

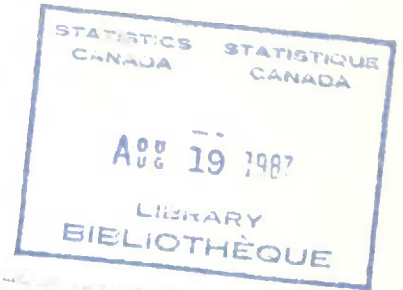

INTRODUCTION

Presented in this publication are revenue freight commodity statistics reported by the undernoted class 1 and 2 common carrier railways operating in Canada:

These data have been reported in accordance with the Canadian Freight Commodity Statistics Classification adopted January 1, 1957, and are based on cumulative monthly returns relating to the period January 1 to December 31, 1962. Certain corrections not appearing in figures published for each month of the year are included herein.

The terms used in the column headings reflect the following provisions of the instructions to the carriers:

"Originated or loaded" indicates: (a) Revenue freight originated directly on the road of the respondent, including that received from private non-

reporting industrial sidings; (b) Freight not previously given line haul transportation, received from switching roads connecting with the respondent; (c) Imports at lake or ocean ports; (d) Freight re-shipped following milling or fabrication at some point in transit.

"Received from U.S. Rail destined to Canadian points" means: Traffic destined to Canadian points received from United States rail connections or transported across the border by the respondent.

"Received from U.S. rail destined to U.S. points" means: Receipts from United States rail connections destined to points in the United States (overhead traffic).

"Terminated or unloaded" means: (a) Freight terminated directly on the road of the respondent, including that delivered to private non-reporting industrial sidings and grain unloaded at interior, lake and coastal elevators for export; (b) Freight delivered to switching roads connecting with the respondent where there is no further line haul; (c) Exports at lake or ocean ports; (d) Freight unloaded for milling or fabrication at some point in transit.

"Delivered to U.S. rail connections" means: (a) Traffic delivered to United States rail connections or transported across the border by the respondent; (b) Deliveries to United States rail connections of freight originated in the U.S. and moved overhead through Canada.

Railways operating between Canada and the United States consider that portion of their line south of the border a U.S. rail connections. Thus, freight crossing the International Boundary, whether received from or delivered to another railway at that point or transported by the respondent, is reported as receipts from or deliveries to U.S. rail connections. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this report.

The net movement of commodities, as presented in tables 12 and 13 (pages 74-85), is the difference between the total tonnage loaded in Canada and received from U.S. rail, and the total tonnage unloaded in Canada and delivered to U.S. connections. If, for instance, loadings and receipts in the Western Provinces exceed tonnages unloaded and delivered in that area, the difference must have been carried eastward, either for unloading in the other provinces or for delivery to U.S. rail connections at junction points east of Manitoba. A reversal of this situation would indicate a net movement into the area from points east.

1962 operations

In order to present an analysis of rail revenue freight tonnage which is most significant to the economy of Canada, freight tonnage originating in the United States which passes through Canada en route to a destination in the United States has been excluded. Such movement may be referred to as "overhead" traffic. The following analysis is, therefore, based on the sum of the first two columns in the commodity tables; i.e., revenue freight originated or loaded at stations in Canada (includes imports at lake or ocean ports) and revenue freight received from U.S. (rail) destined to Canadian points. For the purpose of this analysis, the sum of the first two columns may be referred to as "net".

The net revenue freight tonnage reported by the above named railways totalled 144, 327, 434 tons in 1962, — an increase of 3.4 per cent over the previous year. Products of mines showed an increase of 7.6 per cent over the previous year, followed by forest products, -6.5 per cent; and, manufactures and miscellaneous, -5.7 per cent. Decreases were recorded for animal products, (-12.4 per cent); products of agriculture, (-11.4 per cent); and, less-than-carload (l.c.l.) traffic, — (less than one per cent decrease).

Products of mines

Iron ore accounted for 35 per cent of the total products of mines. The net revenue traffic in iron ore increased by over 5 millions tons in 1962 to a total of 22,075,302 tons. The opening in 1962 of the Cartier Railway Company lines in Quebec contributed considerably to the iron ore tonnage increase.

