## INTRODUCTION

Presented in this publication are revenue freight commodity statistics reported by the undernoted class 1 and 2 common carrier railways operating in Canada:

These data have been reported in accordance with the Canadian Freight Commodity Statistics Classification adopted January 1, 1957, and are based on cumulative monthly returns relating to the period January 1 to December 31, 1963. Certain corrections not appearing in figures published for each month of the year are included herein.

A "common carrier" as referred to in this series means any person who holds himself out to the general public to transport passengers or goods for compensation.

The terms used in the column headings of this report reflect the following provisions of the instructions to the carriers:

"Originated or loaded" indicates: (a) Revenue freight originated directly on the road of the respondent,

including that received from private, non-reporting industrial sidings; (b) Freight not previously given line haul transportation, received from switching roads connecting with the respondent; (c) Imports at lake or ocean ports; (d) Freight reshipped following milling or fabrication at some point in transit.

"Received from U.S. Rail destined to Canadian points" means: Traffic destined to Canadian points received from United States rail connections or transported across the border by the respondent.

"Received from U.S. rail destined to U.S. points" means: Receipts from United States rail connections destined to points in the United States (overhead traffic).

"Terminated or unloaded" means: (a) Freight terminated directly on the road of the respondent, including that delivered to private, non-reporting industrial sidings and grain unloaded at interior, lake and coastal elevators for export; (b) Freight delivered to switching roads connecting with the respondent where there was no further line haul; (c) Exports at lake or ocean ports; (d) Freight unloaded for milling or fabrication at some point in transit.

"Delivered to U.S. rail connections" means: (a) Traffic delivered to United States rail connections or transported across the border by the respondent; (b) Deliveries to United States rail connections of freight originated in the U.S. and moved overhead through Canada.

Railways operating between Canada and the United States consider that portion of their line south of the border a U.S. rail connection. Thus, freight crossing the International Boundary, whether received from or delivered to another railway at that point or transported by the respondent, is reported as receipts from or deliveries to U.S. rail connections. Freight interchanged between common carrier railways in Canada does not appear in these statistics since this traffic is included as loaded and unloaded on the respondents' line and would, if repeated, result in a duplication.

The net movement of commodities, as presented in Tables 13 and 14, is the difference between the total tonnage loaded in Canada and received from U.S. rail, and the total tonnage unloaded in Canada and delivered to U.S. connections. If, for instance, loadings and receipts in the Western Provinces exceed tonnages unloaded and delivered in that area, the difference must have been carried eastward, either for unloading in the other provinces or for delivery to U.S. rail connections at junction points east of Manitoba. A reversal of this situation would indicate a net movement into the area from points east.

### Statistical Analysis

Railway freight traffic in 1963 reflected the higher over-all levels of economic activity in Canada in that year. Tons of revenue goods carried by twenty-three class I and II common carrier lines

totalled 170,339,884 during the twelve months under review, an increase of 8.3 per cent over 1962. Movements of agricultural products were up 16.7 per cent; mine products 8.9 per cent; manufactures and miscellaneous commodities 5.7 per cent; forest products 3.1 per cent; and animal products 1.4 per cent. Less-than-carload (L.C.L.) traffic declined 11.2 per cent.

### Products of Agriculture

Due to increased exports of Canadian wheat and grains, coupled with the wider domestic use of coarse grains for animal feeding, rail movements of these commodities increased considerably over the previous year. Wheat tonnages rose 21.9 per cent to 16,320,339 tons in 1963, accounting for 55.8 per cent of the agricultural total. All other grains combined were up 23.0 per cent to 5,015,524 tons. Among other products in the agriculture group showing notable percentage gains were: apples, up 32.9 per cent; sugar beets 27.5 per cent; and malt 12.9 per cent. Commodities carried in decreased volume included flaxseed, down 19.3 per cent; soybeans 18.3 per cent; and bananas 13.9 per cent.

### Products of Mines

Rail movements of iron ore rose 25.4 per cent to 27,697,185 tons during 1963. This volume represented 39.0 per cent of total mine products and 16.3 per cent of all revenue freight. The 1963 increase in iron ore was almost entirely due to the fact that 1963 figures included twelve-month totals of the Cartier Railway in Quebec, while only the latter five months of that company's operations were contained in the 1962 statistics.

