# RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

Year ended December 31, 1961

Presented in this publication are revenue freight commodity statistics reported by the undernoted class 1 and 2 common carrier railways operating in Canada.

These data have been reported in accordance with the Canadian Freight Commodity Statistics Classification adopted January 1, 1957, and are based on cumulative monthly returns relating to the period January 1 to December 31, 1961. Certain corrections not appearing in figures published for each month of the year are included herein.

Railways operating between Canada and the United States consider that portion of their line south of the border a U.S. rail connection. Thus freight coming into Canada or going into the U.S. by way of these roads is reported as received from or delivered to a U.S. rail connection. This does not apply to traffic moving over the one or two in-transit routes of the C.N.R. and C.P.R. (Canada to Canada through the United States) or the short mileages operated by these lines between the international boundary and connecting U.S. carriers. For purposes of this report these are considered Canadian operations. Intransit traffic through Canada to and from the U.S. is shown as deliveries to and receipts from U.S. connections. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this report, but that which is unloaded and subsequently re-shipped is counted each time it is billed out.

The net movement of commodities, as presented in tables 12 and 13 (pages 74-85), is the difference between the total tonnage loaded in Canada and received from U.S. rail, and the total tonnage unloaded in Canada and delivered to U.S. connections. If, for instance, loadings and receipts in the Atlantic Region exceeds tonnages unloaded and delivered in that area, the difference must have been carried westward, either for unloading in the other provinces or for delivery to U.S. rail connections at a junction point in Quebec or provinces west. A reversal of this would indicate a net movement into the area from across the Quebec boundary.

Revenue freight handled by the twenty-two reporting railways during 1961 totalled 152,114,254 tons, a 3.3 per cent decline from 157,383,057 tons in 1960. Of the 1961 aggregate, 130,447,651 tons originated or were loaded at Canadian stations (including waterborne imports), down 1.9 per cent from 133,029,930 the previous year. Receipts from United States rail connections destined for Canada decreased 4.8 per cent to 9,173,209 tons from 9,631,773 and intransit movements (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) fell off 1.5 per cent to 12,493,394 tons from 14,721,354.

Freight tonnages terminated or unloaded in Canada during the year amounted to 152,399,246, a drop of 3.7 per cent from 158,260,609 tons a year earlier. The 1961 figure includes 124,569,615 tons terminated or unloaded at stations in Canada, including deliveries to water carriers, (127,911,443 tons in 1960) and 27,829,631 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections (30,349,166).

### Loadings

An analysis of freight loadings by commodity groups shows that only one of the five major categories registered an increase over the previous twelve-month period. Mine products which accounted for 42.5 per cent of all commodities loaded in 1961, were down 6.3 per cent to 55,382,265 tons from 59,090,912 with iron ore being the main item contributing to the decline. Products of forests decreased 2.5 per cent, animal products 1.9 per cent, and manufactures and miscellaneous 0.3 per cent. Less-than-carload traffic (l.c.l.) was down 10.7 per cent. Agricultural products were loaded in greater volume during the year under review up 7.7 per cent to 24,054,826 tons in 1961 as against 22,334,308 a year previous. This increase was due mainly to heavier movements of wheat to the west coast for shipment to the Orient.

On a provincial basis 1961 rail freight loadings were greater in Nova Scotia, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia but were down in all other areas. In Quebec, corn, barley and other grains were moved in greater volume. However, significant declines in animal products and iron ore resulted in an overall decrease of 9.8 per cent. Freight loadings at stations in New Brunswick fell off 8.1 per cent

during the year and this was attributable to decreases in the volume of bituminous coal and pulpwood handled. Newfoundland also recorded fewer tonnages of pulpwood and, as a result, loadings in that province were down 3.9 per cent. Declines of 1.8, 1.0 and 0.2 per cent were registered in Ontario, Manitoba and Prince Edward Island, respectively. Wheat loadings in Saskatchewan, which were up 1.5 million tons over the previous year, accounted almost entirely for an 8.4 per cent increase in traffic in that province; while loadings in British Columbia, on the strength of heavier lumber and pulpwood movements, were up 4.1 per cent from 1960. Traffic in Alberta exceeded year earlier figures by 3.5 per cent and Nova Scotia loadings rose 0.9 per cent.

### Receipts from United States Rail Connections

Commodities received from U.S. rail for delivery in Canada totalled 9,173,209 tons, down 4.8 per cent from 9,631,773 tons in 1960. The principal items contributing to this decline were: anthracite coal, 786,010 tons (1,016,650 tons in 1960); bituminous coal, 788,612 tons (1,023,045); and scrap iron and steel, 124,136 tons (282,962). Items imported in greater quantity included phosphate rock 729,945 tons (617,075); and hides, skins and pelts, 44,332 tons (23,906).

### The Atlantic Provinces - Newfoundland, Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick

The net movement of freight to the Maritime region during 1961 aggregated 824,842 tons, over five times as much as the 147,253 tons reported in 1960. The eastward movement of wheat into the area increased to 774,580 tons from 650,020 while shipments of potatoes to other provinces fell to 254,839 tons from 370,072. Most of the coal loaded in the Atlantic Provinces is unloaded at Maritime ports for furtherance by water, however, in the year under review, 641,921 tons moved westward, down from 759,517 a year earlier. Tonnages of iron and steel billets, blooms and ingots moving to other provinces fell off to 81,577 tons from 184,855, while the volume of woodpulp moving out of the area by rail increased to 217,611 tons from 123,023.

### The Western Provinces - Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia

The net movement of revenue freight out of the western provinces totalled 11,889,254 tons in 1961, up slightly from 11,156,722 the previous year. Shipments of wheat to eastern ports rose to 7,127,726 tons from 6,282,415 in 1960 and tonnages of bituminous coal increased to 85,562 from 49,204. The eastward movement of crude petroleum by rail was substantially lower, dropping to 6,470 tons from 86,740 a year earlier. Lumber outbound from the area totalled 2,041,184 tons in contrast to 1,870,057, while woodpulp movements declined to 447,107 tons from 470,776. Shipments of newsprint paper into the western provinces rose to 213,572 from 192,951.