The remaining 65 percent of mine products consisted mostly of: 9,684,147 tons of bituminous coal (15.3 per cent of the total products of mines); 5,011,992 tons of stone and rock; broken, ground and crushed (7.9 per cent); 4,907,366 tons of gravel and sand (7.8 per cent); 4,451,586 tons of crude gypsum (7.0 per cent); 2,857,401 tons of copper-nickel ore and concentrates (4.5 per cent); and 1,808,218 tons of aluminum ore (2.9 per cent).

The most notable increases in net revenue freight tonnage in 1962 over the previous year in order of rank were: iron ore, crude gypsum, zinc ore and concentrates, sulphur, phosphate rock and salt.

The most notable decreases were: copper-nickel ore and concentrates, bituminous coal, aluminum, coke and anthracite coal.

Forest products

The net revenue freight tonnage of forest products consisted chiefly of 6,020,304 tons of lumber, shingles and lath (41.8 per cent of the total weight of forest products); 4,756,210 tons of pulpwood (30.3 per cent); and, 2,227,913 logs, butts and bolts (15.4 per cent).

Manufactures and miscellaneous

Six commodities accounted for over 40 per cent of the net revenue tonnage of manufactured goods during 1962. 3,991,910 tons of newsprint accounted for 9.7 per cent of total manufactures and miscellaneous. 3,028,042 tons of fuel, coal and petroleum residual oils accounted for 7.4 per cent; 2,866,472 tons of woodpulp accounted for 7.0 per cent; 2,801,217 tons of gasoline accounted for 6.8 per cent; 2,345,087 tons of fertilizer accounted for 5.7 per cent; and, 1,602,749 tons of iron and steel manufactures accounted for 3.9 per cent.

Products of agriculture

Over half (58.7 per cent) of the total tonnage of agricultural products in 1962 was wheat. Wheat tonnage in 1962 amounted to 13,231,419 tons, a decrease of 1,706,787 tons from the previous year. The tonnage of barley, 1,701,382 tons, which comprised 7.5 per cent of the total decreased by 973,258 tons during the same period. Other significant decreases were mill products (183,237 tons decrease) and sugar beets (172,968 tons decrease). The most significant increase was potatoes, which amounted to 571,294 tons, — an increase of 126,164 tons over the previous year.

Animals and products

Reduced movements of livestock accounted for most of the decrease in total tonnage of animals and products carried in 1962.

Commodity ratios

The division by weight of net rail freight tonnage in 1962 was: products of mines — 44.5 per cent; manufactured goods — 28.5 per cent; products of agriculture — 15.6 per cent; forest products — 10.0 per cent; less-than-carload shipments — 0.8 per cent and animal products — 0.6 per cent. Chart I is a ten year ratio pattern of net revenue freight tonnage carried by railways in Canada.