Bituminous coal continued to rank second in tonnage among mine products moved by rail, even though a decline of 211,702 tons or 2.1 per cent was recorded in 1963. Gravel and sand was above the 1962 level at 5,214,392 tons as was stone and rock at 5,427,286 tons. In line with increased Canadian production and sales of sulphur, rail movements of this commodity were up 70.1 per cent to 1,307,932 tons over 1962.

Among other significant decreases in the mines category were rough stone, crude petroleum, copper-nickel ore and concentrates and salt.

### Manufactures and Miscellaneous

The principal contributors to heavier traffic in this field included fertilizers which were up 32.9 per cent to 3,352,129 tons, scrap iron with a 25.6 per cent increase to 1,412,587 tons and road fuel 13.4 per cent to 3,453,265 tons. Potash, which is included in the classification "fertilizer", accounted for most of the increase in that category and was due mainly



to traffic from the mining development at Yarbo, Saskatchewan. Other movements of manufactured goods worthy of note, percentagewise, included sulphuric acid, up 82.7 per cent, rails and track material 44.3 per cent, railway equipment 28.4 per cent and iron and steel bars, rods, etc., 28.2 per cent. Among declines in this commodity group were tonnages of newsprint paper and cement.

### Products of Forests

Lumber, shingles and lath accounted for nearly half the total tonnage of forest products handled by the railways during the year under review. These items aggregated 6,899,506 tons, or 44.0 per cent of the forest product total and 5.6 per cent more than the 1962 volume. Pulpwood, which ranks second in this category, rose only 23,666 tons to 4,842,812 tons, while logs, posts and poles, the third largest item, increased 38,652 tons. Other unspecified forest products rose 89,955 tons to 421,124.

### Products of Animals

Livestock movements in 1963 declined 14.5 per cent to a total of 321,619 tons. Only swine moving in double-deck cars registered an increase over 1962, rising 31.2 per cent to 61,710 tons. Cattle and calves was the largest single livestock category in 1963 amounting to 191,680 tons in contrast to 227,364

tons a year earlier. Among other animal products carried in greater volume were cheese, up 19.5 per cent to 64,967 tons and fresh meats which rose 15.8 per cent to 547,834 tons. The principal volume decreases occurred in swine-single deck; wool; and hides, skins, etc.

### Less-Than-Carload Traffic

L.C.L. shipments during the year under review continued to dwindle due to the vigorous competition from commercial highway operators. The tonnage loss to the railways amounted to 136,498 in 1963 from 1962, a decline of 11.2 per cent.

### Commodity Ratios

The division, by weight, of total rail freight tonnages in 1963 was as follows: products of agriculture 17.2 per cent; animals and products, 0.9 per cent; products of mines, 41.7 per cent; products of forests 9.3 per cent; manufactures and miscellaneous, 30.3 per cent and l.c.l. freight 0.6 per cent. While the above noted percentages are based on data containing United States to United States traffic moving through Canada, Chart I shows a ten-year ratio pattern of commodity movements by rail excluding such intransit freight. Duplications resulting from the interchange of traffic between Canadian carriers is also excluded.

