RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

Year ended December 31, 1959

Presented in this publication is a twelve-month summary of revenue freight traffic statistics as reported by the following Class I and II railways operating in Canada.

This data has been reported on the basis of the expanded Canadian Freight Commodity Statistics Classification adopted for use January 1, 1957. Freight interchanged between Canadian roads is not duplicated in the following tables, but freight unloaded and subsequently re-shipped is counted each time it is billed out.

During 1959 the twenty-two reporting roads carried a total of 164,809,587 tons of revenue freight, an increase of 8.4 per cent from 152,051,381 tons in 1958. Both national loadings and receipts from United States rail connections were greater with tonnages loaded at stations in Canada (including waterborne imports) up 9.1 per cent to 139,766,753 from 128,095,375 tons; receipts from U.S. rail destined to Canadian points up 4.2 per cent to 10,917,356 tons from 10,477,658; and in-transit freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) up 4.8 per cent to 14,125,478 tons from 13,478,348.

The volume of freight terminated by rail in Canada during 1959 totalled 165,196,702 tons as against 152,906,041 a year earlier. Of the 1959 aggregate, 135,332,310 tons (124,523,514 in 1958) were unloaded at stations in the Dominion and 29,864,392 tons (28,382,527) were delivered to United States rail connections.

Loadings

Analyzed by commodity groups, loadings during the year improved over 1958 in only two of the five major categories. Mine products, which accounted for 45.6 per cent of all commodities loaded, rose 21.5 per cent to 63,782,034 tons from 52,476,718, chiefly as a result of increased movements of iron ore and crude gypsum. Manufactures and miscellaneous items were up 5.2 per cent to 37,084,712 tons from 35,259,081 with the largest increases recorded in the movement of manufactured iron and steel, woodpulp and miscellaneous carload traffic in which piggyback movements are included. Decreases were registered in loadings of agricultural commodities, particularly grain and grain products; animals and products; and products of forests, especially pulpwood and lumber. Less-than-carload traffic was down slightly from the previous year.

A provincial breakdown of revenue freight loadings, including water imports, showed that only Prince Edward Island, Manitoba and Saskatchewan registered declines during 1959. In Nova Scotia loadings were up 30.3 per cent as a result of increased gypsum movements, while in Quebec heavier shipments of iron ore were mainly responsible for a 20.1 per cent increase in that province. New Brunswick and Ontario loadings were up 9.9 and 7.6 per cent respectively. The volume of freight loaded in Saskatchewan declined 11.5 per cent during the year due mainly to a reduction in the movement of grain and grain products and in Prince Edward Island, a decrease in rail loadings of potatoes accounted for a 5.1 per cent drop in tonnages originating in that area.

Receipts from United States Rail Connections

Commodities received from U.S. rail connections destined to Canadian points rose slightly in 1959 to 10,917,356 tons, up from 10,477,658 a year earlier. An examination of this traffic reveals substantial increases in imports of soybean oil cake and meal, 236,696 tons (as against 133,131 in 1958); ores and concentrates, n.o.s., 152,517 (56,969); industrial sand, 621,678 (526,574); sulphur, 111,480 (30,666); logs, butts and bolts, 40,880 (12,796); and scrap iron and scrap steel, 267,167 (99,785). Decreases were recorded for the following items: anthracite coal, 1,348,119 tons (1,449,435); manufactured iron and steel, 256,400 (351,971); and iron and steel pipe, n.o.s., 75,571 (228,031). More in-

transit freight moved through Canada during 1959 with 14,125,478 tons received from U.S. rail connections destined to U.S. points as compared with 13,478,348 tons in 1958.

Net Movements

The net movement of revenue freight as presented in tables 12 and 13 on pages 74-85 is the difference between the total tonnage loaded in Canada and received from U.S. rail, and that unloaded in Canada and delivered to U.S. connections. If, for instance, loadings and receipts in the Atlantic Region exceeds tonnages unloaded or delivered in that area, the difference must have been carried westward, either for unloading in the other provinces or for delivery to U.S. rail connections at a junction point in Quebec or provinces west. A reversal of this would indicate a net movement into the area from across the Quebec boundary.

The Atlantic Provinces—Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick

The net movement of freight to the Atlantic provinces during 1959 aggregated 468,180 tons, down 53.2 per cent from 999,413 in 1958. This decline was largely attributed to a greater movement of forest products to other provinces during 1959 which resulted in a provincial export of 216,288 tons in contrast to a net movement of 61,500 tons into the area a year earlier. Manufactured and miscellaneous commodities also showed a complete reversal with a net outward movement of 41,406 tons during the year under review as opposed to an inward movement of 48,515 tons a year earlier. As in previous years, traffic moving into the Maritimes from other provinces consisted for the most part of agricultural and animal products.

Western Provinces—Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia

The net movement of freight from Western Canada eastward totalled 11,141,528 tons, down from 12,020,030 tons in 1958. Agricultural and forest products, particularly wheat, oats, barley, lumber, shingles and lath were the commodities moved in greater volume during both years. Traffic moving into the region consisted mainly of manufactures and miscellaneous.
