RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

Year ended December 31, 1960

Presented in this publication is a twelve-month summary of revenue freight traffic statistics as reported by the following Class I and II railways operating in Canada.

This data has been reported on the basis of the expanded Canadian Freight Commodity Statistics Classification adopted for use January 1, 1957. Freight interchanged between Canadian roads is not duplicated in the following tables, but freight unloaded and subsequently re-shipped is counted each time it is billed out.

Revenue freight carried by the twenty-two reporting roads during 1960 totalled 157,383,057 tons, a decrease of 4.5 per cent from 164,809,587 tons in 1959. Of the 1960 total, 133,029,930 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports), down 4.8 per cent from 139,766,753 tons. Receipts from U.S. rail connections destined to points in Canada dropped 11.8 per cent to 9,631,773 tons from 10,917,356, while in-transit freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) rose 4.2 per cent to 14,721,354 tons from 14,125,478.

Freight unloaded in Canada during the year amounted to 158,260,609 tons, a decline of 4.2 per cent from 165,196,702 a year earlier. Of the 1960 amount, 127,911,443 tons (135,332,310 in 1959); were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers); and 30,349,166 tons (29,864,392 in 1959); were delivered to United States rail connections.

Loadings

A breakdown of freight loadings by commodity groups shows that four of the five categories registered decreases over the previous year. Animals and products recorded the largest decline, dropping 8.2 per cent. Products of mines declined 7.4 per cent; products of agriculture were down 5.6 per cent; and manufactures and miscellaneous decreased 2.7 per cent. Products of forests were moved in greater quantity due mainly to increased shipments of logs, butts, and bolts.

On a provincial basis, loadings declined in six of the ten provinces. The most significant of these occurred in Nova Scotia where loadings dropped 13.9 per cent to 9,714,503 tons from 11,282,035. This drop was due mainly to a decline in the movement of crude gypsum. Freight loaded in Prince Edward Island fell 8.1 per cent with fewer shipments of potatoes being mainly responsible, while in Manitoba loadings declined 7.5 per cent as a result of decreased movements of wheat. Freight loaded in Ontario declined 7.2 per cent with wheat and iron ore tonnages dropping extensively. Newfoundland loadings rose 9.8 per cent to 1,617,786 tons from 1,473,152, the increase being largely attributable to a greater movement of pulpwood. Other increases in freight loadings occurred in British Columbia, Alberta and New Brunswick.

Receipts from United States Rail Connections

Freight traffic received from U.S. rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 9,631,773 tons, down 11.8 per cent from 10,917,356 a year earlier. Decreases were recorded in the following commodities: anthracite coal, 1,016,650 tons (1,348,119 in 1959); bituminous coal, 1,023,045 (1,328,632); sulphur, 22,481 (111,480); soybean oil cake and meal, 173,869 (236,696); and ores and concentrates, n.o.s., 94,181 (152,517). Phosphate rock was the principal commodity imported in greater volume, increasing to 617,075 tons from 451,534. More intransit freight moved through Canada during

the year with 14,721,354 tons received from U.S. rail connections destined to U.S. points as compared with 14,125,478 in the previous year.

Net Movements

The net movement of revenue freight as presented in tables 12 and 13 on pages 74-85 is the difference between the total tonnage loaded in Canada and received from U.S. rail, and that unloaded in Canada and delivered to U.S. connections. If, for instance, loadings and receipts in the Atlantic Region exceeds tonnages unloaded or delivered in that area, the difference must have been carried westward, either for unloading in the other provinces or for delivery to U.S. rail connections at a junction point in Quebec or provinces west. A reversal of this would indicate a net movement into the area from across the Quebec boundary.

The Atlantic Provinces — Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick

The net movement of commodities to this region during 1960 aggregated 147,253 tons, down 68.5 per cent from 468,180 in 1959. Manufactures and miscellaneous showed a complete reversal from the previous year with a net inward movement of 121,378 tons as opposed to a net outward movement of 41,406 tons in 1959. Traffic moving into the Maritimes from other provinces consisted for the most part of agricultural, animal, and manufactures and miscellaneous products.

Western Provinces — Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia

The net movement of freight from the western provinces eastward totalled 11,156,722 tons, up from 11,141,528 tons in the previous year. Agricultural and forest products; particularly wheat, oats, barley, lumber, shingles and lath were the principal commodities outbound from this area in both years. Traffic moving into the region consisted mainly of manufactures and miscellaneous products.