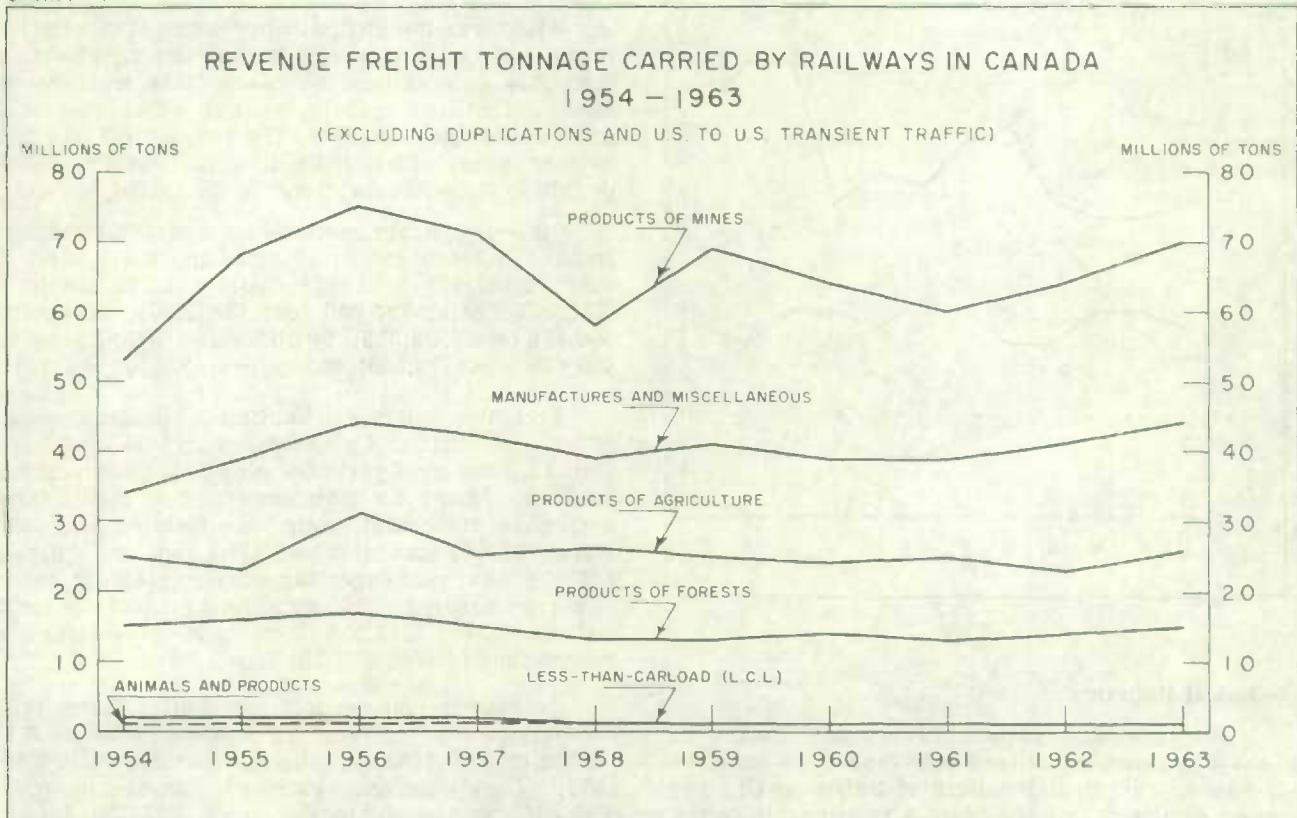
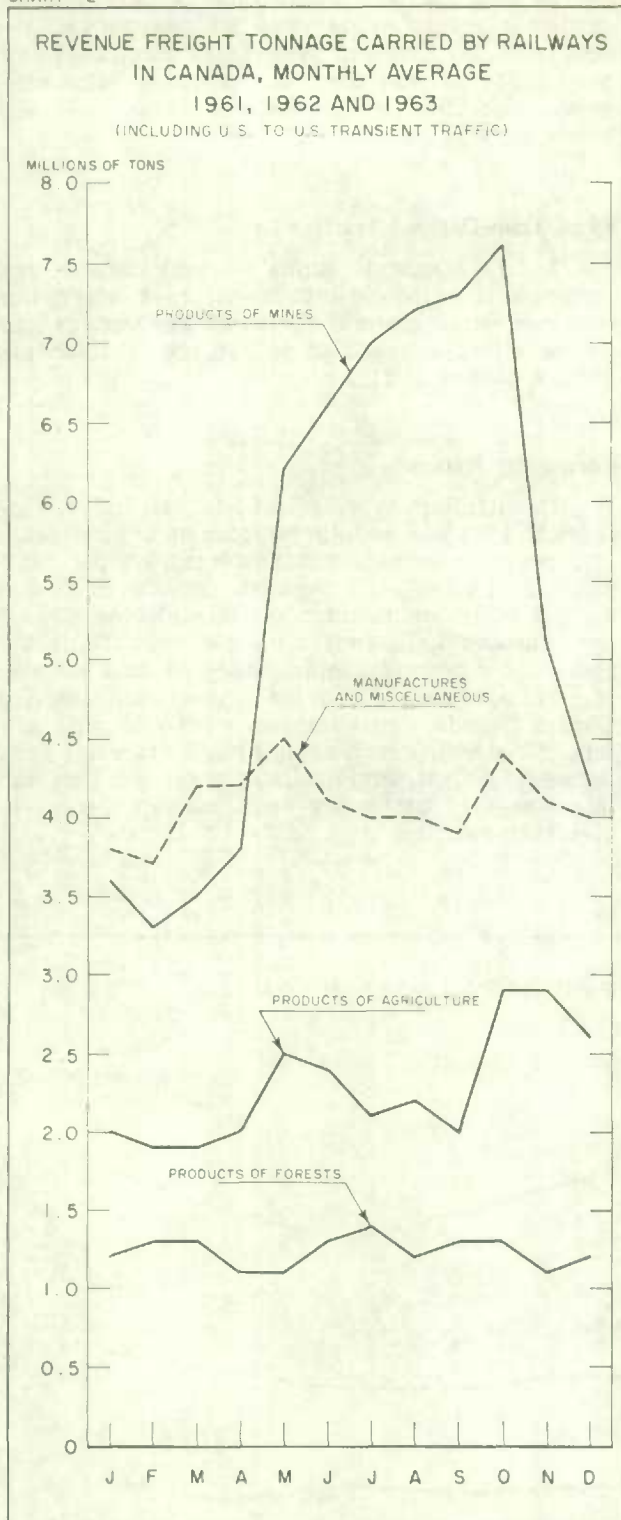