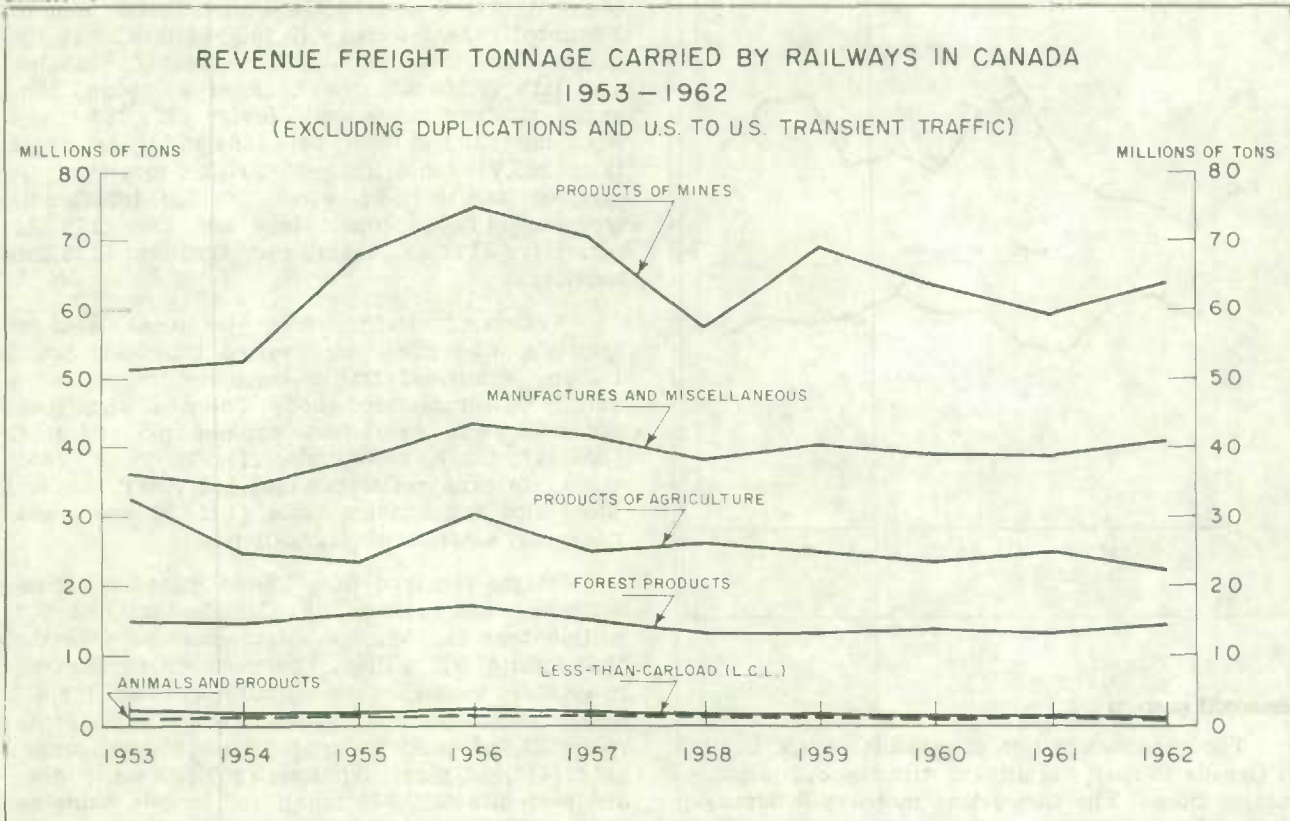
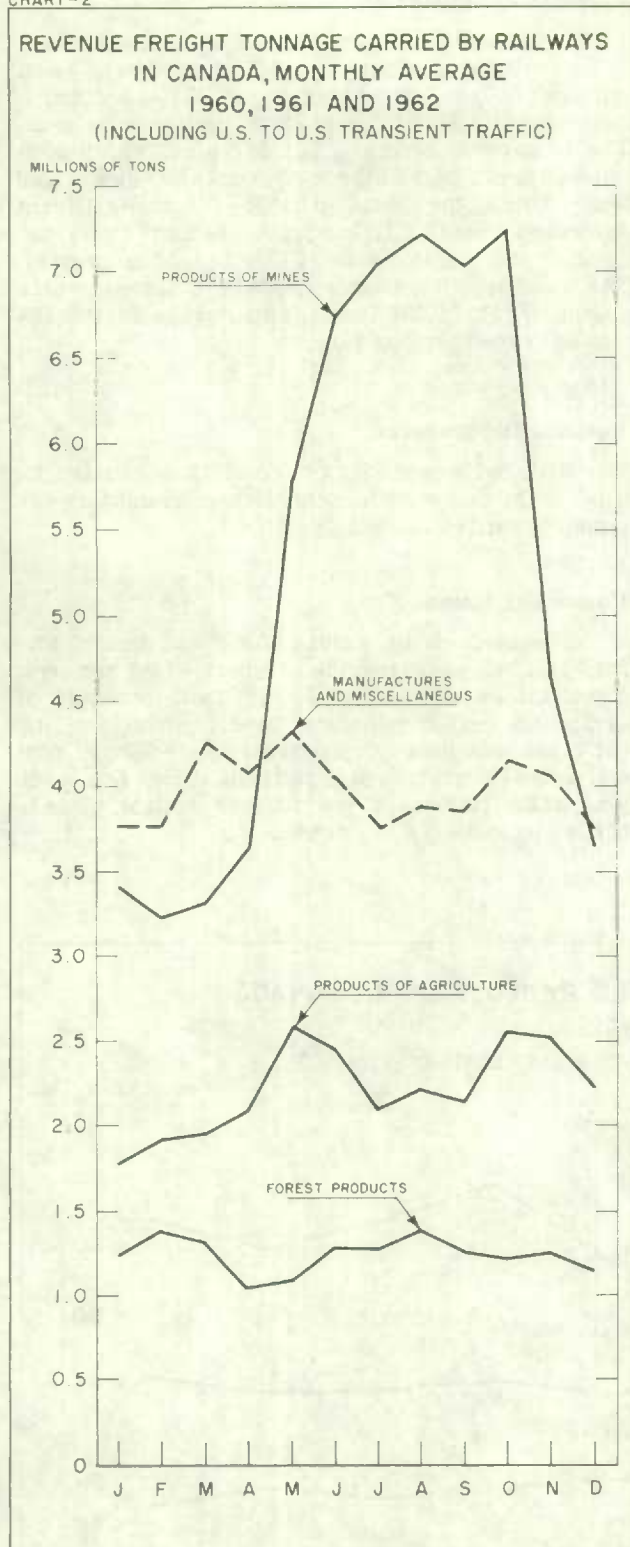

