between the total loaded in Canada and received from U.S. rail, and that unloaded in Canada and delivered to U.S. rail. If loadings and receipts in the Atlantic Region exceed tonnages unloaded or delivered in that area, the difference is the amount of freight carried westward for delivery. A reversal of this situation would indicate a net movement eastward into the area.

The Atlantic Provinces — Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick

The net movement of commodities to this region during 1958 aggregated 999,413 tons as against 773,033 tons in 1957. In both years, traffic moving into the area from other provinces for consumption or export consisted for the most part of agricultural products and manufactures and miscellaneous. The principal items moved to other parts of Canada were mine products.

Western Provinces — Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia

The net movement of freight from the Western provinces eastward totalled 12,020,030 tons in 1958, up from 11,221,853 a year earlier. Agricultural products, particularly wheat, oats and barley, were the commodities moved in greater volume in both periods. Traffic moving into the region from Eastern Canada consisted mainly of manufactures and miscellaneous items.

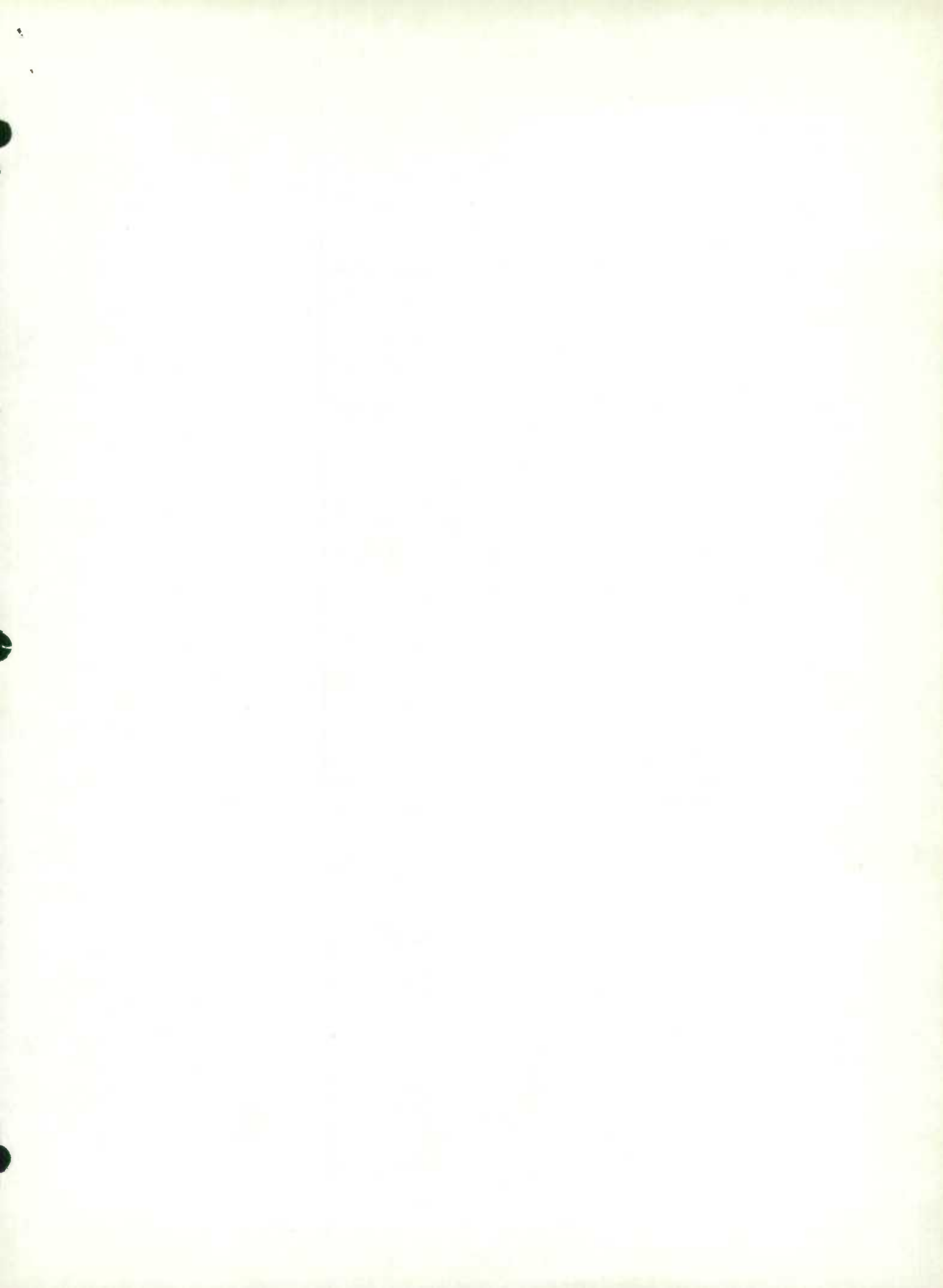