### Seasonal Pattern

The seasonal pattern of revenue freight in Canada is most significant with respect to products of mines. The greater volume of traffic moving between April and October bears a relationship to the St. Lawrence Seaway navigation season. Manufactures and agricultural products fall into fairly similar

patterns but forest products are somewhat inverse. The latter is partially due to climatic conditions which have a tendency to impede logging operations in Eastern Canada in the spring and fall periods.

### Geographic Synopsis

On a provincial basis, rail freight carried in 1963 increased in all areas except Newfoundland. Tonnages originated in the Atlantic region (including loadings from local industry, receipts from U.S. rail and water imports) rose 5.8 per cent over 1962 to 17,435,489 tons. Movements terminated during the same period (including unloadings for domestic consumption and for export by water) were up 1.1 per cent to 16,730,507 tons. The resulting net movement of 704,982 tons to other provinces was a reversal of the 1962 situation when a net movement of 68,925 tons entered the area. Items mainly responsible for the pattern change in 1963 were potatoes, bituminous coal, salt and pulpwood, all of which moved outward in increased volume. Commodities which entered the Maritimes in increased tonnages included wheat and passenger automobiles.

In the Western Division, commodity movements by rail were higher in each of the four provinces, increasing 13.5 per cent on the whole to 51,361,100 tons. Freight terminated in the West was also higher at 37,617,383 tons, up 8.0 per cent. Continuing past trends the net movement of goods (13,743,717 tons in 1963) was outbound from this area for delivery to Central and Eastern Canada or for delivery to United States connections at border points east of Manitoba. The year earlier eastbound net movement amounted to 10,423,187 tons.

Wheat was the predominant feature of rail traffic in the Western Region with a total net movement of 7,908,344 tons shipped eastward. This represented some 264 million bushels, most of which was destined to European markets. The remaining 4,930,392 tons, or approximately 164 million bushels terminated in British Columbia for export to the Orient.

Other significant eastward movements of western produce included: lumber, shingles and lath, 2,263,703 tons (2,169,879 in 1962); barley, 1,270,869 tons (772,783); oats, 791,080 tons (384,157); woodpulp, 590,158 tons (538,895); fertilizers, including potash, 499,666 tons (170,056); and sulphur, 321,691 (132,751).

Freight entering Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia from points east consisted for the most part of a variety of manufactured products. Among the more important of these, from a tonnage standpoint, were manufactured iron and steel, 322,247 tons; iron and steel pipe and fittings 188,703 tons; passenger automobiles, 188,044 tons; newsprint paper, 209,365 tons; food products in cans and packages, 213,358 tons; and miscellaneous manufactured items, 367,201 tons.

Revenue freight receipts from United States rail connections for delivery in Canada totalled 9.4 million tons in 1963, up slightly from 9.3 million in 1962. These imports included, phosphate rock (953,895 tons); anthracite coal (655,750 tons); bituminous coal (602,734 tons); industrial sand (585,405 tons); and vehicle parts (407,521 tons).