Seasonal pattern

The seasonal pattern of revenue freight traffic in Canada is most significant with respect to products of mines. The tremendous increase in tonnage moved from April to June and a corresponding

decrease from October to December correlates with the traffic pattern on the St. Lawrence Seaway. There is also some correlation in the seasonal pattern of tonnage of agricultural products and tonnage of manufactured products. The seasonal pattern of forest products is somewhat inverse to that of agriculture.

Geographic pattern

On a geographic basis, 1962 rail freight loadings increased in the Eastern Division of the country and in British Columbia, but were down in Ontario and the Prairie Provinces. Loadings in the Maritimes were up 6 per cent, while freight unloadings in the region rose by slightly over 1 per cent. The resultant net movement from other provinces into the Atlantic area dropped sharply in 1962 from 824,842 tons in 1961 to 68,925 tons in 1962.

Commodities entering the Atlantic area from other provinces in largest volume were wheat (589,765 tons), wheat flour (296,976 tons), soybeans oil cake and meal (100,521 tons) and manufactured iron and steel (99,879 tons). Outgoing movements of largest volume to other provinces were bituminous coal (1,254,826 tons); potatoes (282,674 tons); woodpulp (278,492 tons); lumber, shingles and lath (167,313 tons); sugar (166,928 tons); salt (147,585 tons); iron and steel; billet, bloom and ingot (99,926 tons); and paper, fibreboard and pulpboard (98,131 tons).

In the Western Provinces, the net freight movement amounted to 10,423,187 tons eastward (some of which entered the United States east of Manitoba). Wheat tonnage (5,762,565 tons) was the largest movement followed by lumber, shingles and lath (2,169,879 tons). Other eastbound tonnages of significance were: barley (772,783 tons); woodpulp (538,895 tons); oats (384,157 tons); wheat flour (356,739 tons); flaxseed (307,586 tons); veneer, plywood and built-up wood (288,320 tons); mill products (179,685 tons); lead and zinc (175,551 tons); rye (174,037 tons); and, fertilizer (170,056 tons).

Westbound traffic from provinces east of Manitoba was much more varied than east bound traffic. Westbound traffic consisted chiefly of a variety of manufactured goods. The most significant net movements were: manufactured iron and steel (306,547 tons); newsprint (211,505 tons); food, n.o.s., in cans not frozen (204,158 tons); iron and steel pipe and fittings, n.o.s. (132,025 tons); and, passenger automobiles (120,905 tons).

Freight received from United States rail connections, for delivery in Canada, totalled 9.3 million tons in 1962,—a slight increase over the 1961 total of 9.2 million. The commodities received in greatest tonnage were: bituminous coal (788,612 tons); anthracite coal (786,010 tons); phosphate rock (729,945 tons); industrial sand (560,802 tons); coke (476,993 tons); fertilizer (267,503 tons); clay and bentonite (233,979 tons); and lumber, shingles and lath (230,891 tons).

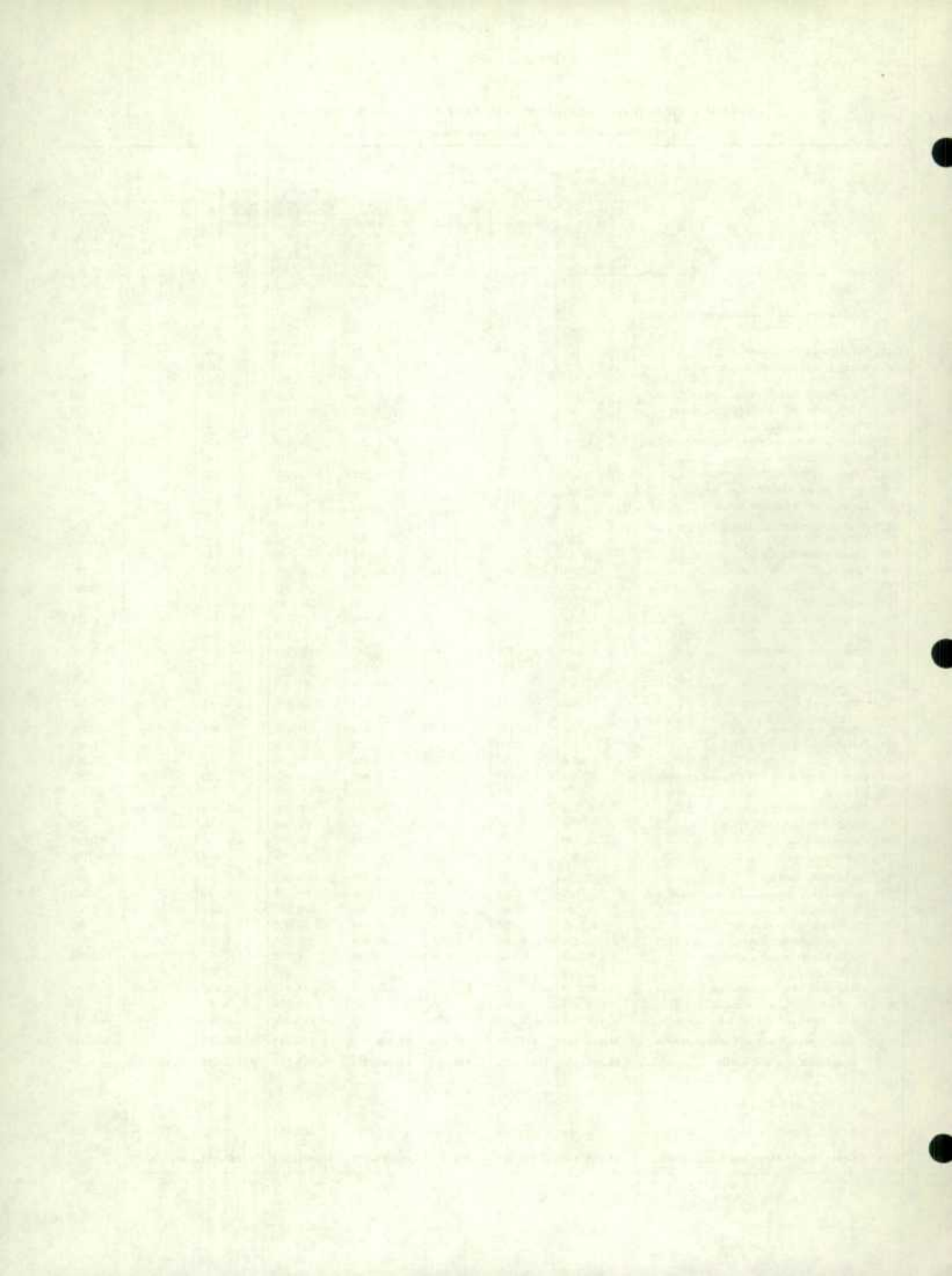

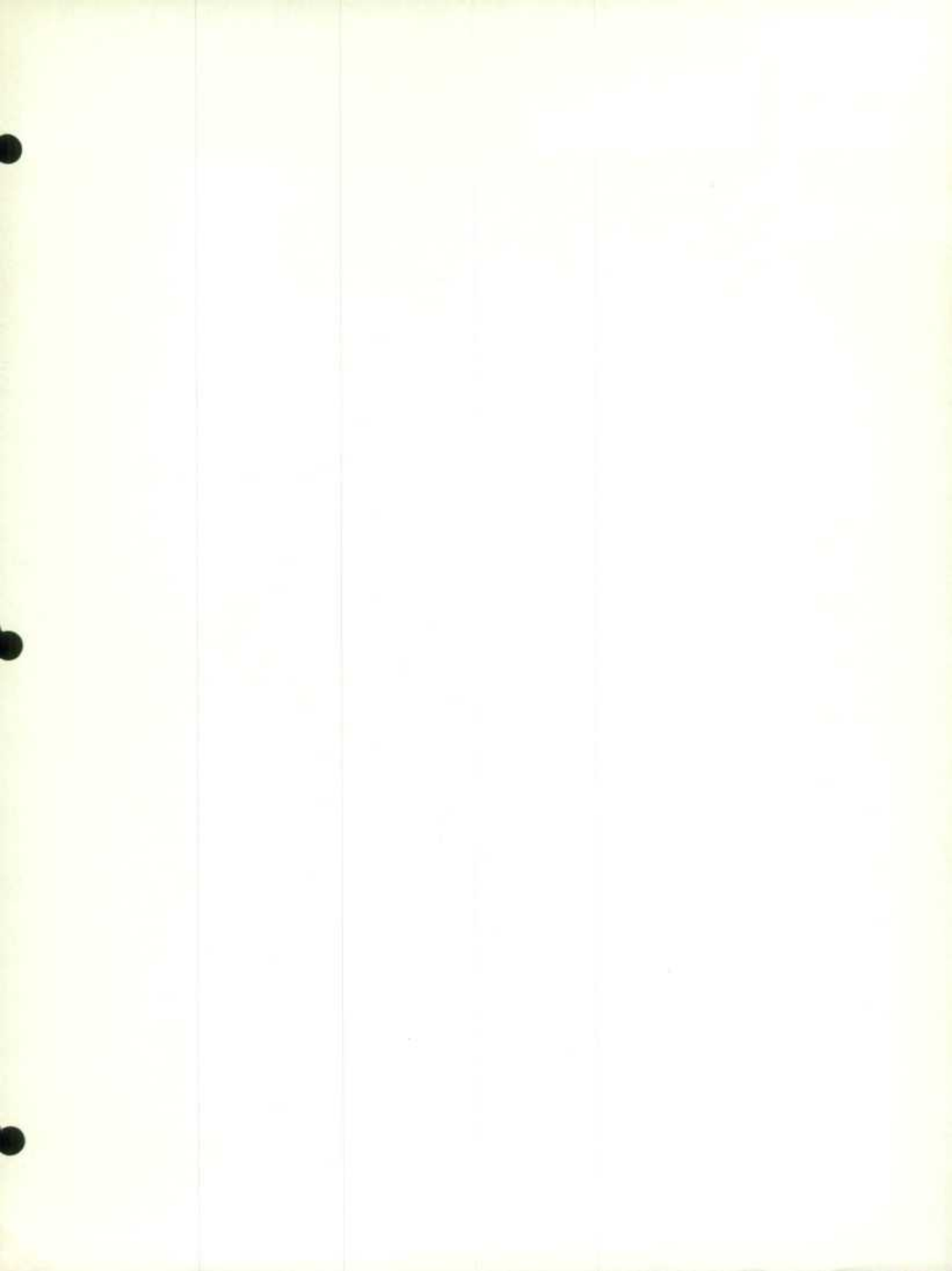
